



FOLLOWERS, TAKE CARE!

All the drivers of cars and motorcyclists in the race convoy must be members of a national federation recognized by the UCI.

Mandatory race radio: 170,1750 MHz

Press Vehicles: Vehicles are not authorized to overtake the competitors on the cobblestones, or to be positioned in between the different groups of cyclists.

From Hornaing (km 60) onwards, these vehicles must:

- be in front of the race without allowing the escort motorcyclists who are situated ahead of the front of the race to catch up with them.
- or they must follow the race behind the vehicles of the "Race Commissaire" and the "Team Managers" in order to avoid any incident

which would be likely to interfere with the course of the race in the cobblestones sectors. Nevertheless, in the event where atmospheric and road conditions prevented vehicles belonging to the press to take some of the cobblestones sectors, the race's management would oblige these vehicles to follow the diversions of which the itineraries are signposted with arrows (red arrows with marked with the word Diversion). Photographers' motorbikes: The motorbikes must follow the instructions of the race's management and work on foot in all of the cobblestones sectors. Organisation of a photographers' pool in all the areas. According to how the race develops, the race's management may authorise photographers to work on motorbike, especially in the final stretch of the competition.

DENAIN

Located 2 hours from Paris, 1 and a half hours from Brussels and 45 minutes from Lille, Denain is a land of contrasts. This green and blue town, packed with trees and crossed by the Scheldt Canal, is at the junction of a road and river network that puts it in a prime location in the heart of the Hauts-de-France region. The ongoing revitalisation of the Pierre Blanches area unlocks the full potential of Denain as a trimodal hub.

The former capital of coal and steel still boasts a rich architectural and historical heritage from its mining and industrial heyday, including a couple of UNESCO World Heritage sites. Its majestic Italian-style theatre is a 1/5 replica of the Opéra Garnier, while its festival hall stands as a symbol of the town's prosperity and growth at the turn of the 20th century.

However, Denain's greatest asset are its human values. Its sharp values were forged in the fires of industry: first, an appreciation of effort through work, then, solidarity in everyday life, and finally, respect for people of all origins and social status.

Numerous athletes have embodied this state of mind: The legendary Jean Degros, Hervé Dubuisson and Valéry Demory from the Denain Voltaire basketball club, which now plays in the Pro B league; Fabien Gilot, a gold winner in the 4 × 100 metre freestyle relay at the 2012 Olympic Games; the ladies of the Tennis Club de Denain, who secured the French team championship in 2012 and 2014; and many others who continue to make Denain a hotspot of competitors!

The town boasts modern and attractive sports facilities such as the NaturéO water park, the Yannick Noah tennis center and the Bayard stadium. It received the "Ville active et sportive" label in 2022 and has also been named a "Terre de Jeux 2024", highlighting its ambition to be part of the adventure of the Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games. Yet Denain is and has always been a land of cycling. The Grand Prix de Denain, a UCI ProSeries race first run in 1959, is an unmissable annual event that draws the best pro riders.

Denain has also hosted the start of Paris–Roubaix Femmes since 2021. Starting from the Town Hall forecourt, the world's top female cyclists will do three laps around the city before taking the same route as their male counterparts.







Diversion for sector no. 17 (Hornaing)

In Hornaing (km 62.2), continue on D81 towards Wandignies-Hamage and merge back onto the course at km 67.




Diversion for sector no. 13 (Orchies)

At the exit from Orchies (km 84.6), continue on D938, drive over A23 and turn right onto D549. Merge back onto the course at km 89.4 (Auchy-lez-Orchies).



Diversion for sectors no. 11 and 10 (Mons-en-Pévèle)

Right before cobbled sector no. 11 (km 96.8), continue straight ahead on D917 until Pont-à-Marcq. Merge back onto the course at km 104.8 (Pont-à-Marcq).




Diversion for sectors no. 7, 6, 5 and 4 (Cysoing)

In Cysoing (km 118), go straight ahead at the traffic light and follow D90. Merge back onto the course at km 130.4 (exit from Carrefour de l'Arbre).

FINISH AND LAST KILOMETRES

Finish: on the velodrome André Pétrieux where the riders will complete the distance from the entrance of the velodrome to the finish line (300 metres), and then go round the whole velodrome once (500 metres), i.e. 800 metres in total

ROUBAIX

Who will succeed Lizzie Deignan and Elisa Longo Borghini in 2023 as the winner of Paris–Roubaix Femmes avec Zwift? Once again, the world cycling elite will shine on the cobblestones of the Nord department, making the crowds go wild and adding a new page to the legend of cycling. Welcome to the city that transformed its thousand chimneys and old industrial bastions into fertile ground for creativity, experimentation and innovation.


Roubaix, a land of cycling... and soft mobility

The long-running connection between Roubaix and cycling is epitomised by the Paris–Roubaix classic. The city is home to the Parc des Sports, a cycling venue like no other in Europe. Its main site is the historic André Pétrieux Velodrome, where the legends of cycling proudly hold the fabled cobblestone trophy of Paris–Roubaix aloft. There is also the Jean Stablinski regional indoor velodrome, which hosted the 2021 UCI Track Cycling World Championships and the 2023 French Track Championships. Last but not least, the BMX circuit is where the annual BMX Open takes place. The Vélo Club de Roubaix and its Continental team, which flies the flag for pro cycling, are also part and parcel of city life.

The city has also been adding more bicycle lanes and paths regularly and they now span the entire municipality. It also boasts a public bicycle sharing system completed by City Hall in 2021, with 500 bicycles and e-scooters available from over 150 stations in the city. Finally, Roubaix is heavily sport-oriented and proud of its "Terre d'Excellence Cycliste" and "Terre de Jeux 2024" labels, as well as its 3-laurel wreath "Ville active et sportive" rating and its 2-bicycle "Tour de France Cycle City" rating.

City of art and history

The history and heritage of Roubaix are worth exploring and sharing. The award of the «City of art and history» label in 2001 spurred on new efforts to write and rewrite history. In Roubaix, heritage is so much more than just old stones. It also impregnates the everyday life of Roubaisiens. Roubaix delivers on its promise with La Piscine Museum, which welcomes 250,000 visitors a year, as well as reimagined spaces such as La Condition Publique, a real laboratory for culture and social, urban and environmental innovation. There are, of course, other must-see places such as La Manufacture (a textile history museum), the churches of Saint Joseph and Saint Martin, the Motte-Bossut factory, the City Hall and Parc Barbieux, the largest urban park to the north of Paris.

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

■ ARTICLE 1. Organisation

The PARIS-ROUBAIX FEMMES avec ZWIFT, 3rd edition is organised by Amaury Sport Organisation (A.S.O) under the aegis of Club TDF Sport and in accordance with the regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and the French Cycling Federation (FFC). It shall be held on Saturday, 8th April 2023. The Women's Paris-Roubaix is part of the UCI Women's WorldTour calendar.

■ ARTICLE 2. Participation

As per article 2.1.005 of the UCI Regulations, PARIS-ROUBAIX FEMMES avec ZWIFT is open to UCI Women's WorldTeams, UCI Women's Continental Teams and the national team of the country of the organiser by agreement with the UCI.

Only riders in the Elite category may take part in the race.

Each team shall field a minimum of 4 riders and a maximum of 6 at the start of the race.

■ ARTICLE 3. Classifications

The race counts towards the Elite Women's ranking and awards points in accordance with articles 2.10.009 through 2.10.017 of the UCI Regulations. It also counts towards the UCI Women's WorldTour ranking and awards points to the first 40 riders in accordance with article 2.10.033 of the UCI Regulations. On the basis of the final classification of each UCI Women's WorldTour event, best young rider points are awarded to the first 3 riders Under 23 according to the following scale: 6, 4 and 2 points (article 2.10.034).

■ ARTICLE 4. Race headquarters

The race headquarters will be open Friday, 7th April from 2:30 pm to 6 pm at: Salle des Fêtes de Denain - Place Pierre Baudin - 59220 Denain

Licences shall be checked and race numbers and frame plates shall be issued to the duly licensed team representatives from 2:30 to 4:45 pm

The team managers' meeting shall be held at the race headquarters at 5 pm with the members of the Commissaires' Panel in attendance.

■ ARTICLE 5. Radio-tour

Race information shall be broadcast on frequency 170.1750 MHz

■ ARTICLE 6. Neutral technical support

Neutral technical support shall be provided by Shimano with 4 cars and 4 motorbikes.

■ ARTICLE 7. Time limits

Riders whose finishing time is more than 8% greater than the winner's time shall be excluded from the classification. The Commissaires' Panel may extend the time limit in the event of exceptional circumstances after consultation with the organiser.

■ ARTICLE 8. Classification

The general individual time classification shall be established based on the order of arrival at the finish line.

■ ARTICLE 9. Prize money

■ ARTICLE 10. Prix NTT

The NTT award is given to the competitor who gives the most effort and the best sportsmanship. A jury chaired by the event director establishes a list of riders according to the of the race. From this list, Twitter users vote during the stage for the most combative competitor on www.twitter.com/paris_roubaix. The prize awarded to the 1st competitor in this ranking is: €500.

■ ARTICLE 11. Fight against doping – doping tests

A.S.O. and each of the participating teams shall deem it an absolute necessity to ensure strict compliance with the rules and recommendations laid down by the relevant authorities with regard to combating doping, and to maintain an absolutely irreproachable line of conduct in this regard. Participating teams shall undertake to apply said rules and recommendations, and they shall be wholly responsible for the strict adherence to these rules and recommendations by their riders and, more generally, by their staff and service providers.

Anti-doping tests shall be carried out under the authority of the UCI and designated officials, at the race finish.

■ ARTICLE 12. Protocol

The following riders must present themselves at the protocol ceremony:

- the first three riders in the race;
 - the first in the NTT price ranking;
 - the leader of the individual ranking of the UCI Women's WorldTour; and
 - the leader of the youth ranking of the UCI Women's WorldTour.
- After the award ceremony, the winner of the race, the leader of the individual ranking of the UCI Women's WorldTour and the leader of the youth ranking shall be required to head to the press room.

■ ARTICLE 13. Penalties

The UCI Scale of Penalties shall apply.

■ ARTICLE 14. Environment

A.S.O. sets up waste collection areas. Riders must only dispose of their waste, water bottles or any other object in these specially equipped areas as stipulated in article 2.3.025.

Riders and support staff must behave in an environmentally responsible way at all times and respect the legal provisions in force.

■ ARTICLE 15. Challenge – exclusion

15.1. A.S.O. attaches great importance to safeguarding its image and reputation and those of the race. A.S.O. reserves the right to refuse participation in - or exclude from - the event, to any team or one of its members whose presence could tarnish the image and/or reputation of A.S.O. and/or the race.

15.2. Furthermore, A.S.O. may disqualify or exclude any team or one of its members from the race in the following cases:

- violation of the rules of the event, including those concerning the race's internal discipline;
- serious breach of French law;
- customs fraud; and;
- Breach of the health measures taken to combat the spread of the SarsCoV-2 virus (COVID-19).

15.3. The right of disqualification or exclusion referred to in sections 15.1 and 15.2 above shall be exercised under the following conditions:

a) A.S.O. shall advise the team of its decision in writing, by registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt or by letter delivered personally with receipt, either by fax or by e-mail. This letter shall:

- state whether the disqualification or exclusion is related to the presence of the entire team or the presence of certain member(s) specified by name;
- specify that, if the disqualification or exclusion is linked to the presence of certain member(s) specified by name, the team must, in its capacity as employer, withdraw the member(s) from its personnel for the race or, alternatively, waive any right to participation of the entire team in the race;
- state the grounds on which it is based; and
- mention that, to challenge this decision, the team shall have a period of twenty-four (24) hours from receipt of the letter of disqualification or exclusion to file an action with the Court

of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, failing which the team shall be deemed to have accepted the disqualification or exclusion for good.

b) If the team has filed an action with it, CAS will immediately appoint a single arbitrator under the expedited procedure under the Rules of Procedure of the CAS. After calling each party to evaluate its case, the arbitrator shall decide within the time limits required by urgency of the situation, whether to disqualify or exclude the entire team or certain member(s). The language of arbitration shall be French. The arbitrator shall decide the dispute in accordance with French law. The arbitrator's ruling may not be appealed.

■ ARTICLE 16. Image rights

To enable the widespread promotion of the Paris-Roubaix Femmes avec Swift, each team, and therefore each rider within the teams, acknowledges that participation in the competition grants the organiser and its successors in title or beneficiaries cause to reproduce and display, without any compensation whatsoever, their name, voice, picture, biography and, more generally, their sports performance in the Women's Paris-Roubaix as well as the brand(s) of their equipment and sponsors, in any form on any material existing or in future devised, in any format, for any communication to the public domain, for any purpose including promotional and/or commercial use without any limitations except those specified below, and this for the duration of the protection currently given to any territory by the laws or regulations, judicial decisions and/or arbitration of any country, or existing or future international conventions, including any extensions that may be made to said duration. However, the organisers, when allowing third parties to use pictures of the event for advertising or promotional purposes, shall not allow others to use the name, voice, image, biography or performance sports of a rider or team, nor the brand of their sponsors or equipment for a direct or indirect association between the rider, the brand of its sponsors or equipment and the product, service mark or trade name of said third party without the express consent of the rider, sponsor or supplier in question.

Similarly, with the exception of books, photo books, comics, any form of publishing, video cassettes, CD-ROMs, DVDs or more generally any video recordings or video on any medium and format that may become the subject, is in whole or part of the Women's Paris-Roubaix, posters, log books, autograph books, maps, official programmes for the Women's Paris-Roubaix, the organiser will not carry and will not allow the exploitation of the individual image of a rider in the marketing of derivative products known as merchandise.

■ ARTICLE 17. Sports betting

In order to avoid any risk of a conflict of interest, the teams and all their members (riders, management, trainers, doctors, etc.) shall refrain from taking part in sports betting ventures concerning the Women's Paris-Roubaix, either directly or through an intermediary.


■ ARTICLE 18.


