(Dubai stage)

Port Rashid

Mina Rashid, also referred to as Port Rashid, is a man-made cruise terminal in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. It was Dubai's first commercial port; in 2018 cargo operations moved to Jebel Ali Port. It currently serves as a seafront coastal destination, tourist cruise destination, and residential area.

Queen Elizabeth II Hotel

A one-of-a-kind entertainment, hospitality and tourist destination, and home to the first and only floating hotel in Dubai. Experience true British heritage and history with a visit to one of the world's most celebrated ocean liners, now permanently docked in the new marina at Dubai's Port Rashid in the UAE, within easy reach of Dubai International Airport and all local attractions.

Deira Islands

A spectacular mixed-use, waterfront development, Deira Islands comprises four man-made islands situated adjacent to Dubai's Deira district. The remarkable project covers a total area of 15.3 square kilometres and adds an additional 40 kilometres, including 21 kilometres of beachfront, to Dubai's coastline. Easily accessible from the mainland via road or boat, Deira Islands is also close to Dubai International Airport.

Infinity Bridge

Infinity Bridge is a key component of Al Shindagha Corridor Project,

which was announced in 2018. The entire project is divided into 11 segments, where the construction began in 2016 and is expected to be completed by 2027.

Al Shindagha

Set along the historic waters of Dubai Creek, Al Shindagha Museum tells the proud story of the nation's past and reverent traditions. The museum's 'Dubai Creek: Birth of a City' is a state-of-the-art multimedia experience that guides visitors through the area's dramatic development over centuries.

Al Seef

Launched in late 2017, Al Seef celebrates Dubai Creek's beginnings as the famous coastal pearl diving base. Hugging 1.8km of Dubai Creek's stately shoreline, the 2.5 million square foot development has two sections – a heritage area featuring old architecture, and a second space featuring more contemporary structures.

Al Fahidi Historical District

The traditional style of life that was prevalent in Dubai from the mid 19th century till the 1970s is reflected at Al-Fahidi Historical Neighbourhood, where buildings with high air towers (Barajeel), built with traditional building materials such as stone, gypsum, teak, sandal wood, fronds and palm wood are aligned side by side, separated by alleys, pathways and public squares, which give the district a natural and beautiful diversity. This district, owing to its strategic location at Dubai Creek (Khor Dubai), played an important role in managing Dubai and organising its commercial relations overseas.

Dubai Museum

This museum uses life-size dioramas to depict everyday Dubai life in the days before the discovery of oil. Galleries recreate scenes from the Creek, traditional Arab houses, mosques, the souk, date farms and desert and marine life.

Dubai Creek Harbour

Dubai Creek Harbour brings a new commercial hub to the city, offering retail, cultural and residential spaces. Located 10 minutes from Downtown Dubai, this iconic waterfront will redefine the future of living in the city.

Mohammed Bin Rashid Library

A distinguished project to serve the educational, societal, and tourism movements and is considered as one of the specialized projects that's related with the latest technologies, and it's considered as a significant mark on Dubai Tourism map. It is also a forum for a mixture of cultures through cultural services that will be provided by live library presentations, documentaries, lectures, from all over the world. includes a large electronic library database.

Burj Khalifa

828m into the sky, the Burj Khalifa is the tallest building in the world and one of the greatest engineering feats of all time. Completed in 2010, the mighty tower represents the beating heart of Dubai and its brave ambitions.

Coca-Cola Arena

Coca-Cola Arena is a multi-purpose arena located in the City Walk area in Dubai in the United Arab Emirates. The venue was opened on June 6, 2019. It has a capacity of 17,000. Owned by Meraas and operated by ASM Global, the arena hosts events that include concerts, sport, family entertainment and ceremonies.

Safa Park

Safa Park is a 64 hectares urban park located in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. It is 10.53 km southwest of the traditional center of Dubai along Sheikh Zayed Road. The park is bordered by Sheikh Zayed Road, Al Wasl Road, Al Hadiqa Street, and 55th Street.

Kite Beach

Kite Beach is one of Dubai's most popular beaches – perfect for sun-seekers, foodies and sports enthusiasts alike. If you're serious about your watersports and want to test your skills on one of the best free beaches in Dubai, Kite Beach has plenty of challenges.

Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club

Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club first opened in Dubai, UAE, in 1993, comprising an 18-hole par 71 championship golf course with a distinctively sail-shaped clubhouse. It was home to the first golf academy in the Middle East.

Dubai Creek

Dubai Creek is a saltwater creek, cutting through the heart of Dubai. The seawater Dubai Creek winds its way from the trading port on the Gulf to the Ras al Khor bird sanctuary on the desert edge of Dubai. In the past it was the centre of the fishing and pearling industry, which formed the main sectors of the city's economy. Nowadays the eastern and western banks are connected by one tunnel and four bridges, but the traditional form of transport on the creek, which is still available, were ferry boats.

Mushrif Park

Barbecue, bird-watch and take a stroll through nature with your family at Mushrif National Park. There are plenty of barbecue areas, picnic spots and restaurants on site, and if you're looking to get some exercise, there are sports facilities like a pool, bicycle track and football field. Mushrif Park is also home to tree-top adventure course Aventura, where the active and adventurous can swing from the trees and zip-line across 80 exciting challenges.

Dubai Festival City

Dubai Festival City is one of the most famous tourist attractions that everyone should visit. From a fantastic range of retail brands and department stores, catering to a shopper's delight, to a variety of cuisines

for all food enthusiasts. If you're staying overnight in Dubai Festival City, be spoilt for choice with 4 world class hotels that provide excellent service and comfort for short-term and long-term stays.

Dubai Safari Park

Dubai Safari Park is home around 3,000 animals, with 78 species of mammals – including 10 different carnivores and 17 primates – 50 types of reptiles, 111 kinds of birds plus amphibians and invertebrates, all living on the 119-hectare site.

Ras Al Khor Wildlife Sanctuary

In the wetlands, just metres away from the bustling city of Dubai, you'll find the Ras Al Khor Wildlife Sanctuary. Offering a natural habitat Ras Al Khor Wildlife Sanctuary ensures that the migratory birds which flock to this reserve during the winter season, have a healthy environment and access to natural resources. While the sanctuary is most known for the flamingos, you can even spot reef herons, black-winged stilts, osprey, sandpipers, egrets, kingfisher, black-tailed godwit, Eurasian spoonbill, the sand racer and horned vipers among other species.

Meydan Racecourse

Dubai Racing Club's Meydan Racecourse is home to one of the world's richest horse races – the annual Dubai World Cup. With a purse of US\$35m, the Dubai World Cup is the highlight of the city's horse-racing scene, drawing thousands of visitors in March each year. Capped by a spectacular concert featuring top international performers, the event is a must-see on the city's social calendar.

Mohammed Bin Rashid City

Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum City will be a city within Dubai. Just four minutes away from Downtown Dubai, MBR City is slated to be a mixed-use development featuring a natural expanse of greenery while still providing access to the city's major routes. Ideal for families, MBR City's residential concept, District One, will offer plenty of space and suburban tranquillity with hundreds of villas, mansions, parks and lagoons.

Al Habtoor City

Located close to Downtown Dubai, Al Habtoor City provides a relaxing sanctuary, composed of five-star hotels and world-class entertainment, including La Perle DXB – a unique, aquatic spectacle with more than 65 performers. Visitors can stay at world-class properties designed by remarkable architects, such as Habtoor Palace, LXR Hotels & Resorts; V Hotel, Curio Collection by Hilton; and Hilton Dubai Al Habtoor City.

Tolerance Bridge

Tolerance Bridge is the first and only clear span suspension bridge in the Middle East. Named in honor of the International Day of Tolerance, the bridge offers pedestrians a 690-foot-long walking and cycling path over the Dubai Water Canal. The canal is a three-kilometer long project that extends from Business Bay to the Arabian Gulf and runs through Safa Park and Jumeirah.

Mall of Emirates

Home to a ski slope, cinema complex and 560 shops and boutiques, a visit to the Mall of the Emirates is a must-see on any trip to Dubai. Shop, dine and stroll beneath the glamorous Fashion Dome, with its wrought iron ceiling reminiscent of European railways, at brands like Apple, Chanel, Burberry and Missoni just to name a few.

Ski Dubai

Located inside the buzzing Mall of the Emirates, you will find one of the most innovative, iconic and exciting tourist attractions to be found in the Middle East. You can easily recognise it from afar – it's the slanted building perched on top of the mall. Surrounded by a cluster of cosy chalets and restaurants, there's nothing quite like skiing as you watch shoppers pass by in the surrounding windows. Play with penguins, build a snowman, roll down the hills, ride the Twin Track Bobsled or explore a snow cavern.

Sustainable City

The Sustainable City contains 500 villas grouped into five residential clusters connected to an urban farm that runs the length of the City. Each cluster is comprised of 90 Courtyard Villas, eight Garden Villas, and two Signature Villas. The borders of The Sustainable City act as the first line of defense against pollutants. The remarkable 10-metre-high buffer zone running along the periphery of the development consists of 2,500 trees scattered in multiple layers. This purifies the air coming into the city and creates a breeze.

Arabian Ranches

Arabian Ranches is an upscale gated villa community in Dubai, United Arab Emirates launched in 2004. Located in Wadi Al Safa 6, along Sheikh Mohammad Bin Zayed Road and in proximity to Dubai's Global Village. It includes the Arabian Ranches Golf Club, Dubai Equestrian & Polo Club.

Dubai Butterfly Garden

Dubai Butterfly Garden claimed to be the "World's Largest Covered Butterfly Garden" consists of ten custom built domes around 6,673 sq.m. Each dome is filled with thousands of beautifully winged creatures, featuring 15,000 butterflies of around over 50 varieties of butterfly in different sizes and colors flying around the visitors.

DUBAI MIRACLE GARDEN

Each season, as the weather begins to cool at the onset of winter, the gates reopen at Dubai Miracle Garden. With more than 150 million flowers in full bloom, this 72,000-sq-m paradise has flowered into one of the region's most picturesque, sweet-scented destinations since it first opened nearly nine years ago

Damac Hills

DAMAC Hills is a well-established self-contained community comprising villas, apartments and a hotel. Home to the Trump International Golf

Club Dubai, it also boasts nearly four million square feet of parkland offering various themed areas for relaxation and sports – including restful gardens and lakes, a skate park, stables, football field, tennis courts and lagoon.

Trump International Golf Club Dubai

A 500-acre championship golf course with a luxurious clubhouse. Trump International Golf Club is an 18-hole championship golf course located in the heart of DAMAC Hills. 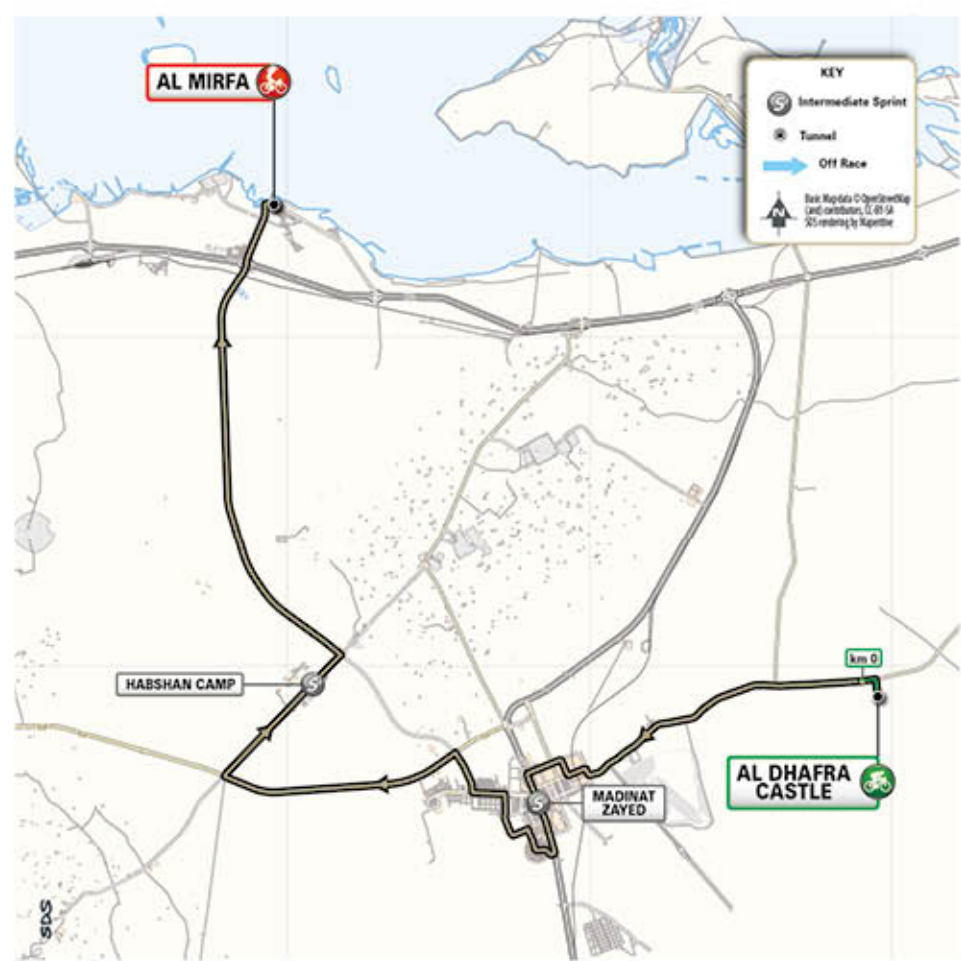

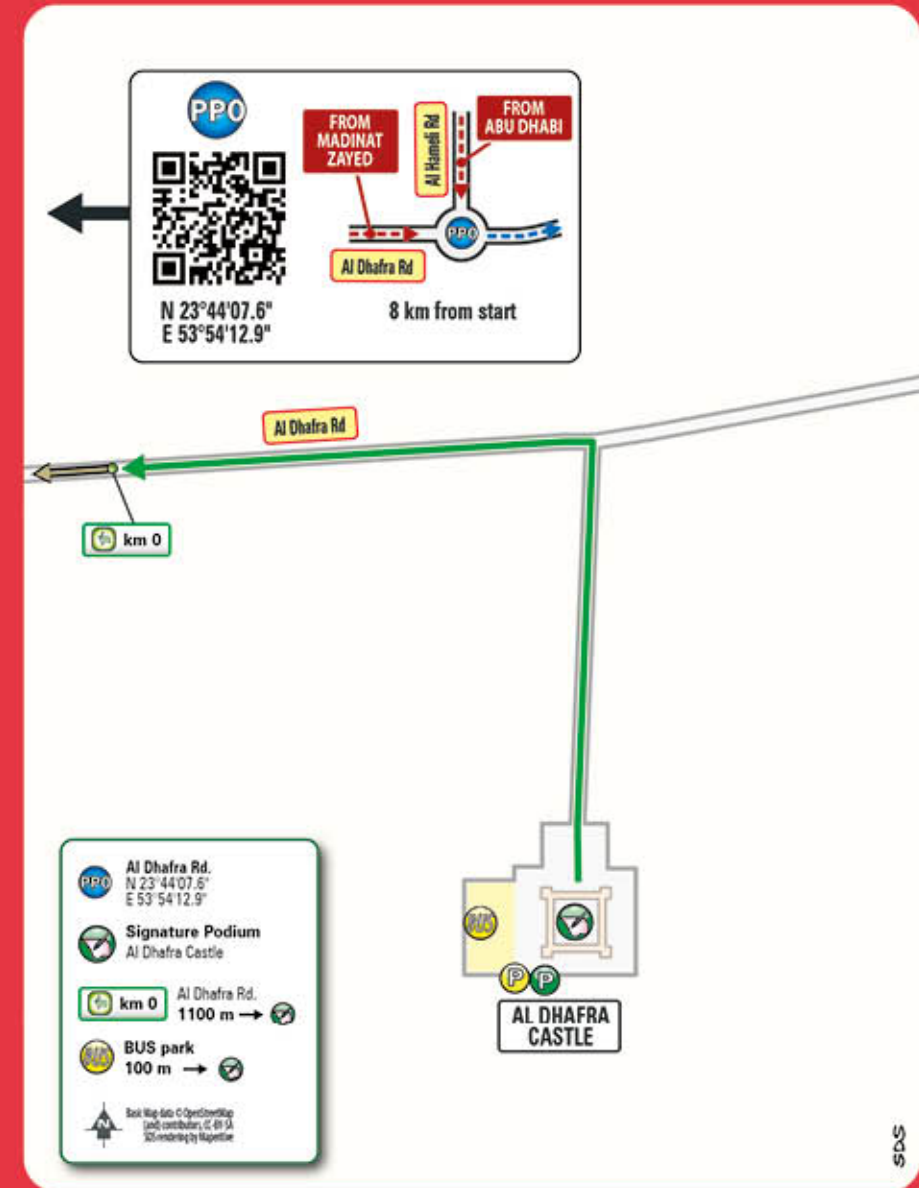

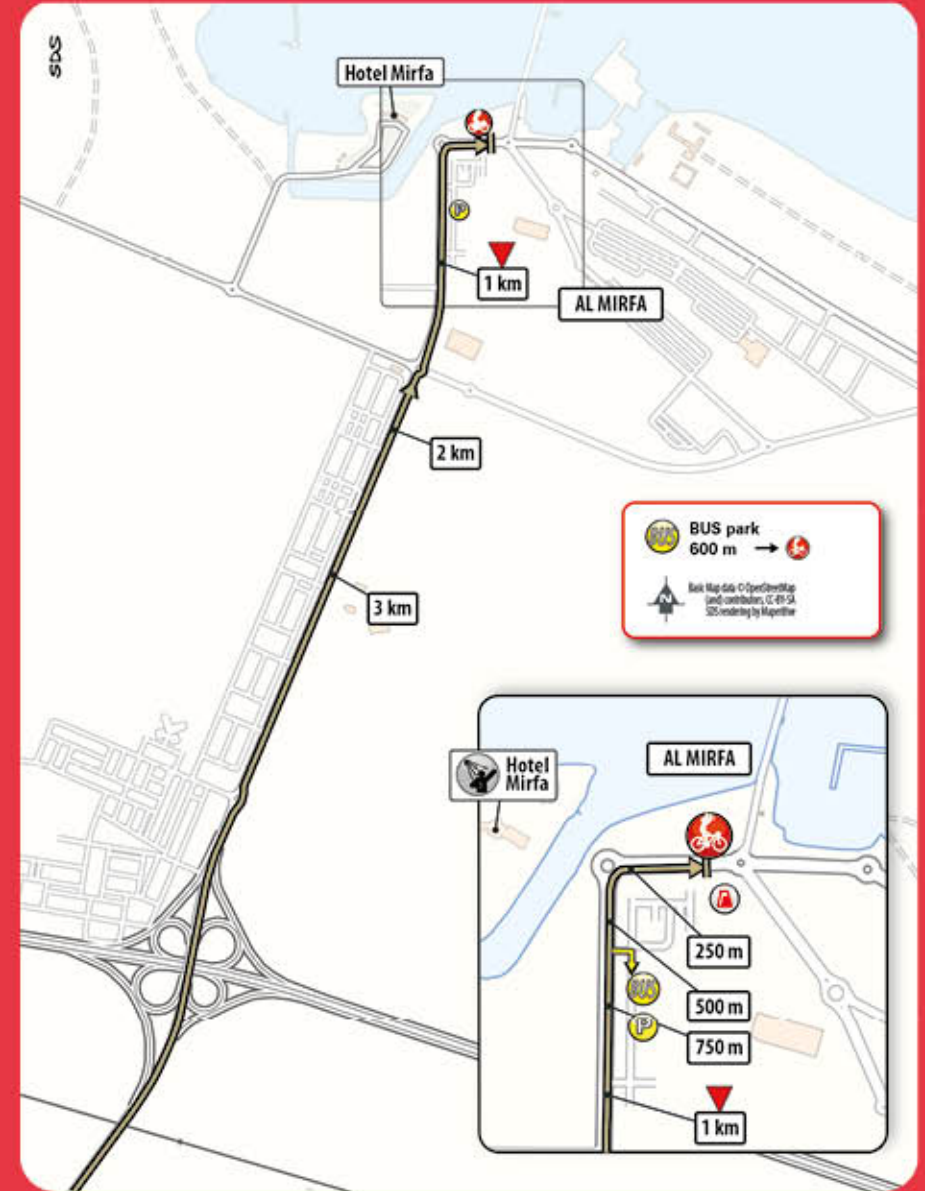

Al Dhafra Castle

The castle is located in Sayh Al Surra, nearly 30 kilometres east of Madinat Zayed, and is mentioned in old manuscripts related to the region's history.

Dhafra Walk

Big Flag Madinat Zayed

Madīnat Zāyid is the largest town and the administrative centre of Al Dhafra, the westernmost and largest region in the Emirate of Abu Dhabi. The township was established in 1968 by Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the late Ruler of Abu Dhabi and President of the United Arab Emirates.

Zayed City

Madinat Zayed is a town in the Emirate of Abu Dhabi, in the United Arab Emirates. It's known for the annual Al Dhafra Festival, featuring a camel beauty pageant, races and a traditional market. East of town is Mantiqa al-Sirra, the remains of a mud-brick fort where centuries-old ceramics were recovered. Farther south are the oasis town of Liwa and the vast desert expanse of the Empty Quarter.

Sheikh Hamdan Bin Zayed Al Nahyan Stadium

Sheikh Hamdan Bin Zayed Stadium or simply Al Dhafra Stadium after the resident football club is a multi-purpose stadium located within the small town of Madinat Zayed.

Mirfa Coast

Al Mirfa, also known as Al Marfa, is a coastal community located in Al Dhafra region of Abu Dhabi. The residential district is connected to the mainland through Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed International Road which is running along with the community. It features villas in different configurations and a range of communal facilities such as parks, hospital and education institutes. A coastal sub-district of Al Dhafra, Features houses in unique layout. Home to several government offices, a power station and a fish market. Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed International Road runs along with the community.

Shams Solar Power Station

Shams Solar Power Station is a concentrating solar power station near Madinat Zayed, Abu Dhabi, the United Arab Emirates. The solar power

station is located approximately 120 kilometres (75 mi) southwest of Abu Dhabi and 6 kilometres (4 mi) from Madinat Zayed on the road from Tarif to the Liwa Oasis.

The Shams station is planned to eventually include 3 plants: Shams 1 became operational on 17 March 2013.[1][4] Using parabolic trough technology with a capacity of 100 megawatts (MW), Shams 1 was the largest concentrated solar power (CSP) facility in the world when it opened.[5][6] Shams 1 will be followed by the Shams 2 and Shams 3 power plants.[1][7] The website Shamspower describes the impact and sustainability factors of the solar power plant.

LIWA Oasis

Historic Liwa Oasis lies at the northern edge of Rub' Al Khali (the Empty Quarter) — the world's largest uninterrupted desert. Liwa Oasis benefits from a water table that lies close to the surface and which has supported agriculture and animal husbandry for generations. This creates a dramatic contrast in the landscape between green date palm groves and tall orange-red sand dunes.

The Liwa Oasis extends in an east–west arc for more than 100 kilometres and features some of the world's largest sand dunes, with many rising more than 150 metres in height.

Tilal Liwa Hotel

Tilal Liwa Hotel brings the best of Arabic traditions and culture to life. The hotel is located on the edge of the Rub Al Khali (The Empty Quarter, the largest uninterrupted sand desert in the world) in the sands of Liwa amid rolling sand dunes and an unspoiled desert landscape. Built in traditional style, it is an elegant retreat for those seeking a unique desert experience and the true spirit of Arabia. Featuring 111 rooms and suites that offer indulgent living, intuitive services and authentic dining, complemented by exciting recreational activities, this desert oasis presents a unique avenue to natural beauty and solitude.

Moreeb Dune

Moreeb Dune or Tal Moreeb is a large sized sand dune located in proximity of Liwa Oasis at the Empty Quarter desert in the United Arab Emirates.

With a reported 50 degree slipface, and height of 300 metres, the dune is popular for organised drag races competitions. Moreeb Hill is the tallest dune in the UAE, and one of the largest hill climbs in the world. Moreeb Dune is one of the highest sand hills in the world. The dune is 1600 meters long.

Hazza Bin Zayed Stadium

The home of Al Ain FC, this 25,000-seat stadium is one of Al Ain's tallest buildings and a recognizable landmark. The outer façade design of this stadium is inspired by a palm tree trunk, an integral part of the UAE's heritage and culture. The stadium is part of a wider project, constructed in phases, which will ultimately include residential, commercial, and entertainment areas, as well as a luxury hotel and sports facilities.

UAE University

United Arab Emirates University is the oldest university in the United Arab Emirates. It was established in 1976. The UAEU is an accredited research-based institution. Its alumni have provided the United Arab Emirates with ministers, diplomats, senior government officials, and business leaders.

Al Jahili Fort

Al Jahili Fort is one of the UAE's most historic buildings. It was erected in 1891 to defend the city and protect precious palm groves. The former headquarters of the Oman Trucial Scouts, the force that protected the mountain passes and kept inter-tribal peace, it also served as a residence for the local governor.

Al Ain Oasis

In the heart of the city, the Al Ain Oasis has been opened as the UAE's

first curated UNESCO World Heritage site visitor experience. Spread over 1,200 hectares (nearly 3,000 acres) and containing more than 147,000 date palms of up to 100 different varieties, this impressive oasis is filled with palm plantations, many of which are still working farms. The cool, shady walkways transport you from the heat and noise of the city to a tranquil haven; all you will hear is birdsong and the rustle of the palm fronds.

Al Ain Palace Museum

Located on the western edge of Al Ain Oasis, the Palace of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan was built in 1937. It was converted into a museum in 1998 and opened to the public in 2001. The original structure comprised a private residence for the ruler and his family within a complex of courtyards. The architectural design and construction of Al Ain Palace is typical of historical buildings of the UAE. It features characteristic ventilation structures that are designed to keep the buildings cool in the summer.

Souq Al Qattara

Dating back to the mid-20th century and founded by the late Sheikh Shakhbut bin Sultan Al Nahyan on the palm-lined road linking Al Ain's Al Qattara and Al Jimi oases, the historic Souq Al Qattara has been renovated and re-opened. A traditional handicrafts market takes place here every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from October to May, encouraging local families to preserve and promote Abu Dhabi's heritage through an active involvement in traditional craft production. The Souq is linked to the redeveloped Al Qattara Fort, now home to a popular arts center, featuring hundreds of modern exhibits, workshops, a café and a library.

Al Qattara Arts Centre

What was originally the Al Qattara Fort is today the Al Qattara Arts Centre. This traditional mud-brick tower and house is located on a mound overlooking the date-palm gardens of Qattara Oasis, which it was originally built to protect. Showcasing carefully restored traditional local architecture, the centre aims to provide a family-friendly venue where arts and culture can be studied, practiced, and developed by the entire UAE community and visiting travellers.

Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Grand Mosque

The Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Grand Mosque, also known as Al Ain Grand Mosque, will be able to accommodate 20,000 worshippers. It is composed of a basement level and ground floor and will also include a 160-meter-wide dome that will cover the main prayer hall and four 60-metre-tall minarets. The complex will also include other buildings for classrooms and offices, as well as underground parking.

Al Ain Zoo

This 900-hectare park near the base of Jebel Hafeet is where visitors can see a large animal collection in enclosures that closely resemble their natural habitats. There are plenty of green public spaces for picnics and playgrounds, a cafeteria, and a train tour of the wildlife area. The Al Ain Zoo is home to over 4,000 animals.

Qasr Al Muwaiji

For more than 100 years, this incredible historic fort has played a major role in the history of the United Arab Emirates. The Qasr Al Muwaiji fort was built in the early 20th century to protect and watch over the oasis, and is a great place to take photos today. The simple yet impressive square enclosure features a grand entrance gate and protruding corner towers. Over the years, Qasr Al Muwaiji has been used as a home for the ruling family, a place for the community to gather, and as a seat of governance.

Hili Archaeological Park

If history fascinates you, then you'll want to add Hili Archaeological Park to your itinerary. Now a modern park where you're able to picnic and go for peaceful walks, this UNESCO World Heritage site dates back to the Bronze Age and includes evidence of settlements dating back to about 2000 BCE, with ancient tombs. Also visit the nearby Hili 8 where, in 1977, French archaeologists began excavating and found the remains of barley, wheat, and date palm as well as bronze objects, pottery, and livestock. Today, you'll find ancient tombs, built with the utmost care, and exposed building foundations.

Green Mubazzarah

Strategically located at the feet of the Jebel Hafeet Mountains, Green Mubazzarah is home to a number of spending Chalets that make a great retreat away from the noise of the metropolis providing guests with a deluxe lodging and intimate access to the great outdoors. Green Mubazzarah occupies part of the rocky mountain side and been landscaped with rolling grassy hillsides alongside streams, hot springs and waterfalls.

Jebel Hafeet

Rising 1,240 meters, Jebel Hafeet is the emirate's highest peak, and the UAE's second. This towering rocky mountain, which stands guard over Al Ain and borders Oman, is forged out of craggy limestone that has been weathered over millions of years. Significant fossil discoveries have been made in the area, which are vital pieces in the jigsaw on the city's ancient history. Over 500 ancient burial tombs dating back 5,000 years have been found in the Jebel Hafeet foothills.

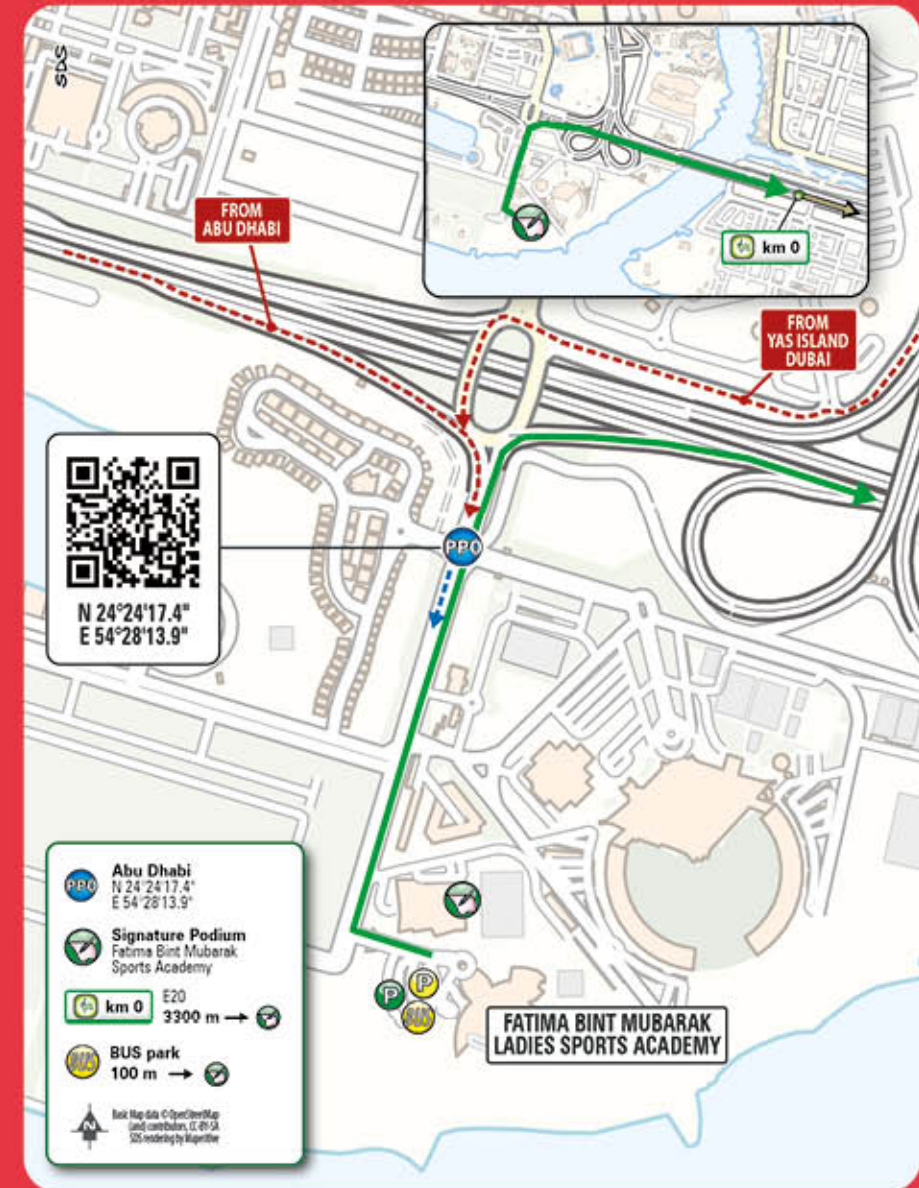

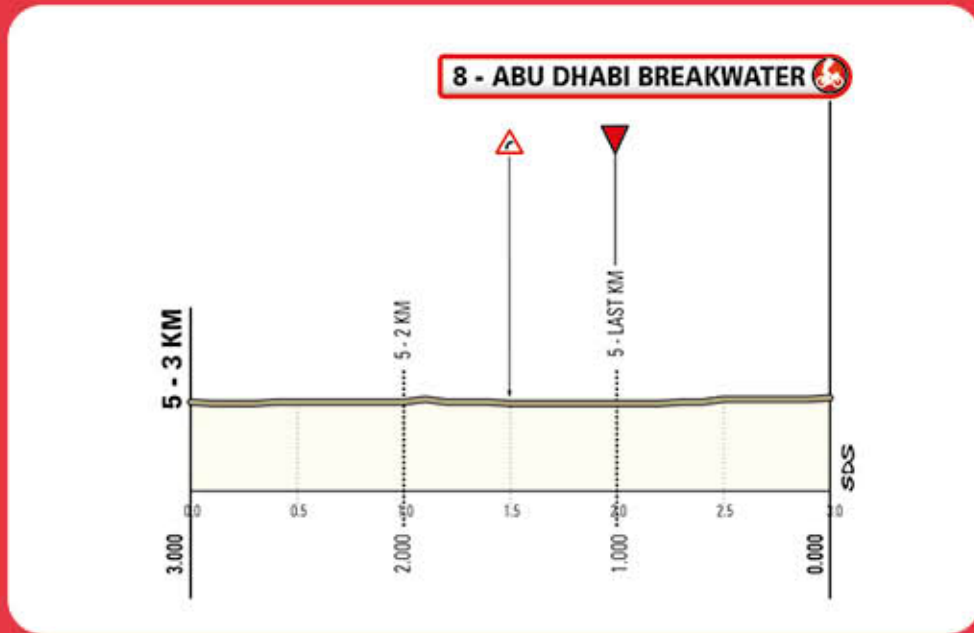

Fatima Bint Mubarak Ladies Sports Academy

The Fatima Bint Mubarak Ladies Sports Academy (FBMA) is a non-for-profit government entity headed by its Chairperson Fatima Bint Hazza Bin Zayed Al Nahyan. The academy is dedicated to promoting and facilitating women's sports in the UAE from its capital Abu Dhabi. FBMA strives to make sports an element of daily life for UAE national women.

Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque

The impressive and inspiring Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque is one of the world's largest mosques and the only one that captures the unique interactions between Islam and other world cultures. (Article 2.2.029) Furthermore, he might summon the representatives for the "Extreme Weather Protocol" in compliance with article 2.2.029 bis. In such a situation, decisions can be taken and/or confirmed on the morning of the stage (See the "Extreme Weather Protocol").

REGULATIONS

ART. 2 – TYPE OF RACE

The race is reserved to Women Elite Category and points will be awarded for the "Individual UCI World Ranking" - stage races, according to the provisions set out in Articles 2.10.002 ter and 2.10.008 of the UCI regulations. General Classification To the first 40 Riders on the final

General Classification will be awarded the following points: 400, 320, 260, 220, 180, 140, 120, 100, 80, 68, 56, 48, 40, 32, 28 from 16th to 20th 24, from 21st to 30th 16, from 31st to 40th 8. WWT Young general Classification To the first 3 Riders on the final Young Classification will be awarded the following points: 6, 4, 2.

Stage Classification The top ten finishers of each stage will be awarded the following points: 50, 40, 30, 25, 20, 18, 15, 10, 8, 6. Wearing the race leader's jersey: 8 per stage

ART. 3 – ENROLLMENT

According to Article 2.1.005 and 2.1.007 bis of the UCI regulations, the race is reserved to: UCI Women's WorldTeams, UCI women's continental teams, UCI cyclo-cross professional teams, National Team of the host country. In compliance with Article 2.2.003 of the UCI Regulations, the number of Riders per team shall be 6 (six).

In any case, the Organization, so as to safeguard the image and the reputation of its race, reserves the right to reject, up to the start, the Riders or the Teams which, by their acts or statements, would prove to neglect the principles of sport fair play and the undertaken commitments as set forth in Article 1.1.023 of the UCI regulations. Furthermore, in the event the Riders or the Team should fail during the race in complying with the principles set out in the foregoing paragraph, the Organization shall also reserve the right to expel them from the race at any time, in compliance with the Article 2.2.010 bis

ART. 4 – GENERAL PROVISIONS

The subjects listed hereunder are liable for the enforcement of the present regulations and – for all that is not regulated under the present ruling – of the current regulations issued by the International Cycling Union:

- the titular race Riders;
- the Sports Directors and the Teams' staff;
- all the Race's followers duly accredited by the Organizers in a recognized and acknowledged official position.

Only the persons notified upon getting the identification badge by the owners of the authorized vehicles are entitled to follow the race. Each and every change or addition shall be notified to the Organization Manager. The cars and motorcycles' drivers shall comply not only with the enforced rules of the Highway Code, but also with the provisions issued by the Organization Manager and his staff. Persons without any function acknowledged by the Organizers or relevant to the race's services as well as under-aged persons are not allowed to follow the race.

In the event of non-compliance about "the circulation during the race" will apply to the articles of the Part 2 Road Races, Chapter 2, paragraph 4, UCI regulations.

The Organizing Society shall not be accountable for any damage caused by accidents or incidents before, during and after the race to spectators or people in general, even if not involved in the race itself, because of actions that have not been performed by the Organization itself.

For all that is not regulated under the present ruling, the regulations issued by the UCI are enforced.

ART. 5 - RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF RIDERS

All registered Riders have the right, in compliance with the regulations in force, to compete in all the classifications – i.e. stage classification, general and special classifications – inscribed in the race program.

They are required to maintain a responsible race behavior and to refrain from promoting or supporting any mass demonstration susceptible to assume the character of either fraudulent agreements prejudicing other Competitors, or to appear as a protest against the Organizing Society or the Commissaires' Panel or other official followers whatsoever.

Moreover, the titular Riders are requested:

A) to carry a frame number and two body numbers duly provided by the Organization. These numbers cannot be modified as far as their size is concerned (Articles.1.3.076/077)

B) to carry on all the stages a transponder supplied by the Organization and to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle, for the automatic reading of their passage position on the finish line and in some other segments determined by the Organization. However, the crossing of the finish line will be the final reference for the stage classification.

Failure in complying with such obligation shall be considered as an infringement equivalent to the absence of body number and consequently punished in accordance with UCI Table 2.12.007/3.5.3

C) to wear the jersey corresponding to their relevant team as well as the World Championship or National Championship jerseys; in order of priority in compliance

REGULATIONS

of the Article 1.3.071.

D) the leaders of the General Classification, the Points Classification, the Best Young Rider Classification, the Intermediate Sprints Classification, shall respectively wear the Red jersey, the Green jersey, the White jersey, the Black jersey, all of them duly provided by the Organizing Society. This order also features the priority between the different leader's distinctive jerseys, so that in the case a Rider should be leading more than one classification, he would wear the distinctive jersey having a priority in the above-mentioned order. The remaining jerseys would be put on, at an honorific title, by the next following Riders in the ranking of the respective classifications, provided that they are not already entitled to a different classification (Article 2.6.018).

The jersey-holder is required to wear his distinctive garment beginning from the signature procedure until to the prize-giving ceremony and during any possible press conference;

E) to refrain from answering to interviews during the race.

F) to quickly leave the left side (or right only if safer) of the road free for motorcycles and vehicles authorized to overtake the peloton;

G) in case of drop-out in the course of the race, to remit the body number to a Commissaire or to the "Broom wagon".

H) to refrain – after having crossed the finish line – from crossing the line a second time while still wearing his body number, and thus until the finish judge or the finish Commissaire in charge authorize the crossing (UCI Table 2.12.007/1.6)

I) The General Classification leader and the stage winner shall show up at the press room or the for a press conference with the accredited journalists (Article 2.2.082).

J) to undergo the Anti-Doping procedure, the convened Riders shall go to the premises indicated by the Organizer.

K) to behave appropriately with a respectable behavior in line with the local tradition and regulations, using all the carefulness necessary. For example, riders shall use structures that the organizer will provide like changing rooms and bathrooms in all start and finish areas.

To pay particular attention to the environment while disposing of trash and empty bottles.

REGULATIONS

ART. 6 – RACE HEADQUARTERS

The official accreditations and preliminary operations will take place in Abu Dhabi on the premises of Radisson Blu Hotel - YAS Island – YAS Plaza from 10:00 to 18:00 on Wednesday 8th February 2023.

The confirmation of the starting Riders and the collection of the race numbers by the Sports Directors is set at the Race Headquarters on 8th February from 16:00 to 16:45, subsequently at 17:00 at the Race Headquarters is due to take place the Meeting with the Organization Management, the Commissaires Panel, the Sports Directors and with the presence of UCI Technical Delegate, according to the provisions set out in Articles 1.2.087-88/2.2.093 of the UCI regulations.

At 10:30 - The Race Director with the President of Commissaires'Panel will hold "Race security briefing" for all Drivers, cars and motorcycles, which will be involved in the race convoy, for a Representative of the television production and for a Representative of the Highway Police, see Article 2.2.034 bis of the UCI regulations.

ART. 7 – PRELIMINARY OPERATIONS AT THE START

For each stage Riders shall assemble at the place mentioned in the Technical Guide. As far as road race stages are concerned, the presence of the Riders at the Podium where the starting sheet is to be signed is duly requested (Article 2.3.009). Then, Riders will gather for the group transfert towards the actual start place.

In addition, for all stages, the Organizer will set the team order for team presentation and to sign the starting sheet. This order list will be communicated the day before with the official communication.

ART. 8 - TOP-RIDERS PHOTOSHOOTING AND TEAM PRESENTATION

Depending on the Covid situation and the following protocols Organizer may set Top-Riders photoshooting and their press conference, Organization will communicate the list of riders needed a week before. Teams will make available the Top-Riders requested with the support of team press officer.

All the Teams, with all their Riders and two Team Managers and/or Sports Directors shall take part in the opening and teams presentation ceremony in case it will be organized.

ART. 9 – RADIO INFORMATION

Race news will be broadcasted on the frequency VHF 149.850 MHz. Organizers will provide the radio for every car in the race and to all vehicles or person shall need it.

ART. 10 – TIMEKEEPING

The Timekeepers Service, with the assistance of the finish judge, will be in charge of recording the official time. The service will be guarantee by NETCO Sports Italy srl. Riders will be provided with a trasponder, for the automatic reading of their time, to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle compulsarily.

ART. 11 – TIME BONUSES

Time Bonus valid for the General Individual Classification are envisaged in each stage except the time trial stage. According to the Article 2.6.019 UCI regulations, the time bonuses will be as follows:

- for each Intermediate sprint the time bonuses for the first three riders crossing the line will be respectively 3", 2" and 1"
- upon finishing each stage respectively 10", 6" and 4" time bonuses will be assigned to the first three riders crossing the line.

ART. 12 – SIGNPOSTS

The Organizing Society shall place the necessary signposts along the race route. For each stage, detailed information about safety and about the road's situation will be provided in the "Daily Race Communiqués", as well as any fixed areas of feeding if any. (Articles 2.2.015/1.2.064)

ART. 13 – GREEN ZONES

The Green zones will be signposted along the race route and communicated daily on the race official communications on route maps and in the time schedules as well as. Organization is committed to collect all the waste referred to the race and invites all the suiveurs to behave in way respectful of environment safeguard.

REGULATIONS

ART. 14 – TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The technical assistance service is provided for by 3 vehicles of the SHIMANO company.

ART. 15 – MEDICAL SERVICE

The Medical Service appointed by the Race Manager, is provided by an adequate number of Doctors and Paramedics; the service is operative during the race and available before the start and after the finish of the race. In case of need, following ambulances coordinated by the race Doctors will take the Riders to the hospitals mentioned in the Technical Guide.

ART. 16 – STAGE FINISHES

Stage finishes shall be announced in advance by a red triangle located one kilometer from the finish line and by an arch in coincidence with the time keeping and photo finish line.

It is mandatory for all vehicles to perform a detour from the race route where indicated by the Organizer, in order not to cross the finish line, exception for the Race Management, the Commissaires' Panel and the official Doctor vehicles.

In the case of a crash, puncture or mechanical incident beyond the signpost indicating the finish within three kilometres, the rider(s) affected shall be credited with the time of the group in whose company he was (they were) when the accident occurred, in compliance with Article 2.6.027 of the UCI Regulations.

The rule does not apply to stages featuring a summit finish (3rd). For all that is not regulated under this ruling, the irrevocable decision taken by the Commissaires' Panel in consultation with the Organization Management shall apply.

The "Protocol for stages expected to finish in bunch sprints" will be enforced in stages 1, 2 and 4 for calculating time gaps.

ART. 17 – FINISHING TIME LIMIT

In order to determine the finishing time limit, the stages have been divided into three categories depending on the different nature of their route:

- A category: stages presenting no particular difficulty (Stage 1, 2 and 4)

- B category: stages presenting difficulty (Stage 3)

Consequently, the time limit has been set out as follows:

- for the A category the winner's time plus:

16% if the average speed is less than or equal to 37 Km/h.

17% if the average speed is between 37 and 41 Km/h

19% if the average speed is over 41 Km/h

- for the B category the winner's time plus:

22% if the average speed is less than or equal to 34 km/h

23% if the average speed is between 34 and 37 km/h

25% if the average speed is over 37 km/h

According to Article 2.6.032 of the UCI regulations, in case of exceptional circumstances, confirmed accidents or incidents, the Commissaires Panel, after consultation with the Organization Manager, may readmit in the race any Rider finishing in a time exceeding the time limit, by increasing the latter by a maximum of 30% of the time set out in this article. The time limit, established on the basis of the winner's time expressed in minute seconds, shall be further rounded off to the successive superior minute.

In case, for those Riders readmitted, all points awarded in the general classification of the various secondary classifications shall be withdrawn.

ART. 19 – PENALTIES

Infringements will be sanctioned according to UCI Rules and to the "Table of race incidents" (2.12.007).

ART. 20 – PRIZE-GIVING PROTOCOL

After every stage finish, the stage winner, the leader of the General Classification who receives the red jersey, the leader of the General Classification by Points who receives the green jersey, the leader of the Best Young Rider Classification who receives the white jersey and the leader of the Intermediate Sprints Classification who receives the black jersey shall attend the prize-giving ceremony. After the final stage UCI WWT best rider and UCI WWT best young rider will be awarded as per UCI

WWT protocol regulations. Moreover, the stage winner and the leader of the General Classification shall participate in the press conference for the accredited journalists. (Articles 1.2.112/113 and 2.6.018 bis)

ART. 21 – ANTI-DOPING

Antidoping Control will be made on the dedicated premises by the finish area. The Doping Control Officer (DCO) charged by the ITA and acting on behalf of UCI will enforce the UCI Regulations, in compliance with the ITA's instructions and procedures, in accordance with Chapter 14 of the UCI ADR-TIR (Testing Investigation Rules) and with the relevant Law in force of the hosting country.

ART. 22 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY TIME

The Leader of the General Individual Classification will wear the Red jersey. In compliance with the provisions set out in Article 2.6.014 of the UCI regulations, the General Individual Classification is established by adding together the times achieved by each rider in each stage. Time bonuses and penalties are considered for this classification. In the event of a tie in the General Individual Classification the first discriminating criteria is given by the hundreds recorded in the individual time trial stage, the second is given by the lower sum of the placing obtained in each stage, as a last resort, the place obtained in the final stage is counted (Article 2.6.015).

ART. 23 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY POINTS

The sum of the points will determine an individual ranking and every day its Leader will wear the Green jersey. The individual points ranking is obtained by adding together the points recorded in each of the seven stages and the sum of the points assigned in all the Intermediate Sprints.

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.6.017 of the UCI regulations, in the event of a tie in the General Classification by Points the following criteria will be applied:

1. Number of stage victories
2. Number of Intermediate Sprint victories
3. General Individual Classification

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 24 – BEST YOUNG RIDER

The Best Young Classification is reserved to Riders born after 1st January 1998 and is determined by the General individual Classification. The Leader will wear the White jersey

ART. 25 – “INTERMEDIATE SPRINT JERSEY” CLASSIFICATION

A special Intermediate Sprint Classification has been set up, at each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

1st	8 points
2nd	5 points
3rd	3 points
4rd	1 points

The general ranking is established by the sum of the points obtained; the Leader of the Intermediate Sprint Classification shall wear the Black jersey.

In the event of a tie in the Intermediate Sprint general classification, the following discriminating criteria will be applied:

- number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- general individual classification

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 26 – TEAM CLASSIFICATION

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.06.016 of the UCI regulations, the team classification is established on the basis of the sum of the three best individual times from each team. In the event of a tie the teams shall be separated by the sum of the places acquired by their three best times in the stage. If the teams are still tied, they shall be separated by the placing of their best rider on the stage classification. The team general classification shall be calculated on the basis of the three best individual times from each team in each stage ridden.

In the event of a tie the following criteria shall be applied in order until the teams are separated:

- number of first places in the daily team classifications;
- number of second places in the daily team classifications;
- etc.

If there is still a draw, the teams shall be separated by the placing of their best rider in the general individual classification. Any team reduced to fewer than three riders shall be eliminated from the general team classification.

ART. 27 – RACE MANAGEMENT

The UAE Tour race will be managed in compliance with the UCI regulations through the UCI Commissaires appointed according to the art. 1.1.070 and in collaboration with the RCS Sports technical race management coordinated by the race director Mauro Vegni (tel. +390225848766).

ART. 28 – REGULAR AND SPECIAL PRIZES

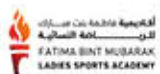

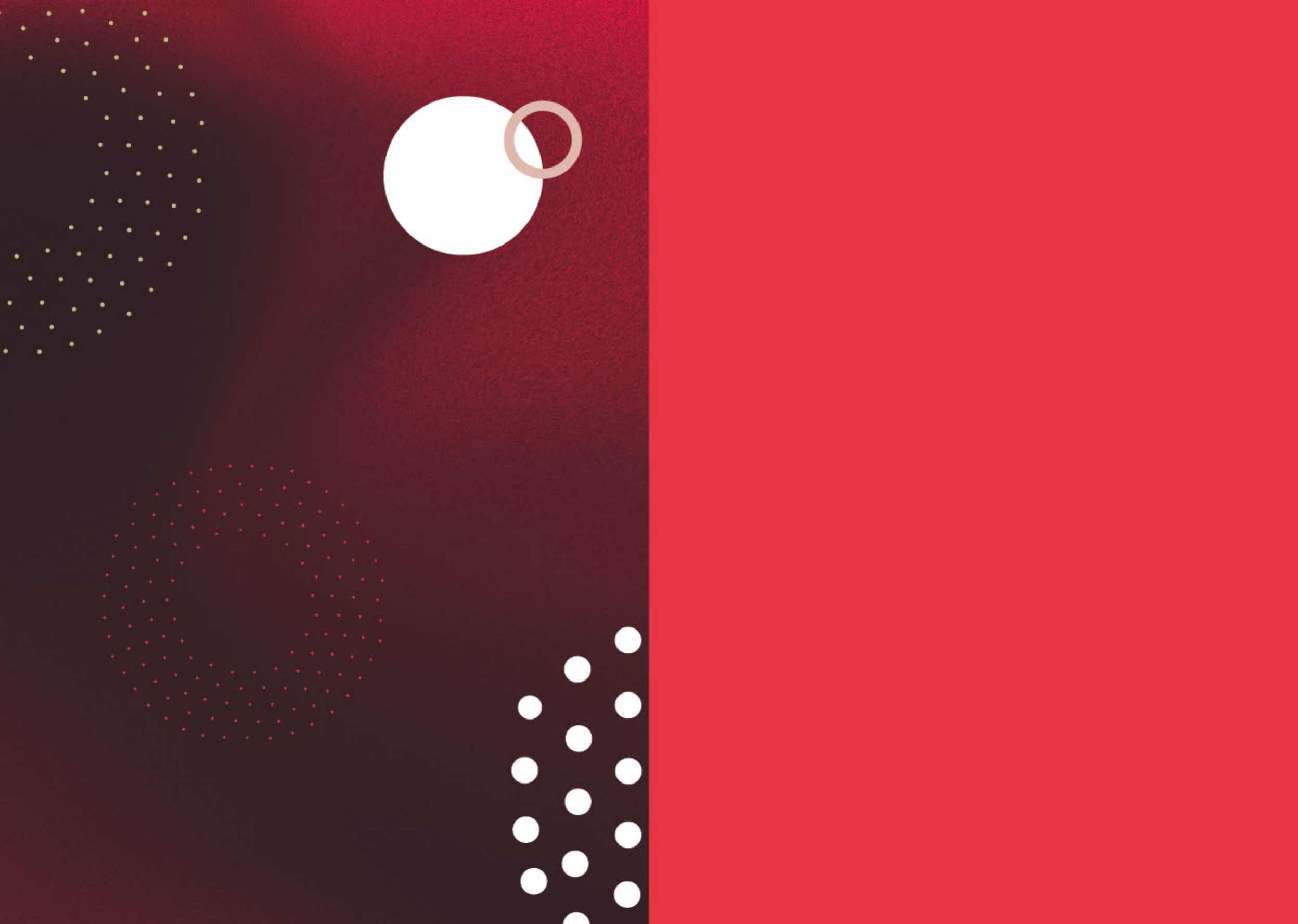
