The whole of Zurich will be getting on their bikes in 2024. The 2024 UCI Road and Para-cycling Road World Championships will make history from 21-29 September this year. 66 times the winners will be able to put on the coveted rainbow jersey, cheered on by tens of thousands of fans from Switzerland and abroad.

The first-time integration of the para-cycling competitions into the Road World Championships for regular athletes will allow para-cyclists and non-para cyclists to ride some of the same routes and cross the same finish line. Individual time trials, team competitions and finally the elite road races will bring the UCI Road and Para-cycling Road World Championships to the people and the thrilling finale at Sechseläutenplatz in Zurich. On behalf of its governing bodies, the Canton and the City of Zurich, and in close cooperation with UCI, the Local Organising Committee is pleased to provide you with detailed information on this global cycling event. The finalised race programme with the start times, the exact race routes with the corresponding GPX files as well as numerous other pertinent details on formalities and procedures will allow all participants to thoroughly prepare for this great rendez-vous of international road cycling.











WELCOME TO THE HOST REGION OF ZURICH!

The city and region of Zurich combine world-class nature, culture and cuisine in a very small area. Know-how, the outstanding infrastructure and excellent international connections are just some of the other advantages. After 1923, 1929 and 1946, the Host Region Zürich is pleased to write (cycling) history once again and extends a warm welcome to the cycling world!

ZURICH

With its proximity to the nearby forests and mountains, Zurich is a true Eldorado for cycling fans.

It is worth planning a few extra days, as Switzerland's largest city has much to offer. Situated on the picturesque Lake Zurich and washed by the two rivers Sihl and Limmat, Zurich has a magnificent old town that impresses with its historic guild houses and invites you to stroll through its winding alleys and hidden oases. Art and culture are very important: No other city in Switzerland can boast such a high density of museums and galleries as the capital of design and architecture.

Those who stay longer explore the varied region around Lake Zurich in an active way. Whether on foot, on two or more wheels or in the water: every sport is possible. Cycling enthusiasts in particular get their money's worth: exciting downhill trails await on the Uetliberg, the beautiful Route 66 leads from Zurich to the City of Roses Rapperswil with lovely views, and in the nearby mountains there are varied bike routes over hills and through forests.

The "Offene Rennbahn" is the oldest sports arena in Switzerland that is still in operation today. This is where the Men Elite riders will start their individual time trial. The Sechseläutenplatz will not only be the finish of all races. Due to the required course profiles, the races of the para-athletes as well as the time trials of the juniors women and junior men and the mixed relays will also start at this area.







WINTERTHUR

Often overlooked, Winterthur appears surprisingly relaxed, personal and almost familiar. This city with its industrial past is surprisingly green and its 120,000 residents are committed to sustainability. Year after year, Winterthur is voted the most bicycle-friendly major city in Switzerland.

The picturesque old town has a friendly character that reminds you of a village and invites you with its hidden alleys to immerse yourself. A true treasure trove of art and culture, Winterthur offers magnificent parks as well as a variety of museums.

The region is also worth a visit. An excursion to the Rhine Falls, the largest waterfall in Europe, or a discovery tour to Kyburg Castle, where the first steep ascent will await the Men Elite in their road race, provide for great outdoor activities. The starting point of said race that will conclude the 2024 UCI Road and Para-cycling Road World Championships on Sunday, 29 September, is located at the square in front of the Sulzer skyscraper, a landmark of the city.

USTER

Uster combines urban living with a rich history and generous green spaces. The city's history is closely linked to the element of water. Thanks to hydroelectric power, the city developed into a stronghold of the textile industry with one of the highest factory densities in Europe.

Today, Uster offers everything that people and businesses need within short distances. The nearby Greifensee and the surrounding forests are attractive local recreation areas. The region around Uster, the Zurich Oberland, offers many opportunities for leisure activities. All excursion destinations can be reached by foot, by bike or by public transport.

Four road races will start in Uster: Women Junior, Men Junior, Men U23 and Women Elite. The starting point is on Zürichstrasse near the Pünt area.

GOSSAU ZH

Gossau in the canton of Zurich is a diverse municipality with an exciting past and a promising future. Gossau and its "Wachten" (similar to small boroughs) Bertschikon, Grüt, Ottikon, Herschmettlen and Gossau-Dorf are located in the Zurich Oberland, nestled in a wonderful landscape of wooded hills and moor-covered depressions. The transport links and residential quality make the municipality an interesting location for industry, commerce and service providers. Despite the rural surroundings, the cities of Zurich, Winterthur, Rapperswil and the international airport in Kloten can be reached in 20 to 30 minutes by car.

Gossau will be the epicentre of various time trials. From there, the non-para and paracyclists will start their races against the clock: Women Elite, U23 Men as well as various para-cycling sport classes for men and women.





HOW TO REACH REGION INFORMATIONS





The Host City Region Zurich offers the huge advantage that distances are short. The UCI Road and Para-cycling Road World Championships perimeters in Zurich and the start locations Winterthur, Uster and Gossau ZH are all easily reachable.



By plane

With around 350 rail connections and over 700 bus and 400 streetcar departures a day, you can get from <u>Zurich Airport</u> to all the major cities and tourist regions in no time at all. As Zurich Airport has its own train station, you can transfer directly from the plane onto a train. The trip into the city center takes just 10 minutes.



By train

By night train from Amsterdam, Hamburg, Vienna, or Milan: Zurich is easily accessible from cities all over Europe thanks to excellent train connections. Also during the day, Zurich can be reached within:

- 4 h from Paris Gare de Lyon
- 3:15 h from Milano Centrale
- 8 h from Vienna Central Station
- 8 h from Amsterdam-Centraal
- 8:30 h from Hamburg Hbf
- 8:45 h from Berlin Hbf

By bus

Various long-distance bus service providers serve the Zurich Bus Station. Whether from Croatia, Poland and Spain, France or Belgium, good connections mean easy arrivals.

Diverse bus companies offer bus trips to Zurich. With for example <u>Flixbus</u> or BlaBlaCar you travel relaxed and cheaply from Frankfurt, Munich, Hamburg, Stuttgart, Milan, Turin, Rome, Vienna, Paris, Prague and other cities to Zurich. Once at the Zurich bus station, the Old Town, the Main Train Station, the famous Bahnhofstrasse and the city center, including the perimeter around Sechseläutenplatz, are all within walking distance.



By car

Thanks to Switzerland's well-developed national road network, Zurich is easily reached from other large Swiss cities and neighboring countries in a short time by car.

The speed limit on Swiss motorways is 120km/h, and that of urban motorways between 60 and 100 km/h. There is a toll to pay for the use of most motorways. The motorway toll, Vignette, comes in the form of a badge and costs CHF 40 per year and vehicle. The motorway Vignette is available for purchase at post offices, petrol stations or as an E-vignette online: www.e-vignette.ch.



VISA PROCESS

You may enter Switzerland, a member of the Schengen cooperation, for a stay of up to 90 days within a period of 180 days without a visa if you are a citizen of the European Union (EU) or the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and in possession of a valid recognised identity document.

If you are not a citizen of Switzerland or of a country in the EU or EFTA, the conditions for entry to Switzerland will vary in relation to your nationality. The website of the Swiss Government state secretariat for migration will inform you whether or not you require a visa to enter Switzerland and on the travel documents that are recognised. In case you need a visa, you can find the visa application form here.

*Please check that your passport is valid for at least 3 months after your return date and was issued within the last 10 years before your entry date into the Schengen Area. If not, please ensure to renew it before applying for a visa.

RADIO FREQUENCY WIRELESS CAMERAS AND SATELLITES INFORMATION

All cycling teams, broadcasters, press and others must apply for a temporary license to use radio equipment, wireless cameras and satellites during the 2024 UCI Road and Para-Cycling Road World Championships Zurich by submitting a form with equipment information no later than 15th August 2024 by mail to kf-fk@bakom.admin.ch.

VEHICLES ALLOCATED TO NATIONAL FEDERATIONS

A limited supply of team cars will be provided to the National Federations by the organizer and its vehicle partner. These cars will be assigned to the top-ranked National Federations according to the number of riders in their delegation. Information on the allocation of these vehicles to the National Federations, the location of the collection of the vehicles, deposit will be detailed in the Technical Guide of the 2024 UCI Road and Para-Cycling Road World Championships which will be published mid-August.

All drivers representing National Federations in the race convoy at UCI Road and Para Cycling World Championships must have a UCI License issued by a National Federation and are obliged to respect the UCI Regulations as well as the current guidelines for vehicle circulation. The UCI License must include the necessary third-party liability insurance in case of material damage or injury to others, which must be valid in all countries where the license-holder is likely to perform his/her duties.

Drivers are required to have an in-depth knowledge of cycle racing and its regulations as well as experience and ability to anticipate a wide range of race situations. It is the National Federations' responsibility to ensure that their drivers have the necessary experience to drive in the race convoy at the UCI Road and Para-Cycling Road World Championships.

Drivers are responsible for the manner in which they drive; if they fail to observe the regulations, they face significant financial penalties as well as the suspension of their UCI License (as a driver and any other role they may have). The sanctions related to driving in the race convoy are defined by Articles 2.2.038 and subsequent of the UCI Regulations.

To drive an official vehicle in Switzerland it is mandatory to either have a driving license in the language of German, French or Italian or otherwise have an international driving license. An identity card or passport by the National Federation have to be provided as well. CUSTOMS DUTY

<u>The ATA Carnet</u> is an international customs document. National Federations, sponsors, suppliers and other client groups are responsible for arranging their own freight movements to and from Switzerland.

It is used for the temporary importation, exportation and transit of goods. The customs formalities for Switzerland and foreign countries can be completed with this customs document. When crossing the border, you do not need to request a national customs document, nor do you need to provide the customs authorities with a surety.

ATA Carnets can be obtained from chambers of commerce and industry. Security for the applicable import duties is provided to the issuing body. A Carnet is valid for one year.

The ATA Carnet can be used for multiple border crossings. The holder of the ATA Carnet always has the possibility of taking all or only some of the goods out of Switzerland or bringing all or only some of these back into Switzerland.

You can use the ATA Carnet primarily for:

- Goods that you wish to present at an official exhibition.
- Commercial samples for display purposes or taking orders (watches, clothes, shoes etc.).
- Professional equipment

However, these application areas are interpreted differently in the individual countries. In case of doubt, contact the local customs authorities directly.

Sunday and night travel for vehicle over 3.5 tonnes

In Switzerland, there is a general ban on driving on Sundays and at night (22:00 - 05:00) for vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of more than 3.5 tonnes, as well as for articulated vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of more than 5 tonnes and for vehicles carrying a trailer with a gross vehicle weight of more than 3.5 tonnes.

If travelling on a Sunday or at night cannot be avoided under any circumstances, a <u>special permit</u> can be applied for. The Canton (region) where the vehicle is registered or where the journey requiring authorisation is to begin is responsible for this. For journeys from abroad to Switzerland, the Canton of entry is responsible.
