The stage of the desert. The first part (north-south direction) is about 45 km long, on wide, straight roads. After reaching Liwa, the race enters an area of very pronounced dunes, which make up the bulk of the stage. A series of ups and downs leads to Moreeb Dune, where the race will take two laps of the Moreeb Dune cycle path (18.1 km each lap), marked by rather steep ups and downs with double digit gradients. It then returns to Liwa for the finish. The stage is on wide, straight roads with good pavement.

Stage two is an individual Time Trial that takes place entirely inside Al Hudayriyat Island. The route is very fast and is characterized only by a few right angle bends and two U-turns. The road is perfectly flat, wide and with wide-ranging turns, which will allow riders to hold very high speeds (wind permitting).

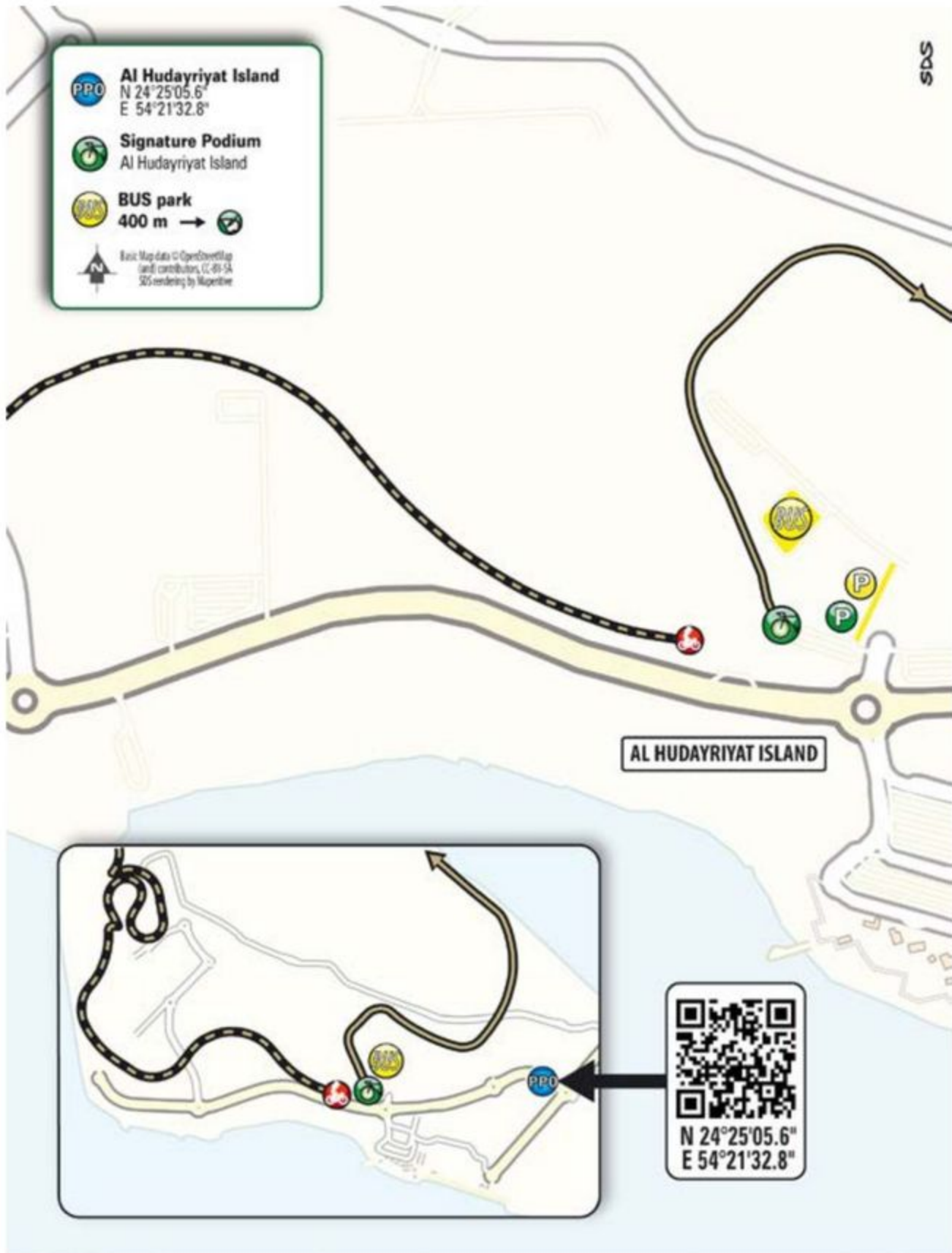

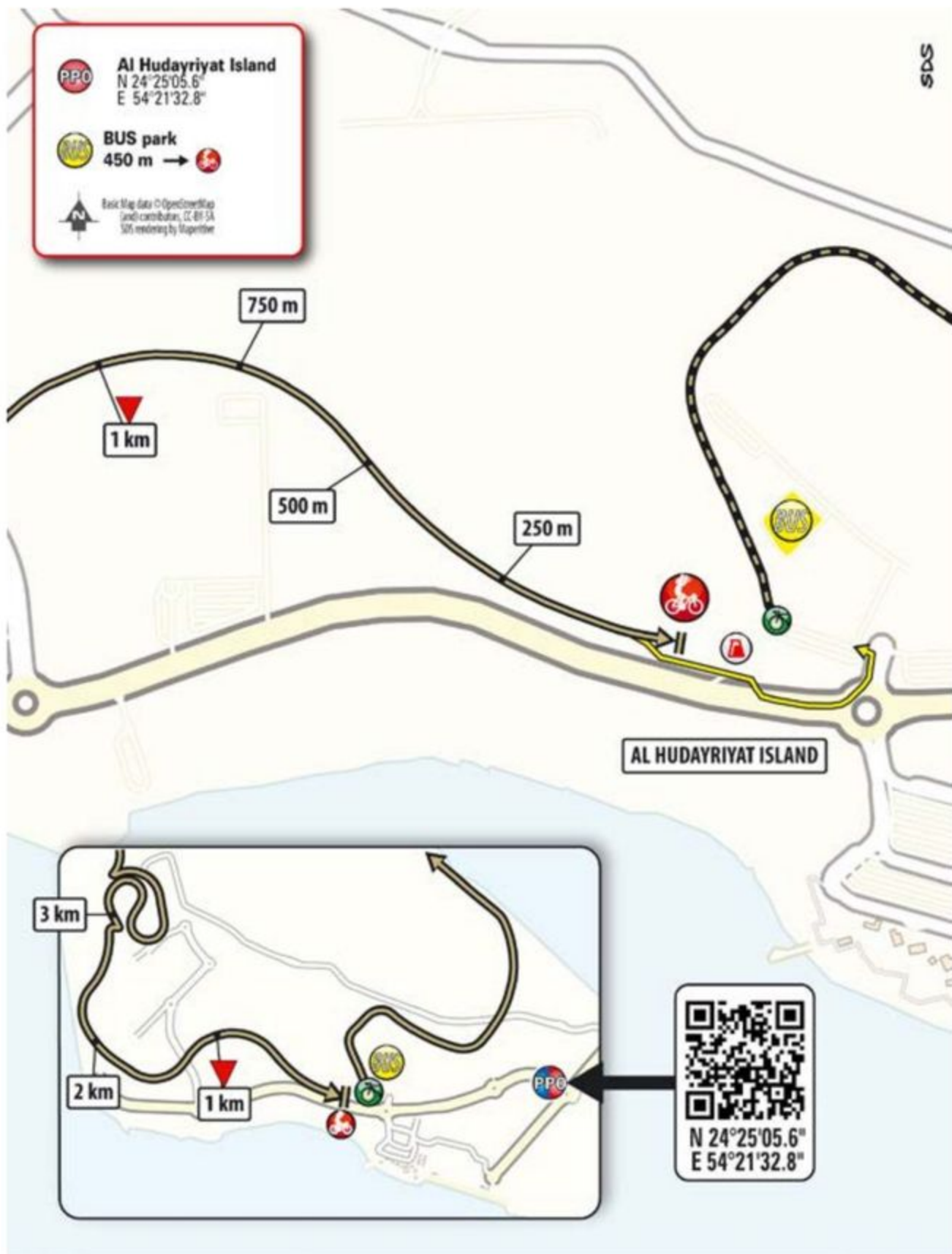

Hudayriyat Island — Hudayriyat Island
(Presight Stage)

HUDAYRIYAT ISLAND

For beachfront vibes, catch-ups with friends and fun-filled family days out, Hudayriyat Island is your one-stop destination. Just across the water from Al Bateen, you'll find everything you need for a great day or night, from sports facilities to restaurants, and glamping, to play parks and more. Take your pick from football fields, running tracks, indoor and outdoor basketball, and tennis courts, bike parks, cycling tracks, skate parks, an obstacle course and watersports.

QASR AL HOSN

The Qasr al-Hosn is a historical landmark and the oldest stone building in the city of Abu Dhabi, the capital of the United Arab Emirates. It was designed by Mohammed Al Bastaki and built in 1761.

LOUVRE ABU DHABI

Designed by Pritzker-prize-winning architect Jean Nouvel, the Louvre Abu Dhabi encompasses 9,200 square metres of galleries, including a Permanent Gallery and a Temporary Gallery enriched by loans from notable French museums including Musee du Louvre, Musee d'Orsay, and Centre Pompidou. Clearly showcasing the juxtaposition of different civilisations in the same space, the Louvre Abu Dhabi illustrates similarities and exchanges from the shared human experience, going beyond geography, nationality, and history.

SAADIYAT ISLAND

FERRARI WORLD ABU DHABI

Open 365 days a year, the world's first Ferrari-branded theme park tells the marque's story with passion, showcasing more than 20 exhilarating and educational rides and attractions, incredible shopping, and authentic Italian dining experiences. The only time you'll be outside in the sun is on board the Formula Rossa – the world's fastest roller-coaster. Go from 0 to 240km/h in 4.9 seconds, while soaring to heights of 52 metres.

YAS MARINA CIRCUIT

Launched in 2009 to host the Formula 1™ Etihad Airways Abu Dhabi Grand Prix, Yas Marina Circuit is still one of the UAE's most epic motorsports, sporting, and business venues. This popular sporting and entertainment venue is considered one of the best grand circuits hosting events on the F1™ calendar, with five main stands for spectators along the track. Abu Dhabi Hill, opposite the North Grandstand, also offers fans open grass banks on which to sit and watch the action.

WARNER BROS WORLD™ ABU DHABI

The world's biggest and fully air-conditioned indoor theme park, Warner Bros. World™ Abu Dhabi brings all the legendary characters from this famous studio to life. 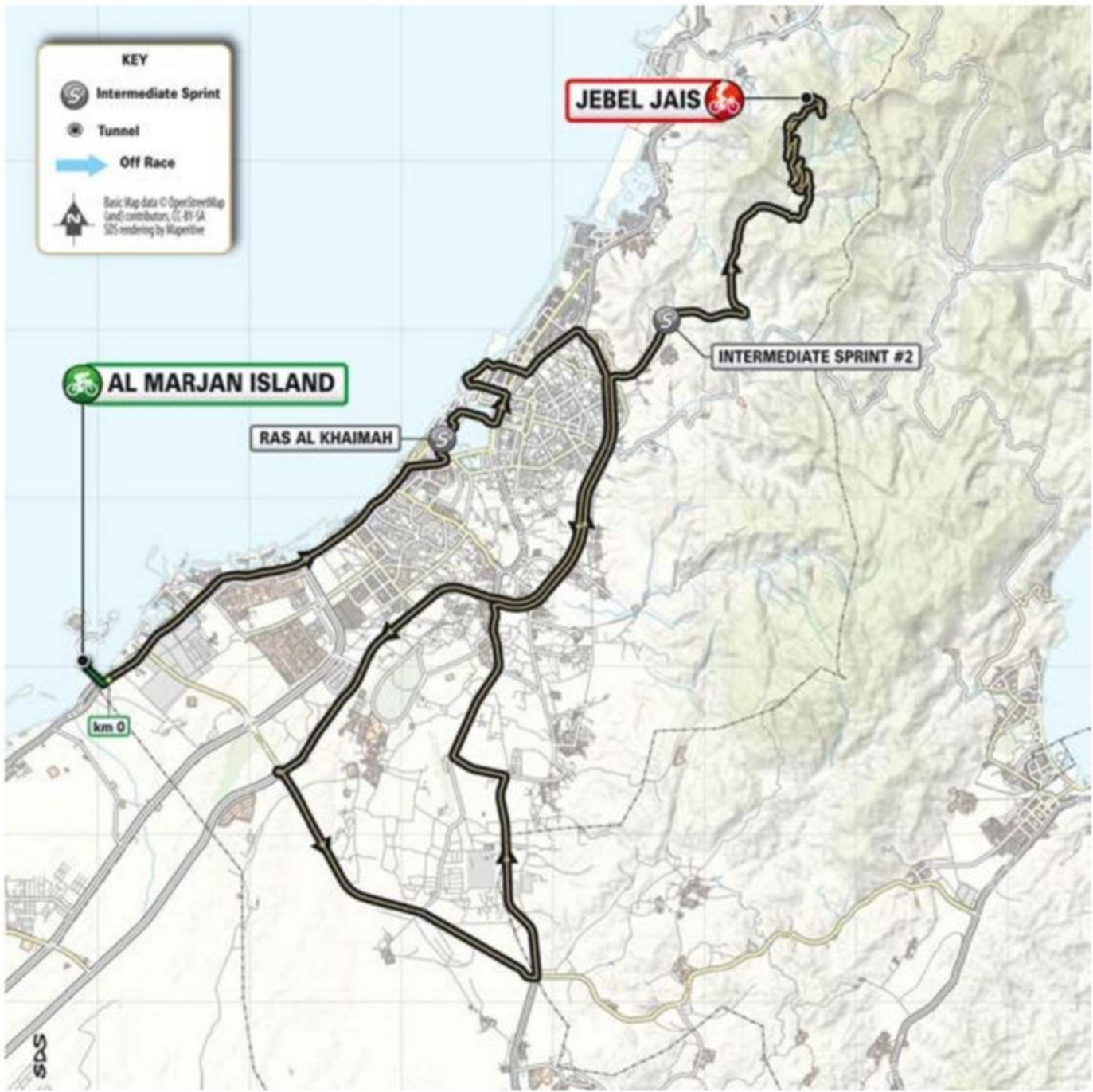

The final climb is approximately 20 km long at constant 5% gradient, with slightly higher gradients around 7% in the last 2 km.

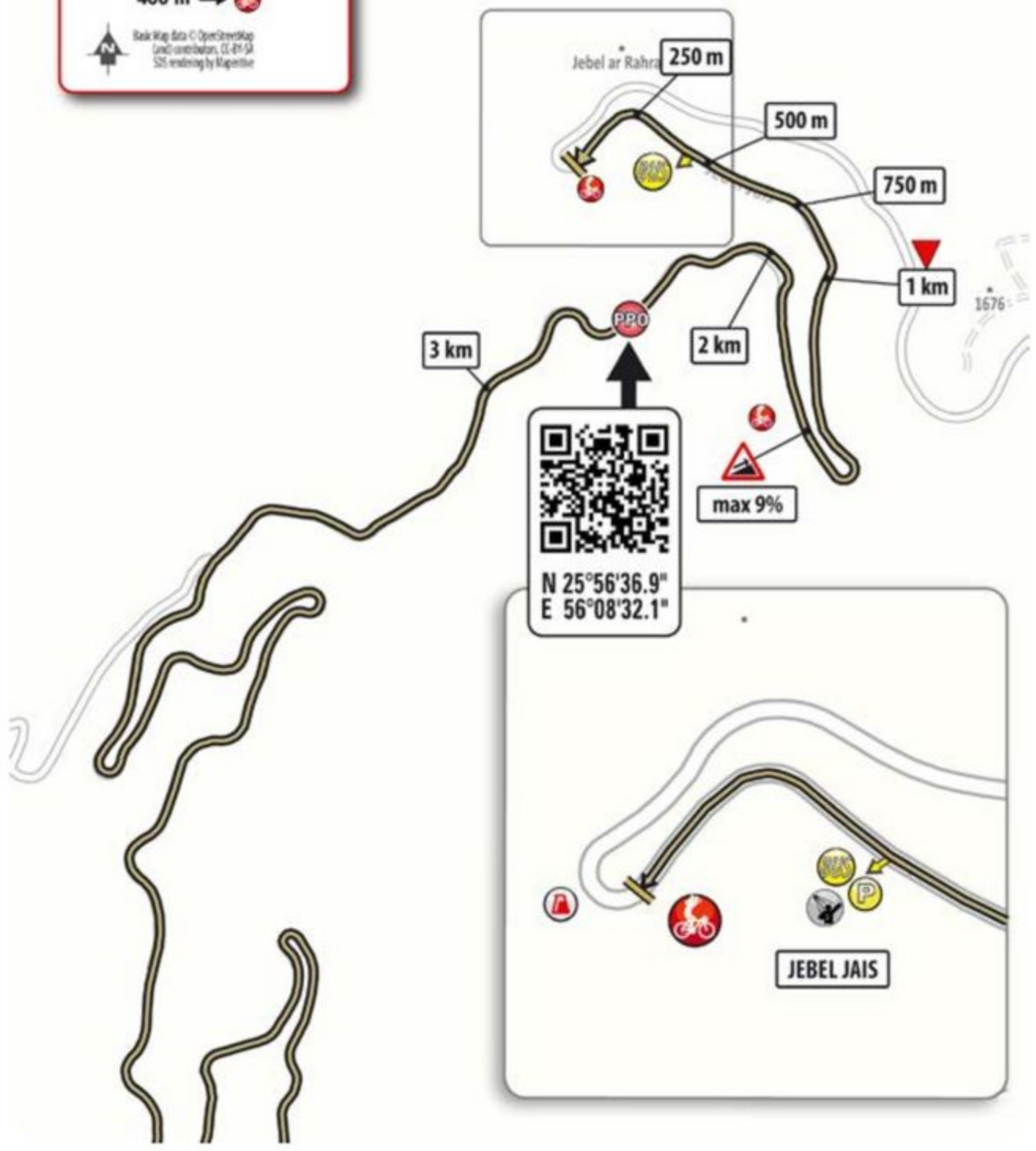

Mangroves and salt flats form a large part of the coastal and inland landscape of Ras Al Khaimah. The mangroves, which are home to a variety of wildlife, including flamingos, extend right into the city bringing a rich sense of nature into the urban environment. Visitors can explore the mangroves by taking kayak excursions and literally lose themselves in the natural beauty.

DHAYAH FORT

With a backdrop of steep mountains, the bay of Dhayah has always been a very fertile area and has been settled in at least since the third millennium BC. A conical-shaped hill at the edge of the palm gardens and at the foot of the mountains served as a natural defence post for the oasis.

People have used this hill since prehistoric times for settlement and fortification alike. Today, it is crowned by a fortress, built during the 19th

century on the foundations of much older structures. It is the only hilltop fort still existing in the UAE and offers a fantastic view of the lush palm gardens, sea and dramatic mountain landscape.

SHIMAL, RAS AL KHAIMAH

Shimal is a small hamlet of great historic significance and site of myriad of pre-Islamic tombs. Situated north of the Ras Al Khaimah city, Shimal is a small rustic village cuddled near the Hajar Mountains.

The place holds a great archaeological importance and is home to few hundred pre-Islamic tombs. The records and historical findings also hold proof of settlement in the area from around 2000-1300 BC. Several items such as pottery, weapons crafted of bronze and copper, stone vessels and beads were unearthed while several excavations. However, the greatest discovery in the area is considered to be of finding huge circular tomb from Umm al-Nar period. One can also see Husn al-Shimal Fort from small Islamic era being perched high above on the rocky outcrop. The place is a must visit for those who appreciate history.

MOHAMMED BIN SALEM MOSQUE

Mohammed Bin Salem Mosque Excavations revealed the presence of an earlier mosque, dating back to the second half of the 18th century (date as indicated by preliminary analysis of the finds). Historical records indicate a mosque was at this place since the 16th century.

With respect to the later 18th-century mosque, excavations revealed that it was destroyed during the British occupation in 1819/20 and that a new mosque was built on its foundations.

RAS AL KHAIMAH NATIONAL MUSEUM

Take yourself and your family on a journey through time... Visit the National Museum of Ras Al Khaimah and come face-to-face with famous and fascinating historical pieces through a unique collection of archaeological and ethnological artefacts.

Items of particular interest are a variety of documents, manuscripts and treaties between the rulers of Ras Al Khaimah and Great Britain. There are also exhibits of traditional weapons belonging to the ruling.

SHEIKH KHALIFA SPECIALITY HOSPITAL

Is a tertiary hospital highly specialized for specific fields of medicine with

centers of excellence. To provide high-quality service and care in the most efficient manner. Its located in Ras Al Khaimah City along Taween and Didda Road It is approximately 223 kilometers north-east of Abu Dhabi and approximately 88 kilometers north-east of Dubai.

SAQR PARK

The expansive Saqr Park is the community parkland in Ras Al Khaimah. It is open all year round and boasts a host of activities for everyone. His Highness Sheikh Saqr bin Mohammed Al Qasimi, the Ruler of Emirate of Ras Al Khaimah from 1948 to 2010, inaugurated the park in 1991.

AL SAWAN CAMEL RACETRACK

Camel races are a traditional heritage activity in Ras Al Khaimah. Mainly a winter pastime, the camel races take place on the weekends at the camel racetrack, surrounded by dunes and sheltered by the thickets of Ghaf trees in Digdaga and Hamraniya.

On weekdays, the racetrack is usually busy with camel trainers and colourfully clad camels trotting up and down the track, building up their stamina for the weekend races. The camel races are held early Friday mornings from 6:30 to 9:30am from October through the winter season.

J AIS SKY TOUR

Fly over the awe-inspiring cliffs and canyons of Jebel Jais as you zip from platform to platform. Covering a total distance of 5 KM via a series of 6 ziplines, ranging from 337M to just over 1KM, the Jebel Jais Sky tour gives you a panoramic, bird's eye view of the towering Hajar mountains. Averaging speeds of 60 KMPH, you will also find yourself at the UAE's highest sky bridge, 1250m above sea level, and walking across the length of the 15m bridge.

Located at Jebel Jais Viewing Deck Park 1300 meters above sea level, Puro Express is the ideal snack stop to grab light bites taking in the breath-taking views of the majestic Hajar mountains.

1484 BY PURO RESTAURANT

up favourites from around the world. Expect modern interiors and an expansive outdoor terrace with impressive mountain views.

JEBEL JAIS

The UAE's highest peak, Jebel Jais is part of the spectacular Hajar mountains that were formed over 70 million years ago in the eastern part of Ras Al Khaimah and Oman.

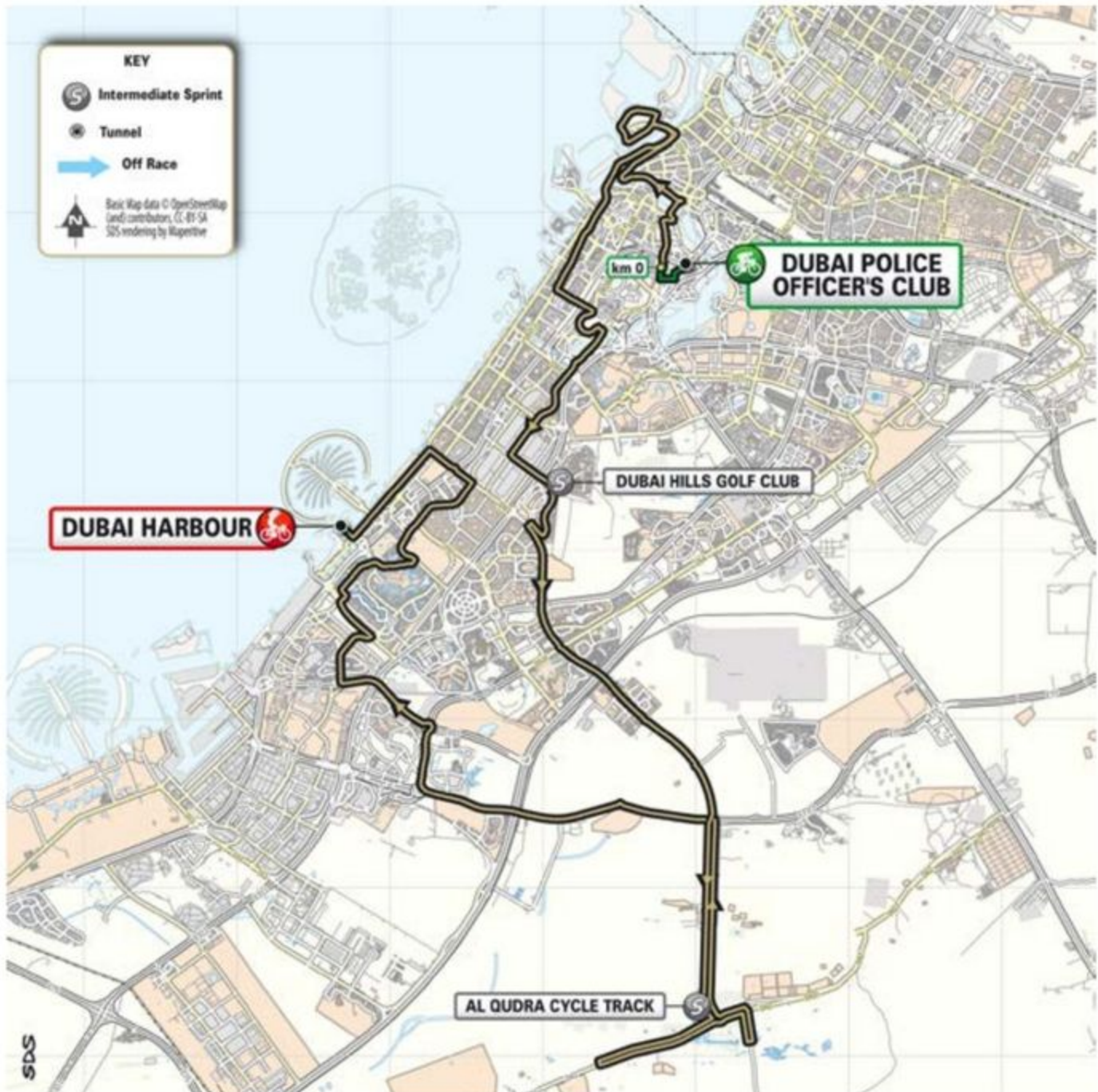

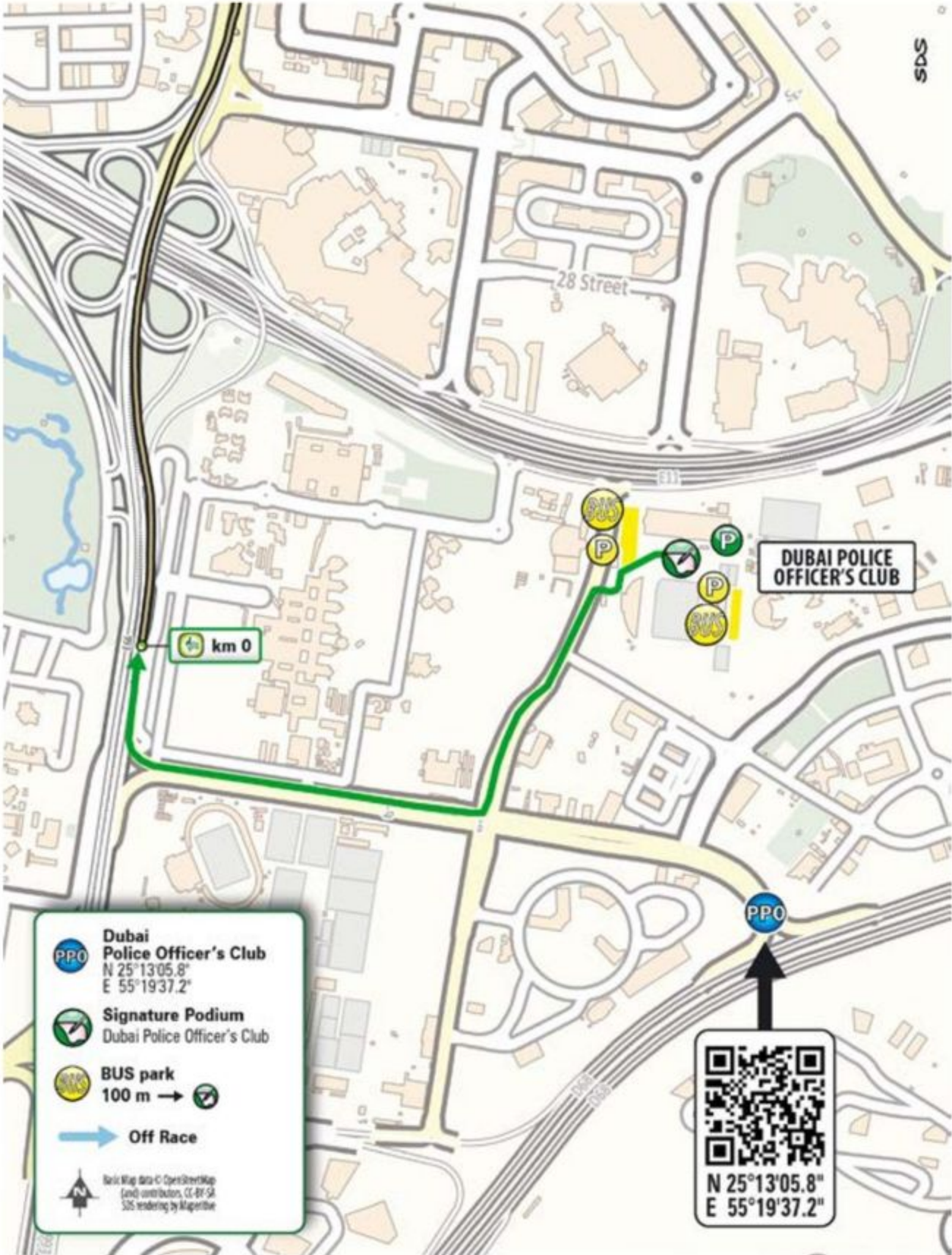

DUBAI POLICE OFFICER'S CLUB

The Dubai Police Officer's Club is a distinguished institution at the heart of the city, providing a dedicated space for police officers to connect. Equipped with modern facilities, including fitness centers and sports amenities, the club promotes camaraderie and a healthy work-life balance. Beyond recreation, it serves as a venue for professional development and networking, reflecting Dubai's commitment to the well-being and unity of its law enforcement community.

The Dubai Police Officers Club includes a football stadium and athletics track with international standards and has hosted several football, athletics, and various sports tournaments.

DUBAI CREEK

Dubai Creek is a saltwater creek, cutting through the heart of Dubai. The seawater Dubai Creek winds its way from the trading port on the Gulf to the Ras al Khor bird sanctuary on the desert edge of Dubai. In the past it was the centre of the fishing and pearling industry, which formed the main sectors of the city's economy. Nowadays the eastern and western banks are connected by one tunnel and four bridges, but the traditional form of transport on the creek, which is still available, were ferry boats.

DUBAI FRAME

The Dubai Frame is one of the city's most famous attractions for visitors and residents alike. Much like the Burj Khalifa and Burj Al Arab's iconic structures, the building's landmark location in Zabeel Park provides sweeping panoramic views of the city.

At 150m tall and 93m wide with a bridge connecting the two towers, Dubai Frame has a unique concept to its structure. Resembling a picture frame,

Dubai's historic district can be seen to the north while the south provides breathtaking vistas of the city's modern skyline.

BANIYAS ROAD

Baniyas Road also known as D-85, is a road in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. The road begins near the north end of the Deira Corniche, and runs beside Dubai Creek south-eastwards. Passing important landmarks along the creek, D 85 ends near the Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club.

Dubai Municipality initiates the smart pole because of the important landmarks along the D 85 route include the Hyatt Regency Dubai on the Deira Corniche, the Deira Twin Towers, Al Nasr Square, Etisalat Tower 1, Dubai Municipality, and the Deira City Centre. D 85 intersects with other roads to provide access to Bur Dubai — it intersects with D 92 (Al Mina Road/Al Khaleej Road) near Port Rashid to form the Al Shindagha Tunnel and with Umm Hurair Road in Deira to form the Al Maktoum Bridge.

DUBAI ISLANDS

A man-made archipelago off the shores of Deira, Dubai Islands is a work in progress that will eventually cover 17sqkm across five isles. The mixed-use development is already known for its emerging upmarket residences, hotels, lifestyle projects and marinas, and adds over 20km of beachfront to the city's already covetable coastline – including an eco-friendly Blue Flag beach.

Directly accessible from the mainland via road and sea, Dubai Islands (formerly known as Deira Islands) will be home to over 80 hotels, including luxury and wellness hubs, boutique offerings, family-friendly resorts and eco-conscious options. The Infinity Bridge is a magnificent infrastructure that contributes to further embellishing the city of Dubai. It joins the bridges we have built in the past in Dubai, notably over the Dubai Creek and the Dubai Canal which Six Construct also built.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II HOTEL

A one-of-a-kind entertainment, hospitality and tourist destination, and home to the first and only floating hotel in Dubai.

Experience true British heritage and history with a visit to one of the world's most celebrated ocean liners, now permanently docked in the new marina at Dubai's Port Rashid in the UAE, within easy reach of Dubai International Airport and all local attractions.

BURJ KHALIFA

828m into the sky, the Burj Khalifa is the tallest building in the world and one of the greatest engineering feats of all time. Completed in 2010, the mighty tower represents the beating heart of Dubai and its brave ambitions.

TOLERANCE BRIDGE

This footbridge is characterized by a rhomboidal section arch with a largeness of 205 meters and a height of 50 meters, which has a cross-section of about 6 meters at the base that tapers up to 2.1 meters in the key section, giving a sense of lightness and simplicity. The arch was preassembled and welded on the ground in seven macro-segments lifted then on the top of temporary towers, reaching at their tallest point 53 meters of height, by means of two 600-tons crawler cranes. The weight of the arch alone is 1.700 tons and, through 20 steel cables (for a total length of 858 meters), supports the S-shaped deck, 6.7 meters wide, curling in two concrete ramps wrapped around the bases of the arch. The width of the free span, evoking a sense of absence of gravity as if the footbridge floated gently above the water, gives to the footbridge an impressive visual impact.

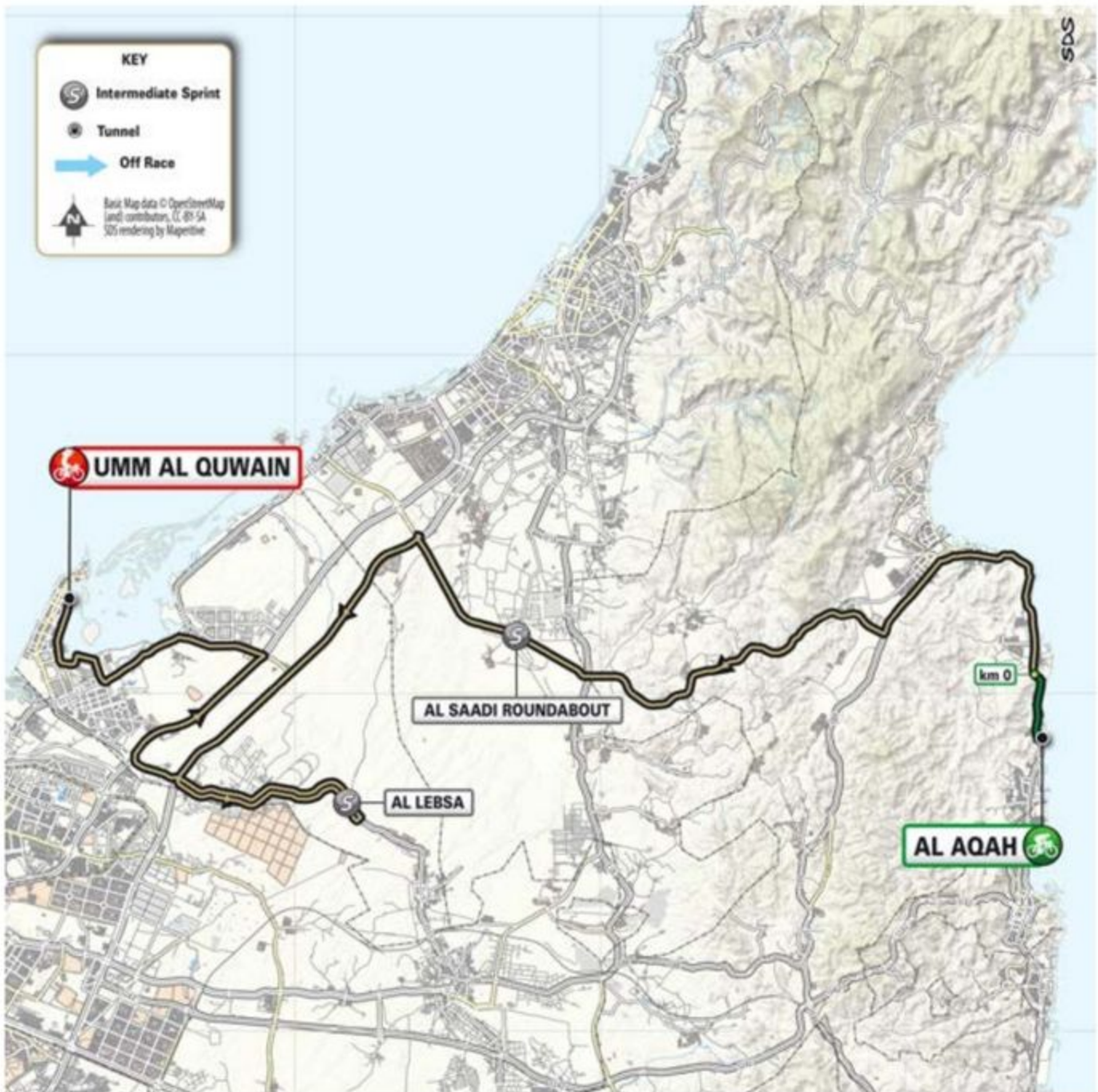

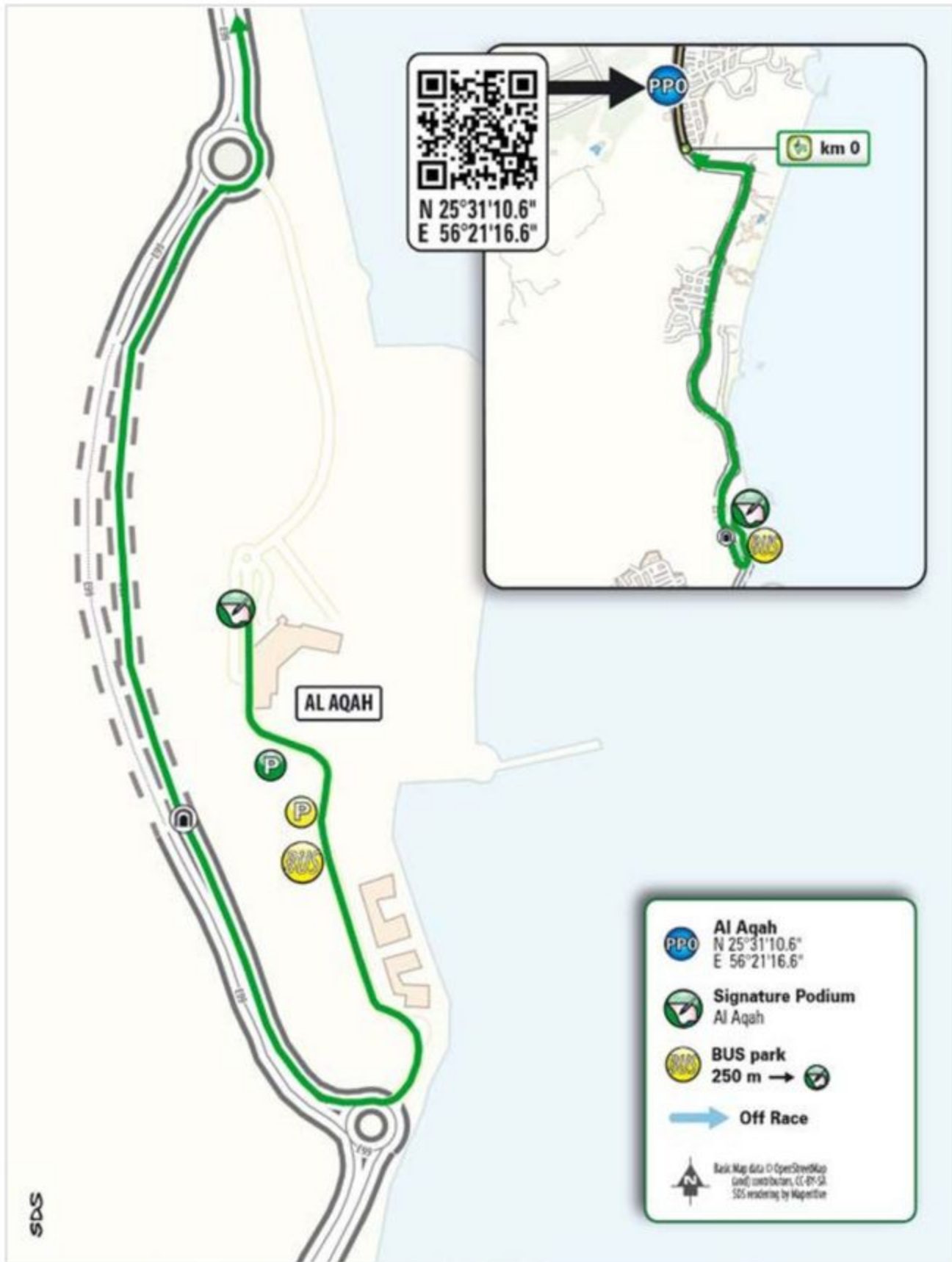

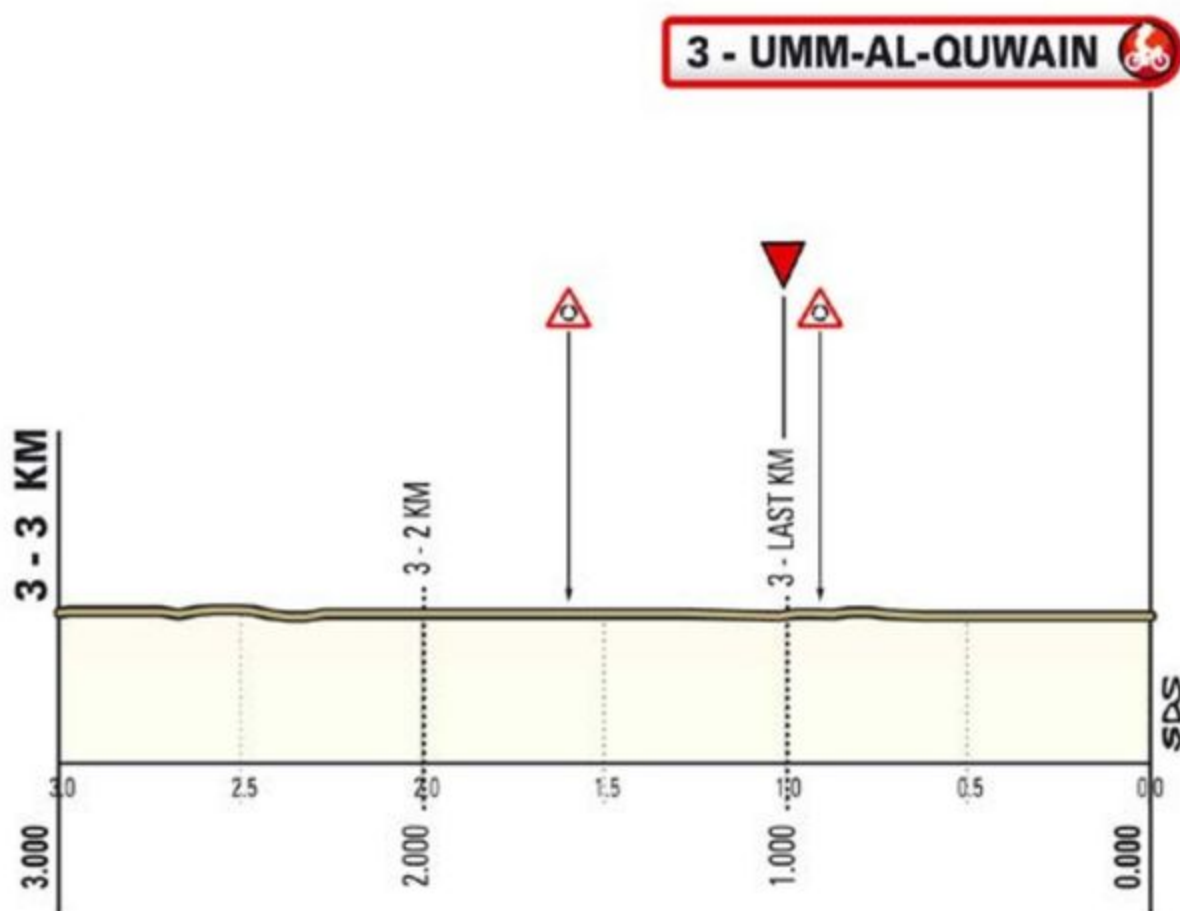

AL AQAH FUJAIRAH

Al Aqah is a picturesque coastal town located in Fujairah, United Arab Emirates. It is known for its stunning beaches, crystal-clear waters, and towering mountains.

The town is surrounded by the majestic Hajar Mountains, which adds to the natural beauty of the area. Al-Aqah is also home to some of the most luxurious hotels and resorts in the region.

FUJAIRAH FORT

Fujairah Fort is one of the important and largest forts of the Emirate. It is characterized by its position on a high hill in the old Fujairah region and is 3 kilometers away from the coast. It is built up to about 20 meters above sea level and oversees the whole city of Fujairah at this height. The design of the Fort differs from the usual engineering designs of the rest of the forts. It has three circular towers while the fourth one is a square for halls. Radiocarbon analysis estimates that the fort was constructed between 1500 and 1550, according to the Fujairah Tourism and Antiquities Authority. The fort was built using materials available in the area at that time such as rock, gravel, and clay stacked together using lime-based plaster.

FUJAIRAH COAST

Fujairah is the only emirate that is located completely on the eastern coast of the UAE along the Gulf of Oman. Due to its strategic position, it is the UAE's only access to the Indian Ocean. The shores of Fujairah extend along the Gulf of Oman for about 70km, from the city of Fujairah in the south to the town of Dibba in the far north.

FUJAIRAH INTERNATIONAL MARINE CLUB

Fujairah International Marine Club was established in 1999 under the Patronage of His Highness Sheikh Hamad Bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Fujairah, to honour, preserve and maintain their historical relationship with the sea for the present and the future as well as to host and organize some of the world's best maritime sports such as the Class One, The Formula One, Formula 2 and X-Cat World Powerboat Series. In addition to international events, it organizes national and local events such as UAE Jet Ski Championship, rowing races, and fishing competitions.

THE SHEIKH ZAYED MOSQUE IN FUJAIRAH

The Sheikh Zayed Mosque in Fujairah was built and opened for worship in 2015, with the first Eid prayer led by His Highness Sheikh Hamad Bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Fujairah. The mosque is also called the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque Fujairah and is now the main mosque in the emirate. It also holds the crown of being the second-largest mosque in the UAE, after the mosque of the same name – the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque in Abu Dhabi.

FUJAIRAH MUSEUM

Fujairah Museum Fujairah Museum is one of the most popular attractions in the emirate. Each year, from October to March, the museum hosts thousands of visitors every week, most of them being international tourists. And during the school year, Fujairah Museum also hosts school trips, small exhibitions and events.

MADHAB HOT SPRINGS PARK

Madhab Hot Springs Park Fujairah's Madhab Spring Park is one of the most popular tourist spots in the UAE. Located between the Indian Ocean and the Hajar Mountains, its mesmerizing beauty attracts a large number of tourists every day. There is also a wide range of activities you can enjoy at the Madhab Spring Park. However, swimming in the Ain Al-Madhab Hot Springs water is sure to be the highlight of your visit to this picturesque park.

BITHNAH FORT

Gracefully overlooking Ham wadi, which runs from Fujairah to Siji wadi

across the mountains, stands Al Bithna Fort, near the village of Al Bithnah. This castle is only 13 kilometres from the city of Fujairah and very close to the main road that links Fujairah to the rest of the UAE.

The construction of this castle goes back to 1735 and it consists of an enormous staunch edifice graced by two watch towers on the west side. Here visitors can enjoy the breath-taking picturesque views of the majestic mountain range and the fascinating palm orchards surrounding it.

FALAJ AL MUALLA FORT

Falaj Al Mualla Fort Located just 30kms off the centre of Umm Al Quwain city, Falaj Al Mualla is an old town built in the 19th century that is most well-known for its four iconic attractions, the fort and the three watchtowers. The fort was built in 1825.

DREAMLAND AQUA PARK

Located on the scenic coastline of Umm Al Quwain, Dreamland Aqua Park is one of the major tourist attractions and is the largest water park in the UAE. Covering about 250,000 square meters. The park features high-salinity pool, raft rides, wave pool, swimming pool, lazy river, several water slides, spa-like pool with a bar for relaxing.

Inaugurated on 12th June 1997, Dreamland Aqua Park was the vision of His Excellency Sheikh Abdullah Bin Rashid Al Mualla, Deputy ruler of His Highness Sheikh Rashid Bin Ahmed Al Mualla, member of the UAE Supreme Council and ruler of Umm Al Quwain Emirate, to create the first and largest water park in the region with a main concern - Fun is a right for everyone!

SUWAIDI PEARLS FARM

Taking a fascinating trip to the yesteryears, to a time when pearling was once the pillar of the country's economy, Abdullah Al Suwaidi, who set up the region's first cultured pearl farm in 2005 on the very waters that had produced the finest Arabian pearls coveted by royals, nobles and celebrities in distant lands.

The pearl farm is located on a sliver alongside the sea and the mountains that Al Rams nestles. Visitors learn about the history and techniques of pearl farming and try opening an oyster.

AL SINNIYAH ISLAND

Jazirat as Sitiyah The biggest island of several that lie east to the mainland of Umm Al Quwain. It is home to Arabian gazelles, falcons and turtles and features dense mangroves with sandy beaches. The island is especially meant for birdwatchers and nature enthusiasts since it hosts a wide variety of flora and fauna like the rare Socotra cormorants, flamingos, and seagulls.

UAQ NATIONAL MUSEUM

The UAQ National Museum is a renovated ancient fort that was used to guard the entrance to the old town. The museum houses several artifacts found at nearby archaeological sites.

Another excavated site, Al-Dur, was a coastal city with nearly 200 BCE until the third century CE. The site also contains several interesting artifacts that are housed in the UAQ National Museum.

UMM AL QUWAIN

Umm Al Quwain is the second smallest and the least populated emirate in the UAE. It covers an area of approximately 720 sq. km, which is equivalent to 1 per cent of the UAE's area. The emirate of Umm Al Quwain is built on a narrow peninsula called Khor Al Bidiyah.

The emirate has rich coastal mangroves on the coast of Arabian Gulf and many islands that lie to the east of the mainland. Umm Al Quwain provides facilities for numerous recreational activities; from sailing to skydiving. Traditional activities such as dhow building and sports such as falconry and camel racing are also popular in the emirate.

FALAJ ALMUALLA FORT

The fort was built in 1800 and was used as a summer residence by the inhabitants of the emirate. Located about half an hour away from the city it was restored and reopened in 2015 as a museum, showcasing ancient historical artifacts that depict the deep-rooted tradition and rich heritage of the Emirate of Umm Al Quwain.

AL LBSA CAMEL RACING TRACK

Is one of the most prominent camel racing tracks with historical importance in Umm Al Quwain and the UAE. It was established in the early eighties under the directives of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al

Nahyan, the site hosts annually the (Umm Al Quwain festival for arabian camels' races), sponsored by local authorities and private companies in the country, which records strong participation from camel owners.

UMM AL QUWAIN ZOO (KABER)

The first zoo in Umm Al Quwain is located in (Kaber) area and hosts a variety of species and rare types of animals. The zoo provides an opportunity for young visitors to enjoy and interact directly with several types of animals, such as talking to parrots or playing with and feeding monkeys.

UMM AL QUWAIN UNIVERSITY

The first educational institution in Umm Al Quwain, it was established under the patronage of H.H Sheikh Saud bin Rashid Al Mualla, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Umm Al Quwain, to be a scientific beacon from which the citizens and residents of the country can keep pace with the aspirations of the labor market and stimulate the faculty of innovation and creativity to be active contributors to rapid developments in science and technology.

ED-DOUR ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE

Is one of the largest local settlements on the coast of Umm Al Quwain during the Roman period. It covers around 2 square kilometers and flourished during the late first century BC to the third century AD. The site was considered a commercial port where it was the main stopping point for commercial trips between south Mesopotamia, Persia, and India, and it was mentioned in the Greek and Roman sources that it might be the port of "Omana". Ed-Dour Archaeological Site includes many distinct archaeological buildings like the Temple of the Sun God, the defense fort, and a number of stone buildings, as well as collective and individual tombs.

Temple of the Sun God (Ed-Dour temple) was discovered in 1987 and described as the temple of early Semitic Sun God Shamsh, based on the rectangular basin which was unearthed with an Aramaic inscription of nine lines with the sole obvious word "sun", it is assumed that the temple was dedicated to worshipping the sun god. The temple features a semi-square-shaped building with two entrances - the largest one on the east and the second on the west side. Outside the temple, there are four altars built of local beach rocks.

UMM AL QUWAIN MANGROVE RESERVED

The first marine and coastal environmental conservation reserve in Umm Al Quwain, it is part of the Sustainable Blue Economy 2031 strategic projects. This sanctuary is a haven brimming with diverse marine creatures and birds in the emirate. Nature enthusiasts can escape the city's hustle and bustle to the Mangrove Beach within the reserve to enjoy the scenic views of mangroves and amazing wildlife like turtles and the melancholic Malayem. Visitors can also capture beautiful photographs of the natural wonders.

This unique destination offers various activities, including kayaking, one of the most popular recreational activities on the beach. Visitors can enjoy the tranquillity of paddling through the waters and witness the mangrove tree line. They can also engage in biking and camping to spend quality time with family and friends.

The recently opened Casa Mikoko chalets project is one of the prominent tourist projects within the reserve. It reflects the department's efforts to enhance its strategic goals towards promoting eco-tourism in Umm Al Quwain. The project features a café with panoramic views of the mangrove trees and a collection of eco-friendly cabins with accommodation options providing stunning views of the Arabian Gulf.

UMM AL QUWAIN FORT

This fort was built in the 18th century under the directives of the late Sheikh Rashid bin Majid Al Mualla, as a center of governance and a residence for the ruling family. In 2000, it was restored and transformed into a national museum showcasing the heritage and culture of the Emirate of Umm Al Quwain. Visitors can know about and learn the history of the emirate and the ruling family.

AL KHOR WATERFRONT

This project was inaugurated in the last quarter of 2023. It is a commercial tourism project featuring a 2-kilometer-long promenade, designated areas for children, sports facilities, a 1.6-kilometer running track, and areas dedicated to skating enthusiasts. Additionally, it includes an open-air theater for artistic performances and events. The project also boasts numerous facilities such as shops, cafes, and both mobile and permanent restaurants. Visitors will be able to enjoy scenic views of Umm Al Quwain Creek, islands, and mangrove trees along the waterfront.

AL JAHILI FORT

Al Jahili Fort is one of the UAE's most historic buildings. It was erected in 1891 to defend the city and protect precious palm groves. The former headquarters of the Oman Trucial Scouts, the force that protected the mountain passes and kept inter-tribal peace, it also served as a residence for the local governor. It is set in beautifully landscaped gardens, and visitors are encouraged to explore it.

AL AIN OASIS

In the heart of the city, the Al Ain Oasis has been opened as the UAE's first curated UNESCO World Heritage site visitor experience. Spread over 1,200 hectares (nearly 3,000 acres) and containing more than 147,000 date palms of up to 100 different varieties, this impressive oasis is filled with palm plantations, many of which are still working farms. The cool, shady walkways transport you from the heat and noise of the city to a tranquil haven; all you will hear is birdsong and the rustle of the palm fronds. The site introduces visitors to the delicate oasis eco-system and the importance it has played in the development of the emirate. The oasis landscape of Al Ain is shaped by a complex shared water supply based on both wells and 'aflaj', the UAE's traditional irrigation system. Al Ain Oasis has plenty of working examples of the falaj which have been used for centuries to tap into underground wells.

AL AIN PALACE MUSEUM

Located on the western edge of Al Ain Oasis, the Palace of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan was built in 1937. It was converted into a museum in 1998 and opened to the public in 2001. The original structure comprised a private residence for the ruler and his family within a complex of courtyards. The architectural design and construction of Al Ain Palace is typical of historical buildings of the UAE. It features the characteristic ventilation structures that are designed to keep the buildings cool in the

summer. Locally sourced and environmentally friendly building materials were used, including clay, adobe and plaster stones, as well as palm tree elements for roofing rooms, ceilings, doors and windows. The use of teak was later introduced in the renovation of the buildings.

SOUQ AL QATTARA

Dating back to the mid-20th century and founded by the late Sheikh Shakhbut bin Sultan Al Nahyan on the palm-lined road linking Al Ain's Al Qattara and Al Jimi oases, the historic Souq Al Qattara has been renovated and re-opened. A traditional handicrafts market takes place here every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from October to May, encouraging local families to preserve and promote Abu Dhabi's heritage through an active involvement in traditional craft production. The Souq is linked to the redeveloped Al Qattara Fort, now home to a popular arts center, featuring hundreds of modern exhibits, workshops, a café and a library.

AL QATTARA ARTS CENTRE

What was originally the Al Qattara Fort is today the Al Qattara Arts Centre. This traditional mud-brick tower and house is located on a mound overlooking the date-palm gardens of Qattara Oasis, which it was originally built to protect. Showcasing carefully restored traditional local architecture, the centre aims to provide a family-friendly venue where arts and culture can be studied, practiced, and developed by the entire UAE community and visiting travellers.

HAZZA BIN ZAYED STADIUM

The home of Al Ain FC, this 25,000-seat stadium is one of Al Ain's tallest buildings and a recognizable landmark. The outer façade design of this stadium is inspired by a palm tree trunk, an integral part of the UAE's heritage and culture. The stadium is part of a wider project, constructed in phases, which will ultimately include residential, commercial, and entertainment areas, as well as a luxury hotel and sports facilities.

UAE UNIVERSITY

United Arab Emirates University is the oldest university in the United Arab Emirates. It was established in 1976. The UAEU is an accredited research-based institution. Its alumni have provided the United Arab Emirates with ministers, diplomats, senior government officials, and business leaders. <https://www.uaeu.ac.ae/ar/>

SHEIKH KHALIFA BIN ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE

The Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Grand Mosque, also known as Al Ain Grand Mosque, will be able to accommodate 20,000 worshippers. It is composed of a basement level and ground floor and will also include a 160-meter-wide dome that will cover the main prayer hall and four 60-metre-tall minarets. The complex will also include other buildings for classrooms and offices, as well as underground parking.

AL AIN ZOO

This 900-hectare park near the base of Jebel Hafeet is where visitors can see a large animal collection in enclosures that closely resemble their natural habitats. There are plenty of green public spaces for picnics and playgrounds, a cafeteria, and a train tour of the wildlife area.

The Al Ain Zoo is home to over 4,000 animals, with at least 30% of its 180 species considered endangered. Conservation efforts have been strengthened by partnerships with San Diego Zoo, the Fairchild Tropical Botanical Garden in Miami, and the World Association of Zoos & Aquariums.

GREEN MUBAZZARAH

Strategically located at the feet of the Jebel Hafeet Mountains, Green Mubazzarah is home to a number of spending Chalets that make a great retreat away from the noise of the metropolis providing guests with a deluxe lodging and intimate access to the great outdoors.

Green Mubazzarah occupies part of the rocky mountain side and been landscaped with rolling grassy hillsides alongside streams, hot springs and waterfalls. Green Mubazzarah Chalets is less than a 40 minute-drive from Al Ain International Airport and 15 minute-drive from Wadi Adventure.

JEBEL HAFEET

Rising 1,240 meters, Jebel Hafeet is the emirate's highest peak, and the UAE's second. This towering rocky mountain, which stands guard over Al Ain and borders Oman, is forged out of craggy limestone that has been weathered over millions of years. Significant fossil discoveries have been made in the area, which are vital pieces in the jigsaw on the city's ancient history. Over 500 ancient burial tombs dating back 5,000 years have been found in the Jebel Hafeet foothills. Once you reach the top, you'll be rewarded with magnificent views over Al Ain.

QASR AL MUWAIJI

For more than 100 years, this incredible historic fort has played a major role in the history of the United Arab Emirates. The Qasr Al Muwaiji fort was built in the early 20th century to protect and watch over the oasis, and is a great place to take photos today.

The simple yet impressive square enclosure features a grand entrance gate and protruding corner towers. Over the years, Qasr Al Muwaiji has been used as a home for the ruling family, a place for the community to gather, and as a seat of governance.

HILI ARCHAEOLOGICAL PARK

If history fascinates you, then you'll want to add Hili Archaeological Park to your itinerary. Now a modern park where you're able to picnic and go for peaceful walks, this UNESCO World Heritage site dates back to the Bronze Age and includes evidence of settlements dating back to about 2000 BCE, with ancient tombs.

Also visit the nearby Hili 8 where, in 1977, French archaeologists began excavating and found the remains of barley, wheat, and date palm as well as bronze objects, pottery, and livestock. Today, you'll find ancient tombs, built with the utmost care, and exposed building foundations.

BAIT MOHAMMED BIN KHALIFA

A unique cultural destination within a beautifully restored historic home, now a community space for all.

AL MURABBA POLICE MUSEUM

A museum in Al Ain, Emirate of Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, that explores the heritage of the police force in the UAE.

There are a number of items in its gallery that showcase the equipment and effects of the different police forces that have existed throughout history, as well as a variety of information describing and explaining them.

AIN AL FAYDA

To the first 60 Riders on the final General Classification will be awarded the following points: 300, 250, 215, 175, 120, 115, 95, 75, 60, 50, 40, 35, 30, 25, from 15th to 20th 20, from 21st to 30th 12, from 31st to 50th 5, from 51st to 55th 2, from 56th to 60th 1.

Stage Classification

The top ten finishers of each stage will be awarded the following points: 40, 25, 20, 15, 10, 6, 5, 3, 2, 1.

Wearing the race leader’s jersey: 6 per stage

ART. 3 – ENROLLMENT

According to Article 2.1.005 and 2.1.007 bis of the UCI regulations, the race is reserved to: UCI WorldTeams - UCI Pro Teams - National Team of the host country. In compliance with Article 2.2.003 of the UCI Regulations, the number of Riders per team shall be 7 (seven).

In any case, the Organization, so as to safeguard the image and the reputation of its race, reserves the right to reject, up to the start, the Riders or the Teams which, by their acts or statements, would prove to neglect the principles of sport fair play and the undertaken commitments as set forth in Article 1.1.023 of the UCI regulations.

Furthermore, in the event the Riders or the Team should fail during the race in complying with the principles set out in the foregoing paragraph, the Organization shall also reserve the right to expel them from the race at any time, in compliance with the Article 2.2.010 bis.

ART. 4 – GENERAL PROVISIONS

The subjects listed hereunder are liable for the enforcement of the present regulations and – for all that is not regulated under the present ruling – of the current regulations issued by the International Cycling Union:

- the titular race Riders;
- the Sports Directors and the Teams’ staff;
- all the Race’s followers duly accredited by the Organizers in a recognized and acknowledged official position.

Only the persons notified upon getting the identification badge by the owners of the authorized vehicles are entitled to follow the race. Each and every change or addition shall be notified to the Organization Manager. The cars and motorcycles’ drivers shall comply

not only with the enforced rules of the Highway Code, but also with the provisions issued by the Organization Manager and his staff. Persons without any function acknowledged by the Organizers or relevant to the race's services as well as under-aged persons are not allowed to follow the race.

In the event of non-compliance about "the circulation during the race" will apply to the articles of the Part 2 Road Races, Chapter 2, paragraph 4, UCI regulations.

The Organizing Society shall not be accountable for any damage caused by accidents or incidents before, during and after the race to spectators or people in general, even if not involved in the race itself, because of actions that have not been performed by the Organization itself.

For all that is not regulated under the present ruling, the regulations issued by the UCI are enforced.

ART. 5 - RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF RIDERS

All registered Riders have the right, in compliance with the regulations in force, to compete in all the classifications – i.e. stage classification, general and special classifications – inscribed in the race program.

They are required to maintain a responsible race behavior and to refrain from promoting or supporting any mass demonstration susceptible to assume the character of either fraudulent agreements prejudicing other Competitors, or to appear as a protest against the Organizing Society or the Commissaires' Panel or other official followers whatsoever.

Moreover, the titular Riders are requested:

A) to carry a frame number and two body numbers duly provided by the Organization. These numbers cannot be modified as far as their size is concerned. During time trial stage only one identification number will be required. (Articles.1.3.076/077)

B) to carry on all the stages including the ITT a transponder supplied by the Organization and to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle, for the automatic reading of their passage position on the finish line and in some other segments determined by the Organization. However, the crossing of the finish line will be the final reference for the stage classification.

Failure in complying with such obligation shall be considered as an infringement equivalent to the absence of body number and consequently punished in accordance with UCI Table 2.12.007/3.5.3

C) to wear the jersey corresponding to their relevant team as well as the World Championship or National Championship jerseys; in order of priority in compliance of the Article 1.3.071.

D) the leaders of the General Classification, the Points Classification, the Best Young Rider Classification, the Intermediate Sprints Classification, shall respectively wear the Red jersey, the Green jersey, the White jersey, the Black jersey, all of them duly provided by the Organizing Society. This order also features the priority between the different leader's distinctive jerseys, so that in the case a Rider should be leading more than one classification, he would wear the distinctive jersey having a priority in the

REGULATIONS

above-mentioned order. The remaining jerseys would be put on, at an honorific title, by the next following Riders in the ranking of the respective classifications, provided that they are not already entitled to a different classification (Article 2.6.018).

The jersey-holder is required to wear his distinctive garment beginning from the signature procedure until to the prize-giving ceremony and during any possible press conference;

E) to refrain from answering to interviews during the race.

F) to quickly leave the left side (or right only if safer) of the road free for motorcycles and vehicles authorized to overtake the peloton;

G) in case of drop-out in the course of the race, to remit the body number to a Commissaire or to the "Broom wagon".

H) to refrain – after having crossed the finish line – from crossing the line a second time while still wearing his body number, and thus until the finish judge or the finish Commissaire in charge authorize the crossing (UCI Table 2.12.007/1.6)

I) The General Classification leader and the stage winner shall show up at the press room or the for a press conference with the accredited journalists (Article 2.2.082).

J) to undergo the Anti-Doping procedure, the convened Riders shall go to the premises indicated by the Organizer.

K) to behave appropriately with a respectable behavior in line with the local tradition and regulations, using all the carefulness necessary. For example, riders shall use structures that the organizer will provide like changing rooms and bathrooms in all start and finish areas.

To pay particular attention to the environment while disposing of trash and empty bottles.

ART. 6 – RACE HEADQUARTERS

The official accreditations and preliminary operations will take place in Abu Dhabi on the premises of Radisson Blu Hotel - YAS Island – YAS Plaza from 14:00 to 18:00 on Saturday 17th and from 10:00 to 18:00 on Sunday 18th February 2024.

The confirmation of the starting Riders and the collection of the race numbers by the Sports Directors is set at the Race Headquarters on February 17th from 15:00 to 15:45, subsequently at 16:00 at the Race Headquarters is due to take place the Meeting with the Organization Management, the Commissaires Panel, the Sports Directors and with the presence of UCI Technical Delegate, according to the provisions set out in Articles 1.2.087-88/2.2.093 of the UCI regulations.

At 10:30 - The Race Director with the President of Commissaires'Panel will hold "Race security briefing" for all Drivers, cars and motorcycles, which will be involved in the race convoy, for a Representative of the television production and for a Representative of the Highway Police, see Article 2.2.034 bis of the UCI regulations.

ART. 7 – PRELIMINARY OPERATIONS AT THE START

For each stage Riders shall assemble at the place mentioned in the Technical Guide. As far as road race stages are concerned, the presence of the Riders at the Podium where the starting sheet is to be signed is duly requested (Article 2.3.009). Then, Riders will gather for the group transfert towards the actual start place.

In addition, for all stages, the Organizer will set the team order for team presentation and to sign the starting sheet. This order list will be communicated the day before with the official communication.

ART. 8 - TOP-RIDERS PHOTOSHOOTING AND TEAM PRESENTATION

The organizer may will Top-Riders photoshooting and their press conference, Organization will communicate the list of riders needed a week before. Teams will make available the Top-Riders requested with the support of team press officer.

All the Teams, with all their Riders and two Team Managers and/or Sports Directors shall take part in the opening and teams presentation ceremony in case it will be organized.

ART. 9 – RADIO INFORMATION

Race news will be broadcasted on the frequency VHF 149.850 MHz. Organizers will provide the radio for every car in the race and to all vehicles or person shall need it.

ART. 10 – TIMEKEEPING

The Timekeepers Service, with the assistance of the finish judge, will be in charge of recording the official time. The service will be guarantee by EMG Italy SpA. Riders will be provided with a trasponder, for the automatic reading of their time, to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle compulsarily.

ART. 11 – TIME BONUSES

Time Bonus valid for the General Individual Classification are envisaged in each stage except the time trial stage. According to the Article 2.6.019 UCI regulations, the time bonuses will be as follows:

- for each Intermediate sprint the time bonuses for the first three riders crossing the line will be respectively 3", 2" and 1"
- upon finishing each stage respectively 10", 6" and 4" time bonuses will be assigned to the first three riders crossing the line.

ART. 12 SIGNPOSTS

The Organizing Society shall place the necessary signposts along the race route.

REGULATIONS

For each stage, detailed information about safety and about the road's situation will be provided in the "Daily Race Communiqués", as well as any fixed areas of feeding if any. (Articles 2.2.015/1.2.064).

ART. 13 – GREEN ZONES

The Green zones will be signposted along the race route and communicated daily on the race official communications on route maps and in the time schedules as well as. Organization is committed to collect all the waste referred to the race and invites all the suiveurs to behave in way respectful of environment safeguard.

ART. 14 – TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The technical assistance service is provided for by 3 vehicles of the SHIMANO company.

ART. 15 – MEDICAL SERVICE

The Medical Service appointed by the Race Manager, is provided by an adequate number of Doctors and Paramedics; the service is operative during the race and available before the start and after the finish of the race. In case of need, following ambulances coordinated by the race Doctors will take the Riders to the hospitals mentioned in the Technical Guide.

ART. 16 – STAGE FINISHES

Stage finishes shall be announced in advance by a red triangle located one kilometer from the finish line and by an arch in coincidence with the time keeping and photo finish line.

It is mandatory for all vehicles to perform a detour from the race route where indicated by the Organizer, in order not to cross the finish line, exception for the Race Management, the Commissaires' Panel and the official Doctor vehicles.

In the case of a crash, puncture or mechanical incident beyond the signpost indicating the finish within three kilometres, the rider(s) affected shall be credited with the time of the group in whose company he was (they were) when the accident occurred, in compliance with Articles 2.6.027/2.6.028 of the UCI Regulations.

The rule does not apply to stages featuring a summit finish (3rd and 7th). For all that is not regulated under this ruling, the irrevocable decision taken by the Commissaires' Panel in consultation with the Organization Management shall apply.

The "Protocol for stages expected to finish in bunch sprints" will be enforced in stages 1, 4, 5 and 6 for calculating time gaps.

REGULATIONS

ART. 17 – INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL STAGE

The Riders shall use bicycles complying with the parameters and measures set up by the UCI Regulations.

On the start line, the Riders will be held by personnel appointed by the Race Direction. Each Rider will be escorted by one motorbike, in front, and by one car. The car shall follow at least 25 meters behind the Riders and shall never draw up level with him. (Articles 2.4.023/024/025).

The Riders will start in reverse order of the general individual classification by time of the previous stage, the Race Director, by common consent with the Chief Commissaire, is empowered to adopt changes on the start list, agreed upon the teams' manager meeting.

Riders shall set off at identical intervals of 1' to 3', the Race Director, by common consent with the Chief Commissaire, is empowered to adopt different intervals as far as the last 15 Riders to set off are concerned.

In order to help the teams in assisting the riders in the time trial, the Race Direction, in agreement with the Jury panel, establishes that the starting order will be drawn up as follows:

- The reverse order of the individual general classification after the first stage will not be followed, but one rider per team will start every 19' as if it were the first stage, except for the classification leader who will start last.
- Each team will indicate the starting order of its athletes in the form which will be given to teams at the technical meeting.
- The succession of starts (with regard to the teams) will be established taking into account the general classification at the end of the second stage.

ART. 18 – FINISHING TIME LIMIT

In order to determine the finishing time limit, the stages have been divided into three categories depending on the different nature of their route:

- **A category:** stages presenting no particular difficulty (Stage 1, 4, 5 and 6)
- **B category:** stages presenting difficulty (Stage 3 and 7)
- **C category:** Time Trial (stage 2)

Consequently, the time limit has been set out as follows:

- **for the A category the winner's time plus:**
 - 8% if the average speed is less than or equal to 40 Km/h.
 - 9% if the average speed is between 40 and 45 Km/h
 - 11% if the average speed is over 45 Km/h

- **for the B category the winner's time plus:**

- 15% if the average speed is less than or equal to 37 km/h

- 16% if the average speed is between 37 and 41 km/h

- 17% if the average speed is over 41 km/h

- **for the C category the winner's time plus 30%**

According to Article 2.6.032 of the UCI regulations, in case of exceptional circumstances, confirmed accidents or incidents, the Commissaires Panel, after consultation with the Organization Manager, may readmit in the race any Rider finishing in a time exceeding the time limit, by increasing the latter by a maximum of 30% of the time set out in this article. The time limit, established on the basis of the winner's time expressed in minute seconds, shall be further rounded off to the successive superior minute.

In case, for those Riders readmitted, all points awarded in the general classification of the various secondary classifications shall be withdrawn.

ART. 19 – PENALTIES

Infringements will be sanctioned according to UCI Rules and to the “Table of race incidents” (2.12.007).

ART. 20 – PRIZE-GIVING PROTOCOL

After every stage finish, the stage winner, the leader of the General Classification who receives the red jersey, the leader of the General Classification by Points who receives the green jersey, the leader of the Best Young Rider Classification who receives the white jersey and the leader of the Intermediate Sprints Classification who receives the black jersey shall attend the prize-giving ceremony. Moreover, the stage winner and the leader of the General Classification shall participate in the press conference for the accredited journalists. (Articles 1.2.112/113 and 2.6.018 bis).

ART. 21 – ANTI-DOPING

Antidoping Control will be made on the dedicated premises by the finish area.

The Doping Control Officer (DCO) appointed by the ITA and acting on behalf of UCI will enforce the UCI Regulations, in compliance with the ITA's instructions and procedures, in accordance with Chapter 14 of the UCI ADR-TIR (Testing Investigation Rules) and with the relevant Law in force of the hosting country.

ART. 22 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY TIME

The Leader of the General Individual Classification will wear the Red jersey.

In compliance with the provisions set out in Article 2.6.014 of the UCI regulations, the General Individual Classification is established by adding together the times achieved by each rider in each stage. Time bonuses and penalties are considered for this classification. In the event of a tie in the General Individual Classification the first discriminating criteria is given by the fraction of seconds recorded in the ITT, the second is given by the lower sum of the placing obtained in each stage, as a last resort, the place obtained in the final stage is counted (Article 2.6.015).

ART. 23 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY POINTS

The sum of the points will determine an individual ranking and every day its Leader will wear the Green jersey. The individual points ranking is obtained by adding together the points recorded in each of the seven stages and the sum of the points assigned in all the Intermediate Sprints.

At each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

1st	8 points
2nd	5 points
3rd	3 points
4th	1 point

At each finish of the seven stages points are awarded as follows:

1st	20 points
2nd	16 points
3rd	12 points
4th	9 points
5th	7 points
6th	5 points
7th	4 points
8th	3 points
9th	2 points
10th	1 point

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.6.017 of the UCI regulations, in the event of a tie in the General Classification by Points the following criteria will be applied:

- 1.** Number of stage victories
- 2.** Number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- 3.** General Individual Classification by time

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

REGULATIONS

ART. 24 – BEST YOUNG RIDER

The Best Young Classification is reserved to Riders born after 1st January 1999 and is determined by the General individual Classification. The Leader will wear the White jersey.

ART. 25 – “INTERMEDIATE SPRINT JERSEY” CLASSIFICATION

A special Intermediate Sprint Classification has been set up, at each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

1st	8 points
2nd	5 points
3rd	3 points
4rd	1 points

The general ranking is established by the sum of the points obtained; the Leader of the Intermediate Sprint Classification shall wear the Black jersey.

In the event of a tie in the Intermediate Sprint general classification, the following discriminating criteria will be applied:

- number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- general individual classification by time

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 26 – TEAM CLASSIFICATION

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.06.016 of the UCI regulations, the team classification is established on the basis of the sum of the three best individual times from each team. In the event of a tie the teams shall be separated by the sum of the places acquired by their three best times in the stage. If the teams are still tied, they shall be separated by the placing of their best rider on the stage classification. The team general classification shall be calculated on the basis of the three best individual times from each team in each stage ridden.

In the event of a tie the following criteria shall be applied in order until the teams are separated:

- number of first places in the daily team classifications;
- number of second places in the daily team classifications;
- etc.

If there is still a draw, the teams shall be separated by the placing of their best rider in the general individual classification. Any team reduced to fewer than three riders shall be eliminated from the general team classification.

ART. 27 – RACE MANAGEMENT

The UAE Tour race will be managed in compliance with the UCI regulations through the UCI Commissaires appointed according to the art. 1.1.070 and in collaboration with the RCS Sports technical race management coordinated by the race director Mauro Vegni (tel. +390225848766).

ART. 28 – REGULAR AND SPECIAL PRIZES

The UAE Tour offers the following regular and special prizes:
