1 ● CITY MALL MADINAT ZAYED

145 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

The Madinat Zayed Shopping Centre is the place to go for international retail shopping, at the heart of the city. The Madinat Zayed Shopping Centre offers a wide array of brands and stores that offer the discerning shopper everything from high-end fashion, perfume, household goods, groceries, electronics and lots more.

2 ● MADINAT ZAYED

145 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Is the largest town and the administrative centre of Al Gharbia, the westernmost and largest region in the Emirate of Abu Dhabi. The township was established in 1968 by Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan.

Madinat Zayed is home to Al Dhafra FC, a team that competes in the UAE top division football league, the UAE Pro League, and Al Dhafra futsal club.

3 ● ADNOC SCHOOL

145 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

The ADNOC Schools, in line with the UAE government's pioneering initiatives, aims to become a premier school in the region, graduating highly competent, socially responsible citizens and future national leaders. The mission of ADNOC Schools are to prepare Emirati and other students, through an academically rigorous curriculum, to achieve their highest potential in a global, technologically advanced society, where Arabic and Islamic values are honoured and cultural differences are respected.

4 ● SIR BANIYAS ISLAND

A nature-based destination alive with wildlife and adventure activities, a 5-star boutique hotel, luxury villas, purpose-built stables and historical sites, Sir Bani Yas Island is one of the eight which make up the Desert Is-

lands in Al Dhafra.

Recently awarded the 'World's Leading Sustainable Tourism Destination' at the 2014 World Travel Awards in Anguila, more than half the island is made up of the Arabian Wildlife Park, one of region's largest wildlife reserves, which is home to more than 10,000 free roaming animals including Arabian Oryx, gazelles and giraffes, hyenas and cheetahs. Guests can take a 4x4 Nature & Wildlife Drive of the park in specially made vehicles accompanied by expert guides.

With three Anantara Hotels Resorts & Spas' retreats on the island, guests can enjoy five-star accommodation at Desert Islands Resort & Spa by Anantara, beach front seclusion at Anantara Al Yamm Villa Resort on the eastern shores, and marvel at the natural beauty of Sir Bani Yas Island at Anantara Al Sahel Villa Resort.

The state-of-the-art stables offers a variety of equestrian activities and lessons, each tailored to meet individual abilities.

Sir Bani Yas Island can also be explored with tours provided by Danat Resort Jebel Dhanna.

The island is also home to UAE's only discovered Christian monastery, which can be visited during a Desert Islands Resort & Spa Culture Tour. Believed to have been built around 600 AD, and abandoned in 750 AD, the monastery was initially discovered during excavations in 1992.

5 ● RUWAIS MALL

Located some 250 kms west of Abu Dhabi city, Ruwais Industrial and Housing Complex is developed by Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) as a major contributor to the national economy and represents a series of multi-million-dollar investments by the company.

The story of Ruwais began in 1970's when plans were laid to transform a remote desert site into a self-contained industrial town geared to fulfilling the downstream requirements of Abu Dhabi's booming oil and gas industry. Centered around Ruwais Refinery, the complex was officially inaugurated in 1982 by Abu Dhabi's visionary ruler the Late H.H. Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan.

From a small fishing headland Ruwais today is one of the most modern industrial complexes in the Middle East, home to around 30,000 people of which some 20,000 reside within ADNOC's Ruwais Housing Complex.

Located adjacent to the Ruwais Housing Complex, Ruwais Mall will be the

only community shopping mall catering to the Western Region. The Mall will house retail stores along with a variety of leisure and entertainment facilities aiming to attract an affluent clientele.

Ruwais Mall will be a treat to the neighbourhood with its variable mix of stores ranging from fashion, footwear, bags & accessories to jewellery, watches, cosmetics, services, casual dining, cafes, cinemas, bowling alleys, family entertainment centre and an ice rink.

The Mall is pitched to enhance the quality of lifestyle of Ruwais's resident community by giving them a destination to shop, mingle, relax and unwind.

6 ● AL MIRFA BEACH



This stunning spot is one of Abu Dhabi's best-kept secrets. Home to the Al Dhafra Watersports Festival, this is the Al Dhafra area's only developed beach. It's almost never crowded and there is a small town nearby where you can buy supplies for a night of camping or snacks and games for a day out enjoying the turquoise waters.

The annual Al Dhafra Watersports Festival, which welcomes visitors to explore this pristine and undiscovered area, brings global watersports champions and local enthusiasts together to take part in adrenaline-fuelling competitions such as kiteboarding, wakeboarding and surf-ski kayaking. Camping facilities are provided for participants and visitors, with live evening entertainment, kids' play areas and a Sunset Souk (market) available.







1 ● AL HUDAYRIAT ISLAND

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

The project was launched and officially inaugurated by Sheikh Nahyan bin Zayed Al Nahyan in May 2018. Among the attractions are a 600-metre beach, running and cycling tracks, water sports facilities, a bouncy castle and a children's playground. Al Hudayriat Island is part of a new city development that will include housing for Emiratis, and commercial attractions.

As the perfect place to exercise, have fun, and meet new people, Hudayriyat Leisure and Entertainment District's modern facilities and outdoor attractions make it the perfect destination for friends and families.

Families and friends can all come together to take on entertaining challenges, relax, and learn new skills. With its friendly and welcoming atmosphere, Hudayriyat Leisure and Entertainment District is a place where great memories are made, and friendships are formed.

A natural haven that a long line of Arabian pearl divers once called home — has quickly become one of the emirate's most thrilling sporting destinations. It boasts a range of high-end sporting facilities that add fitness-themed fun to its picturesque surroundings while promoting a healthy and active lifestyle.

Those looking for the best cycling tracks in Abu Dhabi love to visit Al Hudayriat Island. The bridge features two loops of cycling tracks — one which is 5 km long and the other stretching up to 10 km. Ride your bike and marvel at the scenic sea views along the way. The cycling track is also well-lit at night to accommodate cyclists who prefer a late start. Additionally, the dedicated bike track also allows cyclists to take in the magnificent views of the Etihad Towers, Downtown skyline and the Arabian Gulf.

Most professional cyclists and enthusiasts bring their own bikes. However, visitors can also get in on the action by renting bikes and helmets from Yas Cycles which has a branch on Al Hudayriat Island. Bike rentals start from AED 50 for adults and AED 25 for kids. Visitors who bring personal bikes can also avail of their service packages. Starting from AED 150, the packages include

everything from cleanings to a brake tune-up and tubeless tyre installations. Yas Cycles is open every day from 10:00 am to 06:00 pm.

After traversing the bridge, you can check out the attractions of the Al Hudayriat Beach. One of the newest and most peaceful in the capital city, the free public beach area is somewhat of a hidden gem with lots to do.

As with most public beach spots in the UAE, this one also has its fair share of food outlets for the public. There are more than half a dozen food trucks on Al Hudayriat Island to choose from — serving everything from kid-friendly fast food to breakfast and coffee. You can park and order at the window or just sit down and enjoy your meal while taking in the beautiful vistas. The trucks change on a regular basis, but you can find the usual staples like a coffee, burger joint or ice cream truck.

Al Hudayriat Island has over 600 metres of beachfront which means that you can swim across for hours. The water is generally calm with a view of the islands. Don't want to get your feet wet? Set up a lounge chair and umbrella, walk along the sandy shore, unwind with a book or watch the sunset over the city.

Apart from the popular bicycle trail, the island also features football fields and volleyball courts. Except for bike rentals, the sports facilities are free to use. Those who visit the beach for a dip will have to stay behind the safety line and there are bodyguards to ensure everyone stays safe in the water. Showers and toilet facilities are also available at the beach across the parking lot.

A jet-ski and boat slipway are located underneath the main bridge on the island — with loading and offloading boats and jet-skis being free provided that the owners do it themselves

Al Hudayriat Island has also been the site of various events. Prominent examples include the Abu Dhabi Triathlon Festival which took place in 2019. Additionally, the island has also hosted an open-air cinema. The pop-up drive-in theatre was a two-day event and a part of the Abu Dhabi Moments initiative held last year.

It's unlikely that visitors will be able to explore the whole island since major housing developments are planned in the coming years. However, the beach with all its attractions, often proves to be enough.

2 ● AL BATEEN BEACH

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

This stunning beach overlooks Hudayriat Island and its bridge to the west of Abu Dhabi, and enjoys clear, tranquil water ideal for fishing, swimming and waterfront picnics.

Awarded the prestigious Blue Flag sustainability award by the Emirates Wildlife Authority, the beach covers 800 metres of picturesque waterfront and is perfect to play beach volleyball or indulge in watersports activities including kayaking, paddling and more from the beach's watersports centre.

This spot is popular with both expats and locals thanks to its family-friendly vibe and many watersports offerings. If you're feeling a little adventurous, you can hire jet-skis to get out on the water. There are also a handful of cafés, around 100 car-parking spaces and plenty of lifeguards on duty.

3 ● QASR AL WATTAN

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Qasr Al Watan is a working Presidential palace and a majestic cultural landmark that invites the world to discover the rich legacy of knowledge and tradition that has shaped the UAE's journey. Boosting cultural understanding of the nation and emphasising its incredible history, this is more than just a traditional palace. Qasr Al Watan is an exquisitely crafted tribute to Arabian heritage and artistry, with its architecture and design echoing the significance and function of the impressive exhibits and iconic rooms housed within its halls.

One of the palace's most impressive and unmissable attractions is the family-friendly Palace In Motion event, a spectacular light and sound show that celebrates the UAE's journey in three breath-taking acts that unfold in front of the main palace every 30 minutes after sundown, with the final entry taken 30 minutes before showtime. Timings are subject to change.

4 ● ABU DHABI CORNICHE

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Abu Dhabi's Corniche Road stretches across an impressive eight kilometres of manicured waterfront that includes children's play areas, separate cycle and pedestrian pathways, cafés and restaurants, and the stunning, lifeguarded Corniche Beach. If you're looking to soak up Abu Dhabi's famous year-round sunshine, this immaculate beach is one of the best places to do it.

Some 30,000 to 50,000 visitors flock to the Corniche every month, with the 2km beach being divided into three sections: Al Sahil (Gate 4, free entry) is perfect for singles and larger groups, Gate 2 is ideal for families and has its own quiet zone, with Gate 3 also being great for families and kids. The two latter beaches are shielded from view with a fence. Showers, changing rooms and cabanas are available, and sun loungers and umbrellas can be hired for a fee. A lifeguard is on duty until sunset.

Abu Dhabi's pristine Corniche beachfront has been awarded coveted Blue Flag status, with this internationally renowned eco-label for beaches and marinas guaranteeing clean and safe seawater.

There are more than 1,100 free parking spaces within a five-minute walk of the beach, with entry to the family and singles sections costing AED 10. Entry to the public beach is free.

A fun and healthy way to tour the Corniche is to hire a bicycle.

3 ● ADNOC HQ

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

The ADNOC HQ is hosted in a 75-storey skyscraper on the Abu Dhabi Corniche. The building corporates energy efficiency and sustainable engineering technologies, such as a double skin façade, photovoltaic glazing and LED exterior lighting. Designed by HOK, the overall building complex consists of more than 65 floors with an office tower, Corniche Club, SPC and Crisis Management Center, a heritage museum and other supporting facilities.

3 ● EMIRATES PALACE

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

This lavish property is world-famous thanks to its enchanting Arabesque style, award-winning five-star hospitality and wonderfully unique and authentic local experiences. Located in the heart of Abu Dhabi, Emirates Palace's impressive offerings include a pristine 1.3km private beach, landscaped pools, a private marina overlooking a natural bay, a luxe spa offering indulgent treatments, including a 24-karat gold facial, and some of the world's best restaurants.

One of the capital's most well-known landmarks, the main palace building stretches over a kilometre from wing to wing, with its gardens stretching across 100 hectares.

1 ● STRATA MANUFACTURING

166 KM TO FINISH LINE

Strata Manufacturing – Strata - is a composite aero-structures manufacturing facility based in Al Ain, United Arab Emirates. Established in 2009, with production beginning in 2010, Strata has partnerships with the world's leading aircraft manufacturers, Airbus and Boeing.

2 ● HAZZA BIN ZAYED STADIUM

160 KM TO FINISH LINE

The home of Al Ain FC, this 25,000-seat stadium is one of Al Ain's tallest buildings and a recognizable landmark.

The outer façade design of this stadium is inspired by a palm tree trunk, an integral part of the UAE's heritage and culture. The stadium is part of a wider project, constructed in phases, which will ultimately include residential, commercial, and entertainment areas, as well as a luxury hotel and sports facilities.

3 ● UAE UNIVERSITY

156 KM TO FINISH LINE

United Arab Emirates University is the oldest university in the United Arab Emirates. It was established in 1976. The UAEU is an accredited research-based institution. Its alumni have provided the United Arab Emirates with ministers, diplomats, senior government officials, and business leaders.

4 ● QASR AL MUWAIJI

148 KM TO FINISH LINE

The historic Qasr Al Muwajji – birthplace of His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the UAE – has been restored to its former glory and reopened to the public as a museum and permanent exhibition.

Located in the centre of Al Ain city, Qasr al Muwajji is an impressive structure that has watched over the oasis for more than 100 years. Built in the early 20th century, this simple but striking building was originally used as a diwan (a council or seat of governance) and as a place for the community to congregate.

5 ● AL AIN OASIS**146 KM TO FINISH LINE**

In the heart of the city, the Al Ain Oasis has been opened as the UAE's first curated UNESCO World Heritage site visitor experience. Spread over 1,200 hectares (nearly 3,000 acres) and containing more than 147,000 date palms of up to 100 different varieties, this impressive oasis is filled with palm plantations, many of which are still working farms. The cool, shady walkways transport you from the heat and noise of the city to a tranquil haven; all you will hear is bird-song and the rustle of the palm fronds. The site introduces visitors to the delicate oasis eco-system and the importance it has played in the development of the emirate. The oasis landscape of Al Ain is shaped by a complex shared water supply based on both wells and 'aflaj', the UAE's traditional irrigation system. Al Ain Oasis has plenty of working examples of the falaj which have been used for centuries to tap into underground wells.

6 ● AL AIN PALACE MUSEUM**146 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Located on the western edge of Al Ain Oasis, the Palace of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan was built in 1937. It was converted into a museum in 1998 and opened to the public in 2001. The original structure comprised a private residence for the ruler and his family within a complex of courtyards. The architectural design and construction of Al Ain Palace is typical of historical buildings of the UAE. It features the characteristic ventilation structures that are designed to keep the buildings cool in the summer.

Locally sourced and environmentally friendly building materials were used, including clay, adobe and plaster stones, as well as palm tree elements for roofing rooms, ceilings, doors and windows. The use of teak was later introduced in the renovation of the buildings.

7 ● AL JAHILI FORT**146 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Al Jahili Fort is one of the UAE's most historic buildings. It was erected in 1891 to defend the city and protect precious palm groves. The former headquarters of the Oman Trucial Scouts, the force that protected the mountain passes and kept inter-tribal peace, it also served as a residence for the local governor. It is set in beautifully landscaped gardens, and visitors are encouraged to explore it.

8 ● SOUQ AL QATTARA

137 KM TO FINISH LINE

Dating back to the mid-20th century and founded by the late Sheikh Shakh-but bin Sultan Al Nahyan on the palm-lined road linking Al Ain's Al Qattara and Al Jimi oases, the historic Souq Al Qattara has been renovated and reopened. A traditional handicrafts market takes place here every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from October to May, encouraging local families to preserve and promote Abu Dhabi's heritage through an active involvement in traditional craft production. The Souq is linked to the redeveloped Al Qattara Fort, now home to a popular arts center, featuring hundreds of modern exhibits, workshops, a café and a library.

9 ● SHEIKH KHALIFA BIN ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE

145 KM TO FINISH LINE

The Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Grand mosque, also known as Al Ain Grand Mosque, will be able to accommodate 20,000 worshippers. IT is composed of a basement level and ground floor and will also include a 160-meter-wide dome that will cover the main prayer hall and four 60-metre-tall minarets. The complex will also include other buildings for classrooms and offices, as well as underground parking.

10 ● AL AIN ZOO

25 KM TO FINISH LINE

This 900-hectare park near the base of Jebel Hafeet is where visitors can see a large animal collection in enclosures that closely resemble their natural habitats. There are plenty of green public spaces for picnics and playgrounds, a cafeteria and a train tour of the wildlife area.

The Al Ain Zoo is home to over 4,000 animals, with at least 30% of its 180 species considered endangered. Conservation efforts have been strengthened by partnerships with San Diego Zoo, the Fairchild Tropical Botanical Garden in Miami, and the World Association of Zoos & Aquariums.

The Zoo also includes the Al Ain Safari experience. Magnificently positioned against the imposing backdrop of Jebel Hafeet, Al Ain Safari has been carefully crafted out of the desert environment. At 217 hectares it is one of the world's largest man-made African Safaris and home to a range of native African animals and 2500 plants.

Moreover, the zoo also is home to the Sheikh Zayed Desert Learning Centre, an

important educational facility that combines knowledge and learning through

interactive exhibits, multimedia and visual materials that have been specially designed by world-class experts and specialists.

10 ● GREEN MUBAZZARAH **14 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Strategically located at the feet of the Jebel Hafeet Mountains, Green Mubazzarah is home to a number of spending Chalets that make a great retreat away from the noise of the metropolis providing guests with a deluxe lodging and intimate access to the great outdoors.

Green Mubazzarah occupies part of the rocky mountain side and been landscaped with rolling grassy hillsides alongside streams, hot springs and waterfalls. Green Mubazzarah Chalets is less than a 40 minute-drive from Al Ain International Airport and 15 minute-drive from Wadi Adventure.

12 ● JEBEL HAFEET **0 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Rising 1,240 meters, Jebel Hafeet is the emirate's highest peak, and the UAE's second. This towering rocky mountain, which stands guard over Al Ain and borders Oman, is forged out of craggy limestone that has been weathered over millions of years. Significant fossil discoveries have been made in the area, which are vital pieces in the jigsaw on the city's ancient history. Over 500 ancient burial tombs dating back 5,000 years have been found in the Jebel Hafeet foothills. Once you reach the top, you'll be rewarded with magnificent views over Al Ain.







1 ● AL MARJAN ISLAND**204/0 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Al Marjan Island is a series of four man-made, coral-shaped islands extending 4.5km into the turquoise waters of Ras Al Khaimah, the UAE's northernmost emirate. It was named Al Marjan Island because the complex resembles coral (marjan in Arabic) when seen from above. With various world-class resorts and restaurants located on the island, there is plenty of entertainment and relaxation activities for residents and visitors to enjoy.

2 ● SHEIKH KHALIFA SPECIALTY HOSPITAL**195 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Under the visionary leadership of His Highness Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the United Arab Emirates, Sheikh Khalifa Specialty Hospital (SKSH) was built in the middle of five emirates - Sharjah, Ajman, Umm Al Quwain, Ras Al Khaimah and Fujairah - to cover medical services for these Emirates. 4 ● UMM AL QUWAIN

150 KM TO FINISH LINE

Umm Al Quwain is the second smallest and the least populated emirate in the UAE. It covers an area of approximately 720 sq. km, which is equivalent to 1 per cent of the UAE's area. The city of Umm Al Quwain is built on a narrow peninsula called Khor Al Bidiyah. The emirate has rich coastal mangroves on the coast of Arabian Gulf and many islands that lie to the east of the mainland. Umm Al Quwain provides facilities for numerous recreational activities; from sailing to skydiving. Traditional activities such as dhow building and sports such as falconry and camel racing are also popular in the emirate.

5 ● DREAMLAND AQUA PARK **160 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Located on the scenic coastline of Umm Al Quwain, Dreamland Aqua Park is one of the major tourist attractions and is the largest water park in the UAE. Covering about 250,000 square meters. The park features high-salinity pool, raft rides, wave pool, swimming pool, lazy river, several water slides, spa-like pool with a bar for relaxing.

Inaugurated on 12th June 1997, Dreamland Aqua Park was the vision of His Excellency Sheikh Abdullah Bin Rashid Al Mualla, Deputy ruler of His Highness Sheikh Rashid Bin Ahmed Al Mualla, member of the UAE Supreme Council and ruler of Umm Al Quwain Emirate, to create the first and largest water park in the region with a main concern - Fun is a right for everyone.

6 ● AL SINNIYAH ISLAND **160 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Al Sinniyah Island is the biggest island of several that lie east to the mainland of Umm Al Quwain. It is home to Arabian gazelles, falcons and turtles and features dense mangroves with sandy beaches. The island is especially meant for birdwatchers and nature enthusiasts since it hosts a wide variety of flora and fauna like the rare Socotra cormorants, flamingos and seagulls.

7 ● UAQ NATIONAL MUSEUM **150 KM TO FINISH LINE**

The UAQ National Museum is a renovated ancient fort that was used to guard the entrance to the old town. The museum houses several artifacts found at nearby archaeological sites. Another excavated site, Al-Dur, was a coastal city with nearly 200 BCE until the third century CE. The site also contains several interesting artifacts that are housed in the UAQ National Museum.

8 ● SUWAIDI PEARLS FARM 40 KM TO FINISH LINE

Taking a fascinating trip to the yesteryears, to a time when pearling was once the pillar of the country's economy, is Abdullah Al Suwaidi, who set up the region's first cultured pearl farm in 2005 on the very waters that had produced the finest Arabian pearls coveted by royals, nobles and celebrities in distant lands. The pearl farm is located on a sliver alongside the sea and the mountains that Al Rams nestles. Visitors learn about the history and techniques of pearl farming and try opening an oyster.

9 ● AL HAMRA VILLAGE 15 KM TO FINISHLINE

Upscale Al Hamra Village is a landscaped resort on manmade islands, known for its namesake beach, top-end hotels and chic apartments. Speedboats and yachts moor in Al Hamra Marina & Yacht Club, while architect Peter Harra-dine designed the championship course at Al Hamra Golf Club. Global fashion brands fill Al Hamra Mall, and international restaurants offer fine dining alongside coffee shops with harbor views.

10 ● JULPHAR TOWERS 32 KM TO FINISH LINE

Julphar Towers provides an ultramodern lifestyle of luxury, convenience and much more. They consist of one office tower and one residential tower complemented by extensive facilities. Nature lovers a can enjoy strolls along the beach, a visit to the mangroves or creek, which are just minutes away.

11 ● RAS AL KHAIMAH MANGROVES 35 KM TO FINISH LINE

Mangroves and salt flats form a large part of the coastal and inland landscape of Ras Al Khaimah. The mangroves, which are home to a variety of wildlife, including flamingos, extend right into the city bringing a rich sense of nature into the urban environment. Visitors can explore the mangroves by taking kayak excursions and literally lose themselves in the natural beauty.

12 ● DHAYAH FORT

60 KM TO FINISH LINE

With a backdrop of steep mountains, the bay of Dhayah has always been a very fertile area and has been settled in at least since the third millennium BC. A conical shaped hill at the edge of the palm gardens and at the foot of the mountains, served as a natural defense post for the oasis. People have used this hill since prehistoric times for settlement and fortification alike. Today, it is crowned by a fortress, built during the 19th century on the foundations of much older structures. It is the only hilltop fort still existing in the UAE and offers a fantastic view of the lush palm gardens, sea and dramatic mountain landscape.

13 ● RAS AL KHAIMAH NATIONAL MUSEUM

60 KM TO FINISH LINE

Take yourself and your family on a journey through time... Visit the National Museum of Ras Al Khaimah and come face-to-face with famous and fascinating historical pieces through a unique collection of archaeological and ethnological artefacts. Items of particular interest are a variety of documents, manuscripts and treaties between the rulers of Ras Al Khaimah and Great Britain. There are also exhibits of traditional weapons belonging to the ruling family and archaeological displays about the earliest settlers in the area up to the late Islamic period. retail, dining, entertainment, hospitality, grooming and wellness options. 1 ● FUJAIRAH INTERNATIONAL MARINA CLUB 170 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Fujairah International Marine Club was established in 1999 under the Patronage of His Highness Sheikh Hamad Bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Fujairah, to honour, preserve and maintain their historical relationship with the sea for the present and the future as well as to host and organize some of the world's best maritime sports such as the Class One, The Formula One, Formula 2 and X-Cat World Powerboat Series. In addition to international events, it organizes national and local events such as UAE Jet Ski Championship, rowing races, and fishing competitions.

2 ● FUJAIRAH COAST 170 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Fujairah is the only emirate that is located completely on the eastern coast of the UAE along the Gulf of Oman. Due to its strategic position, it is the UAE's only access to the Indian Ocean. The shores of Fujairah extend along the Gulf of Oman for about 70km, from the city of Fujairah in the south to the town of Dibba in the far north.

3 ● AL AQAH BEACH 170 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Located 45km north of Fujairah City on the Gulf of Oman, Al Aqah Beach is in one of the most unique coastal locations of the UAE, offering impressive views of the Hajar Mountains. It is one of the best beaches in Fujairah and a haven for people who love snorkelling and scuba diving. The beach is also easily accessible from the top resorts in Fujairah.

4 ● FUJAIRAH FORT 170 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Fujairah Fort is one of the important and largest forts of the Emirate. It is characterized by its position on a high hill in the old Fujairah region and is 3 kilometres away from the coast. It is built up to about 20 meters above sea level and oversees the whole city of Fujairah at this height. The design of the Fort differs from the usual engineering designs of the rest of the forts. It has three circular towers while the fourth one is a square for halls. Radiocarbon

analysis estimates that the fort was constructed between 1500 and 1550, according to the Fujairah Tourism and Antiquities Authority. The fort was built using materials available in the area at that time such as rock, gravel and clay stacked together using lime-based plaster.

5 ● BADIYA MOSQUE **170 KM TO FINISH THE LINE**

This curvaceous, squat mud-brick structure is considered the oldest known mosque in the United Arab Emirates. Located in Al Badiyah - a small village in Dibba, northern part of the emirate of Fujairah, it is believed to be built in 1446 AD, along with the two watch towers overlooking the mosque and the village. It is adorned with four pointed domes and rests on a single internal pillar.

6 ● BITHNAH FORT **170 KM TO FINISH THE LINE**

Gracefully overlooking Ham wadi, which runs from Fujairah to Siji wadi across the mountains, stands Al Bithna Fort, near the village of Al Bithnah. This castle is only 13 kilometres from the city of Fujairah and very close to the main road that links Fujairah to the rest of UAE. The construction of this castle goes back to 1735 and it consists of an enormous staunch edifice graced by two watch towers on the west side. Here visitors can enjoy the breath-taking picturesque views of the majestic mountain range and fascinating palm orchards surrounding it.

7 ● HAJAR MOUNTAINS **150 KM TO FINISH THE LINE**

The Hajar Mountains are the highest mountain range in the eastern Arabian Peninsula, bordering Oman and the UAE. The rocky and rugged terrain dominates the Ras Al Khaimah scenery and provides a serious challenge for outdoor and hiking enthusiasts. The Hajar Mountains are of great interest to geologists as they have the world's greatest surface exposure of ophiolites (igneous rock from the oceanic crust).

8 ● JEBEL JAIS ZIPLINE **0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE**

Fly over the awe-inspiring cliffs and canyons of Jebel Jais as you zip from platform to platform. Covering a total distance of 5 KM via a series of 7 ziplines, ranging from 337M to just over 1KM, the Jebel Jais Zipline gives you a panoramic, bird's eye view of the towering Hajar mountains. Averaging speeds of 60 KMPH, you will also find yourself at the UAE's highest sky bridge, 1250m above sea level and walking across the length of 15m bridge.

9 ● PURO RESTAURANT

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

Located at Jebel Jais Viewing Deck Park 1300 meters above sea level, Puro Express is the ideal snack stop to grab light bites taking in the breath-taking views of the majestic Hajar mountains.

10 ● JEBEL JAIS

0 KM TO FINISH THE LINE

The UAE's highest peak, Jebel Jais is part of the spectacular Hajar mountains that were formed over 70 million years ago in the eastern part of Ras Al Khaimah and Oman. Towering at 1,934 m above sea level, Jebel Jais boasts breathtaking vistas, thrilling adventures, and a welcome respite from the heat with temperatures around ten degrees cooler than sea level.







6 ● DUBAI CREEK

Dubai Creek is a saltwater creek, cutting through the heart of Dubai. The seawater Dubai Creek winds its way from the trading port on the Gulf to the Ras al Khor bird sanctuary on the desert edge of Dubai. In the past it was the centre of the fishing and pearling industry, which formed the main sectors of the city's economy. Nowadays the eastern and western banks are connected by one tunnel and four bridges, but the traditional form of transport on the creek, which is still available, were ferry boats.

7 ● AL FAHIDI HISTORICAL DISTRICT

165 KM TO FINISH LINE

The traditional style of life that was prevalent in Dubai from the mid 19th century till the 1970s is reflected at Al-Fahidi Historical Neighbourhood, where buildings with high air towers (Barajeel), built with traditional building materials such as stone, gypsum, teak, sandal wood, fronds and palm wood are aligned side by side, separated by alleys, pathways and public squares, which give the district a natural and beautiful diversity. This district, owing to its strategic location at Dubai Creek (Khor Dubai), played an important role in managing Dubai and organising its commercial relations overseas. Moreover, it is still the district adjacent to His Highness Monarch of Dubai's divan.

The buildings of the district are currently used in incubating a number of varied cultural and artistic activities (both public and private) ranging from art exhibits, specialised museums, cultural and artistic societies, ateliers to cultural centres (such as Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Center for Cultural Understanding). The district also hosts a number of seasonal cultural and artistic events such as Sikka Art Fair, Artists-in-Residence Programme, Heritage Week, National Day Events and religious celebrations. Beautiful and cosy cafés, restaurants and motels overflowing with heritage are scattered all over the district.

8 ● AL SEEF

165 KM TO FINISH LINE

Launched in late 2017, Al Seef celebrates Dubai Creek's beginnings as the famous coastal pearl diving base. Hugging 1.8km of Dubai Creek's stately shoreline, the 2.5 million square foot development has two sections - a heritage area featuring old architecture, and a second space featuring more contemporary structures.

Once a vibrant entryway to the Gulf's most successful pearl diving port, the Creek's legendary presence can still be felt today here, with fisherman and merchants criss-crossing the calm waters in their sleek dhows as part of their daily routine.

The best way to take it all in is to embark on a cultural walking tour of the pedestrian-friendly Al Fahidi Historical Neighbourhood, before wandering over to Al Seef and exploring its charming walkways, fully-operational marina, dining boulevard and events plaza on foot.

9 ● DUBAI FRAME

165 KM TO FINISH LINE

The Dubai Frame is one of the city's most famous attractions for visitors and residents alike. Much like the Burj Khalifa and Burj Al Arab's iconic structures, the building's landmark location in Zabeel Park provides sweeping panoramic

views of the city.

At 150m tall and 93m wide with a bridge connecting the two towers, Dubai Frame has a unique concept to its structure. Resembling a picture frame, Dubai's historic district can be seen to the north while the south provides breathtaking vistas of the city's modern skyline.

With 86km of track and amazing views of the desert, you might catch a glimpse of local wildlife - including the Arabian oryx. The track is popular with both professional and novice riders alike, and is frequented by both individuals and groups of friends.

The track is also utilised by weekly cycling clubs, world-class athletes, and leisure riders visiting Dubai. Some say that the best time to ride is at sunrise, because the views and feeling of the morning breeze are unparalleled - but the sunsets are just as beautiful. Ensure you plan ahead, as this area has few

taxis and much of the track is not illuminated after dark.

The Trek UAE bike shop, located at the end of Al Qudra Road, is a great place to rent your bike. Part of the track has road access for cars, but most of the track is for cyclists. Additionally, the path is equipped with rest stations along the way that offer benches and shade. You'll also find restrooms located adjacent to Trek UAE and where Bab Al Shams Road meets Al Qudra.

In 2020 there were a total of 34 events hosted in Al Marmoom and between September 2020 and August 2021 a total of 35 events. These events consisted of running, Yoga, cycling and obstacle races for the entire community.

29 ● AL MARMOOM DESERT CONSERVATION RESERVE **60 KM TO FINISH LINE**

Spanning 10 per cent of Dubai's total area is the Al Marmoom Reserve project, the largest unfenced nature reserve in the UAE. The reserve is open to the public and is also home to the region's largest renewable energy project, the Mohammed Bin Rashid Solar Park. Known for its admirable sustainability initiatives, Al Marmoom Desert Conservation Reserve is abundant with native wildlife.

It hosts one of the largest populations of Arabian oryx in Dubai and the highest concentration of large flamingos in the UAE. Enjoying over 40 hectares of shrub land and fertile area, the reserve is home to over

204 species of native birds, 158 species of migratory birds, many other endangered species and over 10sq/km of lakes, encompassing the Al Qudra Lakes.

Additionally, a variety of reptile species can also be found across Al Marmoom's different habitats. The 3,000 year old Saruq Al Hadid archaeological site, one of the oldest sites in the country dating back to the Iron Age is also located within the reserve, making it a popular cultural and historical attraction.

Oryx, gazelles, camels and birds - the desert is home to a range of natural inhabitants. Once considered globally extinct, the Arabian oryx has successfully been saved after captive breeding programmes and re-introductions in several areas in the UAE, including Al Marmoom.

Multiple feeding stations are stationed in the area, and while the oryx tend to confine themselves here, they sometimes wander around freely. The nearby Al Qudra lakes, a network of manmade lakes in the desert, are home to 170 types of bird species, including some on the endangered or vulnerable list such as the steppe eagle and the Asian houbara. Birdwatching is a popular activity and guided full or half-day tours are available through the UAE Birding Group (uaebirding.com). Bring binoculars!

It is important to note that wildlife must be respected and should not be disturbed in its natural environment. While you can always venture into the desert on your own, it's advisable to be accompanied by a qualified guide.

30 ● AL MARMOOM LOVE LAKE

60 KM TO FINISH LINE

Immerse yourself in nature when you make your journey to the Al Qudra oasis to take in the sights and sounds of Love Lake Dubai. This popular spot consists two, large, heart-shaped lakes connected to each other.

With plenty of parking, visitors can picnic or set up barbecues in designated areas and take in the serene greenery while keeping an eye out for the wildlife, including many bird species. If you're a fitness enthusiast, there is also a running track on-site, and Love Lake is very close to the Al Qudra Cycling Track. Watch the spectacular sunset from this venue, where everything is dedicated to love - with sculptures of hearts, and even the trees manicured in a way to spell out the word 'love' when seen from above.

31 ● DAMAC HILLS

150 KM TO FINISH LINE

REGULATIONS

ART. 1 - ORGANIZATION

ABU DHABI SPORTS COUNCIL and DUBAI SPORTS COUNCILS call and organize, in cooperation with RCS SPORTS AND EVENTS DMCC (Fortune Executive Tower, JLT, Cluster T - P.O. Box: 24883 - Dubai, United Arab Emirates - T. +971 44058800), website www.theuaetour.com, the UAE TOUR an international cycling stage race on the international UCI WORLDTOUR calendar (UWT), in compliance with the International Cycling Union regulations.

The technical guide of the UAE tour 2021 details each stage, timetables, start and finish sites, distances in kilometres together with the relevant stage routemaps and profiles.

The race director, subject to prior notification to the UCI technical delegate (if present) and to the chief commissaire, can change the timetables and/or itineraries, if need be, giving prior notice to the interested parties.

Furthermore, he might summon the representatives for the “Extreme Weather Protocol” in compliance with article 2.2.029 bis. In such a situation, decisions can be taken and/or confirmed on the morning of the stage (See the “Extreme Weather Protocol”).

ART. 2 - TYPE OF RACE

The race is reserved to Men Elite Category and points will be awarded for the “Individual UCI World Ranking” - stage races, according to the provisions set out in Articles 2.10.002 ter and 2.10.008 of the UCI regulations.

General Classification

To the first 60 Riders on the final General Classification will be awarded the following points : 300, 250, 215, 175, 120, 115, 95, 75, 60, 50, 40, 35, 30, 25, from 15th to 20th 20, from 21st to 30th 12, from 31st to 50th 5, from 51st to 55th 2, from 56th to 60th 1.

Stage Classification

The top three finishers of each stages will be awarded the following points: 40, 15, 6
Wearing the race leader’s jersey: 6 per stage

ART. 3 - ENROLLMENT

According to Article 2.1.005 and 2.1.007 bis of the UCI regulations, the race is reserved to: UCI WorldTeams - UCI Pro Teams - National Team of the host country. In compliance with Article 2.2.003 of the UCI Regulations, the number of Riders per team shall be 7 (seven).

In any case, the Organization, so as to safeguard the image and the reputation of its race, reserves the right to reject, up to the start, the Riders or the Teams which, by their acts or statements, would prove to neglect the principles of sport

fair play and the undertaken commitments as set forth in Article 1.1.023 of the UCI regulations.

Furthermore, in the event the Riders or the Team should fail during the race in complying with the principles set out in the foregoing paragraph, the Organization shall also reserve the right to expel them from the race at any time, in compliance with the Article 2.2.010 bis

ART. 4 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

The subjects listed hereunder are liable for the enforcement of the present regulations and - for all that is not regulated under the present ruling - of the current regulations issued by the International Cycling Union:

- the titular race Riders;
- the Sports Directors and the Teams' Staff;
- all the Race's followers duly accredited by the Organizers in a recognized and acknowledged official position.

Only the persons notified upon getting the identification badge by the owners of the authorized vehicles are entitled to follow the race. Each and every change or addition shall be notified to the Organization Manager. The cars and motorcycles' drivers shall comply not only with the enforced rules of the Highway Code, but also with the provisions issued by the Organization Manager and his staff. Persons without any function acknowledged by the Organizers or relevant to the race's services as well as under-aged persons are not allowed to follow the race.

In the event of non-compliance about "the circulation during the race" will apply to the articles of the Chapter 2, paragraph 4, UCI regulations.

The Organizing Society shall not be accountable for any damage caused by accidents or incidents before, during and after the race to spectators or people in general, even if not involved in the race itself, because of actions that have not been performed by the Organization itself.

For all that is not regulated under the present ruling, the regulations issued by the UCI are enforced.

ART. 5 - RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF RIDERS

All registered Riders have the right, in compliance with the regulations in force, to compete in all the classifications - i.e. stage classification, general and special classifications - inscribed in the race program.

They are required to maintain a responsible race behavior and to refrain from promoting or supporting any mass demonstration susceptible to assume the character of either fraudulent agreements prejudicing other Competitors, or to appear as a protest against the Organizing Society or the Commissaires' Panel or other official

REGULATIONS

followers whatsoever. Moreover, the titular Riders are requested:

A) to carry a frame number and two body numbers duly provided by the Organization. These numbers cannot be modified as far as their size is concerned. During time trial stage only one identification number will be required.

B) to carry on all the stages a transponder supplied by the Organization and to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle, for the automatic reading of their passage position on the finish line and in some other segments determined by the Organization. However, the crossing of the finish line will be the final reference for the stage classification.

Failure in complying with such obligation shall be considered as an infringement equivalent to the absence of body number and consequently punished in accordance with UCI Table 2.12.007/3.5.3

C) to wear the jersey corresponding to their relevant team as well as the World Championship or National Championship jerseys; in order of priority in compliance of the Article 1.3.071.

D) the leaders of the General Classification, the Points Classification, the Best Young Rider Classification, the Intermediate Sprints Classification, shall respectively wear the Red jersey, the Green jersey, the White jersey, the Black jersey, all of them duly provided by the Organizing Society. This order also features the priority between the different leader's distinctive jerseys, so that in the case a Rider should be leading more than one classification, he would wear the distinctive jersey having a priority in the above-mentioned order. The remaining jerseys would be put on, at an honorific title, by the next following Riders in the ranking of the respective classifications, provided that they are not already entitled to a different classification (Article 2.6.018).

The jersey-holder is required to wear his distinctive garment beginning from the signature procedure until to the prize-giving ceremony and during any possible press conference;

E) to refrain from answering to interviews during the race;

F) to quickly leave the left side of the road free for motorcycles and vehicles authorized to overtake the peloton;

G) in case of drop-out in the course of the race, to remit the body number to a Commissaire or to the "Broom wagon".

H) to refrain – after having crossed the finish line – from crossing the line a second time while still wearing his body number, and thus until the finish judge or the finish

I) The General Classification leader and the stage winner shall show up at the press room or the for a press conference with the accredited journalists (Article 2.2.082).

J) to undergo the Anti-Doping procedure, the convened Riders shall go to the premises indicated by the Organizer.

K)) to behave appropriately with a respectable behavior in line with the local tradition and regulations, using all the carefulness necessary. For example riders shall use structures that the organizer will provide like changing rooms and bathrooms in all start and finish areas.

To pay particular attention to the environment while disposing of trash and empty bottles.

ART. 6 - RACE HEADQUARTERS

The official accreditations and preliminary operations will take place in Abu Dhabi on the premises of Yas Marina Circuit U.A.E. from 14:00 to 18:00 on Friday 19th and from 10:00 to 18:00 on Saturday 20th February 2021.

The confirmation of the starting Riders and the collection of the race numbers by the Sports Directors is set at the Race Headquarters on February 20th from 15:00 to 15:45, subsequently at 16:00 at the Race Headquarters is due to take place the Meeting with the Organization Management, the Commissaires Panel, the Sports Directors and with the presence of UCI technical advisor, according to the provisions set out in Articles 1.2.087-88/2.2.093 of the UCI regulations.

At 17:00 - The Race Director with the President of Commissaires'Panel will hold "Race security briefing" for all Drivers, cars and motorcycles, which will be involved in the race convoy, for a Representative of the television production and for a Representative of the Highway Police, see Article 2.2.034 bis of the UCI regulations.

ART. 7 - PRELIMINARY OPERATIONS AT THE START

For each stage Riders shall assemble at the place mentioned in the Technical Guide. As far as road race stages are concerned, the presence of the Riders at the Podium where the starting sheet is to be signed is duly requested (Article 2.3.009). Then, Riders will gather for the group transfert towards the actual start place.

In addition, for all stages, the Organizer will set the team order for team presentation and to sign the starting sheet. This order list will be communicated the day before with the official communication.

REGULATIONS

ART. 8 - TOP-RIDERS PHOTOSHOOTING AND TEAM PRESENTATION

On Saturday 20th February will take place the Top-riders photoshooting and their press conference, Organization will communicate the list of riders needed a week before. Teams will make available the top riders requested with the support of team press officer.

All the Teams, with all their Riders and two Team Managers and/or Sports Directors shall take part in the opening and teams presentation ceremony Saturday 20th February 2021, in case it will be organized.

ART. 9 - RADIO INFORMATION

Race news will be broadcasted on the frequency VHF 149.850. Organizers will provide the radio for every car in the race and to all vehicles or person shall need it.

ART. 10 - TIMEKEEPING

The Timekeepers Service, with the assistance of the finish judge, will be in charge of recording the official time. The service will be guarantee by NETCO Sports Italy srl. Riders will be provided with a trasponder, for the automatic reading of their time, to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle compulsarily.

ART. 11 - TIME BONUSES

Time Bonus valid for the General Individual Classification are envisaged in each stage except the time trial stage. According to the Article 2.6.019 UCI regulations, the time bonuses will be as follows:

- for each Intermediate sprint the time bonuses for the first three riders crossing the line will be respectively 3", 2" and 1"
- upon finishing each stage respectively 10", 6" and 4" time bonuses will be assigned to the first three riders crossing the line.

ART. 12 - GREEN ZONE

The Green zones will be mentioned on the route maps and in the time schedules as well as signposted along the race route. Organization is committed to collect all the waste referred to the race and invites all the suiveurs to behave in way respectful of environment safeguard.

ART. 13 - TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The technical assistance service is provided for by 3 vehicles of the SHIMANO company.

ART. 14 – MEDICAL SERVICE

The Medical Service appointed by the Race Manager, is provided by an adequate number of Doctors and Paramedics; the service is operative during the race and available before the start and after the finish of the race. In case of need, following ambulances coordinated by the race Doctors will take the Riders to the hospitals mentioned in the Technical Guide.

ART. 15 – STAGE FINISHES

Stage finishes shall be announced in advance by a red triangle located one kilometer from the finish line and by an arch reading “FINISH” in coincidence with the time keeping and photo finish line.

It is mandatory for all vehicles to perform a detour from the race route where indicated by the Organizer, in order not to cross the finish line, exception for of the Race Direction, the Commissaires’ Panel and the official Doctor

In the case of a crash, puncture or mechanical incident beyond the signpost indicating the finish within three kilometres, the rider(s) affected shall be credited with the time of the group in whose company he was (they were) when the accident occurred, in compliance with Article 2.6.027 of the UCI Regulations.

The rule does not apply to stages featuring a summit finish (3rd and 5th) and for Time trial stage (2nd). For all that is not regulated under this ruling, the irrevocable decision taken by the Commissaires’ Panel in consultation with the Organization Management shall apply.

The “Protocol for stages expected to finish in bunch sprints” will be enforced in stages 1, 4, 6 and 7 for calculating time gaps.

ART. 16 – TIME TRIAL STAGE

The Riders shall use bicycles complying with the parameters and measures set up by the UCI Regulations.

On the start line, the Riders will be held by personell appointed by the Race Direction. Each Rider will be escorted by one motorbike, in front, and by one car. The car shall follow at least 10 meters behind the Riders and shall never draw up level with him. (Art. 2.4.023/024/025)

The Riders will start in reverse order of the general individual classification by time of the previous stage, the Race Director, by common consent with the Chief Commissaire, is empowered to adopt changes on the start list.

Riders shall set off at identical intervals of 1’ to 3’, the Race Director, by common consent with the Chief Commissaire, is empowered to adopt different intervals as far as the last 15 Riders to set off are concerned.

REGULATIONS

ART. 17 - FINISHING TIME LIMIT

In order to determine the finishing time limit, the stages have been divided into two categories depending on the different nature of their route:

- **A category:** stages presenting no particular difficulty (Stage 1, 4, 6 and 7)
- **B category:** stages presenting difficulty (Stage 3 and 5)
- **C category:** Time Trial (stage 2)

Consequently, the time limit has been set out as follows:

- for the A category the winner's time plus:
 - 8% if the average speed is less than or equal to 40 Km/h.
 - 9% if the average speed is between 40 and 45 Km/h
 - 11% if the average speed is over 45 Km/h
- for the B category the winner's time plus:
 - 15% if the average speed is less than or equal to 37 km/h
 - 16% if the average speed is between 37 and 41 km/h
 - 17% if the average speed is over 41 km/h
- for the C the winner's time plus 30%

According to Article 2.6.032 of the UCI regulations, in case of exceptional circumstances, confirmed accidents or incidents, the Commissaires Panel, after consultation with the Organization Manager, may readmit in the race any Rider finishing in a time exceeding the time limit, by increasing the latter by a maximum of 30% of the time set out in this article. The time limit, established on the basis of the winner's time expressed in minute seconds, shall be further rounded off to the successive superior minute.

In case, for those Riders readmitted, all points awarded in the general classification of the various secondary classifications shall be withdrawn.

ART. 18 - PENALTIES

Infringements will be sanctioned according to UCI Rules and to the "Table of race incidents" (2.12.007).

ART. 19 – PRIZE-GIVING PROTOCOL

After every stage finish, the stage winner, the leader of the General Classification who receives the red jersey, the leader of the General Classification by Points who receives the green jersey, the leader of the Best Young Rider Classification who receives the white jersey and the leader of the Intermediate Sprints Classification who receives the black jersey shall attend the prize-giving ceremony. Moreover, the stage winner and the leader of the General Classification shall participate in the press conference for the accredited journalists. (Articles 1.2.112/113 and 2.6.018 bis)

ART. 20 – ANTI-DOPING

Antidoping Control will be made on the dedicated premises by the finish area. The Doping Control Officer (DCO) charged by the ITA and acting on behalf of UCI will enforce the UCI Regulations, in compliance with the ITA's instructions and procedures, in accordance with Chapter 14 of the UCI ADR-TIR (Testing Investigation Rules) and with the relevant Law in force of the hosting country.

ART. 21 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY TIME

The Leader of the General Individual Classification will wear the Red jersey. In compliance with the provisions set out in Article 2.6.014 of the UCI regulations, the General Individual Classification is established by adding together the times achieved by each rider in each stage. Time bonuses and penalties are considered for this classification.

In the event of a tie in the General Individual Classification the first discriminating criteria is given by the hundreds recorded in the individual time trial stage, the second is given by the lower sum of the placing obtained in each stage, as a last resort, the place obtained in the final stage is counted (Article 2.6.015).

REGULATIONS

ART. 22 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY POINTS

The sum of the points will determine an individual ranking and every day its Leader will wear the Green jersey. The individual points ranking is obtained by adding together the points recorded in each of the seven stages and the sum of the points assigned in all the Intermediate Sprints.

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.6.017 of the UCI regulations, in the event of a tie in the General Classification by Points the following criteria will be applied:

- 1.** Number of stage victories
- 2.** Number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- 3.** General Individual Classification

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 23 - BEST YOUNG RIDER

The Best Young Classification is reserved to Riders born after 1st January 1996 and is determined by the General individual Classification. The Leader will wear the White jersey

ART. 24 - "INTERMEDIATE SPRINT JERSEY" CLASSIFICATION

A special Intermediate Sprint Classification has been set up, at each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

1 st	8 points
2 nd	5 points
3 rd	3 points
4 th	1 point

The general ranking is established by the sum of the points obtained; the Leader of the Intermediate Sprint Classification shall wear the Black jersey.

In the event of a tie in the Intermediate Sprint general classification, the following discriminating criteria will be applied:

- number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- general individual classification

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

REGULATIONS

ART. 25 – TEAM CLASSIFICATION

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.06.016 of the UCI regulations, the team classification is established on the basis of the sum of the three best individual times from each team, including any time penalties. In the event of a tie the teams shall be separated by the sum of the places acquired by their three best times in the stage. If the teams are still tied, they shall be separated by the placing of their best rider on the stage classification. The team general classification shall be calculated on the basis of the three best individual times from each team in each stage ridden. In the event of a tie the following criteria shall be applied in order until the teams are separated:

- number of first places in the daily team classifications;
- number of second places in the daily team classifications;
- etc.

If there is still a draw, the teams shall be separated by the placing of their best rider in the general individual classification. Any team reduced to fewer than three riders shall be eliminated from the general team classification.

ART. 26 – RACE MANAGEMENT

The UAE Tour race will be managed in compliance with the UCI regulations through the UCI Commissaires appointed according to the art. 1.1.070 and in collaboration with the RCS Sports technical race management coordinated by the race director Mauro Vegni (tel. +390225848766).




