

Vehicles

Two vehicles are made available to each team (one on-course and one off-course vehicle) for the duration of their stay.

VEHICLE AND EQUIPMENT PICKUP

The off-course vehicle must be picked up on Tuesday, September 9 at the Montréal airport by two team members - details will be communicated by the Permanence. The on-course vehicle will be available for pickup starting at 4:00 p.m. at the Delta Québec (salle Buade).

Upon pickup of the keys:

- The vehicles will be inspected;
- Equipment provided by the organizer (coolers and roof light) will be inside the vehicle;
- The vehicle will be delivered with a full tank of gas;
- The on-course vehicle will be equipped with a rack that can hold up to 5 full bikes.

OUTDOOR PARKING - DELTA QUÉBEC

An outdoor space at the hotel is reserved for the Grand Prix Cycliste de Québec. Parking the oncourse vehicle in the indoor parking garage is strictly forbidden, as it is too tall.

INDOOR PARKING - DELTA MONTRÉAL

An indoor space at the hotel is reserved for the Grand Prix Cycliste de Montréal.

RETURN OF VEHICLES

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, AM

Vehicles must be parked at the Delta Montréal. The car stickers will be removed.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, PM

Two people per team must return the vehicles to the rental agency's service centre near the Montréal airport. The vehicles will be inspected and must be returned with a full tank of gas. The organizer will recover the loaned equipment (coolers and roof light).

A shuttle will be available to take the drivers to the airport.

The detailed process of this operation will be transmitted in future correspondence.

FEES

In the event of damage, misuse or non-compliance with the guidelines, the organizer will deduct the amount of any additional expenses (e.g. gasoline) from the entry fee.

ARRIVAL AND CHECK-IN

Upon arrival at the hotel, both in Québec City and Montréal, a team staff member must go to the reception desk to collect the room keys for their team.

INCIDENTAL EXPENSES

In accordance with the financial requirements of the UCI and the guidelines on the official entry form, the teams (7 riders and up to 8 support staff) are responsible for covering any incidental expenses. The organizer shall not, under any circumstances, be held responsible for these costs. Teams will be required to provide a credit card guarantee upon check-in at the hotel to cover such expenses.

MEALS

The meals schedule will be transmitted via communiqué from the event headquarters. Each team will be assigned two tables for the duration of their stay.

In both Québec City and Montréal, all 3 meals will be served at the hotel.

TRANSPORTATION QUÉBEC CITY-MONTRÉAL

Coach transportation from Québec City to Montréal will be provided for up to 10 people per team. The schedule will be transmitted by communiqué. Arrival in Montréal is scheduled for approximately 12:30 p.m.

DEPARTURE

In Montréal, rooms scheduled for departure on Sunday (as indicated on the rooming list) must be vacated before 11:00 a.m. The organizer will deduct any additional costs incurred due to non-compliance from the participation fee.

Logistics

TRANSFER OF MATERIALS

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 12 DELTA QUÉBEC TO DELTA MONTRÉAL

All team equipment to be transferred to Montréal must be clearly labeled and properly packaged. Materials must be ready by 7:00 p.m. The organizer will handle transportation, and the equipment will be available to the teams on Saturday morning in Montréal.

Teams are responsible for transporting any equipment not handed over to the organizer. Under no circumstances may these items be loaded onto the coaches.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 14 DELTA MONTRÉAL TO MONTRÉAL AIRPORT

Equipment to be shipped to Paris (Charles- de-Gaulle Airport) must be clearly labeled, packaged, and compliant with air freight regulations. The organizer shall not be held responsible for any items refused due to non-compliance with aviation requirements. Materials must be ready by 7:30 p.m.

The organizer will transfer the equipment to Montréal airport, where it will be available on the afternoon of Tuesday, September 16, at Exaciel AMC Logistique (Charles-de-Gaulle Airport).

CUSTOMS

Equipment used in Canada is imported temporarily. To comply with customs regulations, all items brought into Canada must also leave the country. Please notify Kris Boeckmans (kboeckmans@gpcqm.ca) of any equipment that will not be returned to Paris on September 15.

ARTICLE 1 | ORGANIZATION

The 14th edition of the Grand Prix Cycliste de Québec (UCI WorldTour) will be held on Friday, September 12, 2025, under the regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale and Cycling Canada. The race will take place on a closed 12 km circuit, contested over 18 laps, for a total distance of 216 km and an elevation gain of 2,610 m.

The 14th edition of the Grand Prix Cycliste de Montréal (UCI WorldTour) will be held on Sunday, September 14, 2025, under the regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale and Cycling Canada. The race will take place on a closed 12.3 km circuit, contested over 17 laps, for a total distance of 209.1 km and an elevation gain of 4,573 m.

ARTICLE 2 | TYPE OF EVENT

The races are reserved for riders in the Men Elite category. They are part of the UCI WorldTour calendar and are classified as UCI WorldTour Class 1 events. In accordance with the UCI Cycling Regulations, they award points toward the UCI World Rankings and the WorldTour Ranking.

ARTICLE 3 | PARTICIPATION

Participation is open to UCI WorldTeams, invited UCI ProTeams, and Team Canada (the host nation's national team), in accordance with Article 2.2.003 of the UCI Regulations.

ARTICLE 4 | PODIUM CEREMONIES AND INTERVIEWS

After the finish, the winning riders of the various classifications and the recipients of special prizes must attend the ceremonies (prizes, trophies, and signing of jerseys) as a priority, and in full race

clothing. Riders must report to the podium within 5 minutes of finishing the race.

Winners must also proceed to the media centre or any substitute location designated by the organizer within the finish area, immediately after the award ceremonies

Any rider who wins one or more of the various classifications or special prizes and who refuses to take part in the award ceremonies, except in the event of duly recognized force majeure, shall be penalized.

ARTICLE 5 | RADIO GRAND PRIX

Race information will be transmitted on the Radio Grand Prix frequency to all vehicles in the race convoy. This frequency cannot be accessed with a scanner.

ARTICLE 6 | NEUTRAL SERVICE

Neutral technical support will be provided by Elite Racing Services (two cars and one motorcycle). Within the fixed feed / technical support zone, UCI Regulations apply for both neutral or team mechanical assistance.

ARTICLE 7 | LATE FINISH

Per Article 2.3.039 of the UCI Regulations, any rider finishing more than 8% behind the winner's time shall not be classified. In exceptional circumstances, this time limit may be extended by the commissaires panel in consultation with the organizer.

At the discretion of the commissaires panel, any rider trailing the leaders by more than 10 minutes may be withdrawn from the race. Any rider caught by the lead vehicle must abandon the race.

ARTICLE 8 | CLASSIFICATIONS

- 1. Individual
- 2. Best Young Rider Ranking Ekoï
- 3. Best Canadian

1. INDIVIDUAL

The individual classification is established according to the finish order of the riders, as validated by the commissaires panel.

2. BEST YOUNG RIDER RANKING EKOÏ

The best young rider ranking Ekoï is determined by the order of arrival among riders in the U23 category. To be eligible, riders must have been born between 2003 and 2006. Riders in this category will be identified by a distinctive colored bib.

3. BEST CANADIAN

The best Canadian classification is determined according to the finish order of the riders holding Canadian nationality.

ARTICLE 9 | PENALTIES

The UCI scale of penalties shall apply exclusively.

ARTICLE 10 | DOPING CONTROL

Doping control operations are carried out under the authority of the UCI, in accordance with Canadian legislation and the appointed officials. Doping control stations are located in the Château Laurier Hotel (Québec City) and in the finish line area (Montréal).

ARTICLE 11 | COURSE RECONNAISSANCE AND TRAINING

During reconnaissance and training sessions, follow vehicles must be equipped with a roof light. Riders must ride single file, and both riders and drivers must comply with the Québec Highway Safety Code.

Warning: Several sections of the race course run against the direction of motor vehicle traffic. Any violation of the Highway Safety Code may result in tickets and fines issued by the police, which shall be borne by the team. The sections running against traffic are indicated on p. 27 (Québec) and p. 39 (Montréal).

Rules of Conduct in the Caravan

- The Grands Prix Cyclistes de Québec et de Montréal races are held in urban areas. Accordingly, all vehicles operated outside police-protected zones must drive on the righthand side of the road and in full compliance with the Québec Highway Safety Code.
- All vehicles on the race course must be equipped with a radio tuned to the Radio Grand Prix frequency. This radio must remain on at all times.
- Drivers are responsible for their vehicles and must comply immediately, safely and securely with instructions of the race directors, the regulator and police.
- Overtaking the peloton or breakaway riders without authorization from the race directors, the commissaires or the regulator is strictly forbidden.
- Extending any part of the body outside a vehicle to film or take photographs during the race is prohibited.
- No vehicle may circulate on the race course with more than 4 occupants, except VIP cars, which may carry up to 5 occupants.
- It is forbidden to enter a gap, overtake or slow down the line of vehicles in the following areas:
 - Feed / technical support zones;
 - Danger zones announced via Radio Grand Prix or signalled with a yellow flag.
- At the front of the race, vehicles circulate between the lead vehicle (opening the race) and the organization director's car.
- Within the race convoy, motorcycles must ride in a single file on the left-hand side, while cars must drive on the right-hand side.
- Race director vehicles and commissaires' vehicles have priority.
- By order of the race director or commissaires, directeurs sportifs', medical vehicles and neutral service vehicles have priority.
- When conditions allow, "lead" vehicles may take position in front of the peloton or breakaway, but only with prior authorization from the race director's, commissaires' or regulator's vehicle.

- Once authorized, they may briefly drop back in front of the peloton or breakaway before returning to their assigned position, always respecting the rules of vehicle circulation on the course.
- If a vehicle operator wishes to stop and be overtaken by the peloton, they must pull over and park completely off the roadway.
- During a breakaway, "lead" vehicles may enter the gap between the breakaway and the peloton if the time gap exceeds 1 min 30 sec and only with authorization from the race director. If the gap falls below 1 minute, or at the instructions of the race director, these vehicles must return to a position ahead of the race, in front of the lead race director's vehicle.
- When an obstacle or danger is reported by Radio Grand Prix or with a yellow flag, must anticipate and react accordingly.

Warning

- Accredited vehicles driving ahead of the lead vehicle opening the race must remain on the right-hand side of the road and comply with the posted speed limits.
- Emergency and fire response vehicles always have absolute priority, in both directions along the race course.
- The use of mobile phones while driving a vehicle is prohibited, except with a hands-free device. Watching television screens while driving is forbidden. Seat belts must be worn at all times.

Respect for the environment

It is strictly forbidden to dispose of waste along the race course.

ARTICLE 2 | TEAM INTRODUCTIONS, SIGN-IN AND RACE START

The official team introductions (riders in race clothing) will take place during sign-in, beginning at 9:50 a.m., near the start/finish line, and will end ten (10) minutes before the start time, i.e., at 10:50 a.m. Introductions will follow the order established by the organizer. All riders on each team must sign-in together. Local youth riders will serve as bike minders. Riders will be called to the start line at 10:55 a.m. and the start signal will be given at 11:00 a.m.





ARTICLE 3 | SECTION OF THE COURSE AGAINST THE FLOW OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC (6.1 KM)

- 0.5 km Rue Garneau East (400 m) > from Avenue George-VI to Avenue Ontario
- **3.4 km** Rue Fraser (200 m) > from Avenue Cartier to Avenue Bourlamaque
- 4.5 km Grande Allée Ouest, south side (600 m)
 > from Avenue Bougainville to Avenue de Laune
- 6.1 km Boulevard Champlain, west side (3.7 km) > from Chemin du Foulon to Rue du Marché Champlain
- 9.8 km Rue du Marché Champlain, north side (100 m) > from Boulevard Champlain to Rue Dalhousie
- 9.9 km Rue Dalhousie, west side (200 m) > from Rue du Marché Champlain to Côte de la Montagne
- 10.1 km Côte de la Montagne (400 m) > from Rue Dalhousie to Rue Port Dauphin
- **10.7 km** Rue Saint-Louis (500 m) > from Rue Port Dauphin to Rue D'Auteuil

ARTICLE 4 | FEED ZONE

Food and drink may be supplied only within the designated feed zone. The fixed feed zone (riders' compound) is located on Grande Allée, 900 m before the start/finish line, on a slightly uphill section of the course, on both sides of the Porte Saint-Louis. This is in accordance with Articles 2.3.025, 2.3.026 and 2.3027 of the UCI Regulations and the instructions of the commissaires' panel. Off-course parking for team vehicles is located in Parc de l'Esplanade (access via d'Auteuil street).

To ensure safety in the zone, a dotted line will be painted on the roadway. Team staff may not step beyond this line. Only staff wearing the orange ÉQUIPE armband or the blue RAVITO armband (two or three per team depending on the weather) are authorized to be in the roadway and inside the safety zone. Failure to comply will result in penalties. Upon decision of the commissaires' panel's, the feed service for offending teams may be suspended. In case of widespread violations, the entire feed zone may be closed by decision of the commissaires' panel.

Upon the decision of the race director and the commissaires, feeding from the directeurs sportifs' cars may be permitted on the race course:

- After Lap 3 and before the last lap: from KM 1.1 (Plains of Abraham) to KM 3.2 (Grande Allée)
- After Lap 2 and before the last lap: from KM 6.3 (Boul. Champlain) to KM 9.7

ARTICLE 5 | LITTER ZONE

In accordance with Articles 2.2.025 and 2.3.025 of the UCI Regulations, a litter zone is provided at KM 7.3 over a distance of 200 m. Waste may also be discarded just before and just after the fixed feed zone.

ARTICLE 6 | END OF THE RACE

It is forbidden to access the back of the line via the circuit. Team staff must leave the riders' area and proceed to the back of the line via the following route:

- Access St-Louis Avenue
- Continue on Grande Allée Est
- Turn left onto George-V Est
- Turn right onto l'Avenue Wilfrid-Laurier
- Access the site via the parking lot located after the Armoury
- Entry to the circuit will also be possible via the media crossing

Access to the back of the line is limited to two people per team. These individuals must wear the orange TEAM armband.

After crossing the finish line, riders wishing to return to the riders' compound before the broom wagon arrives must take the reverse route.

ARTICLE 1 | RACE-RELATED OPERATIONS

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 HÔTEL DELTA MONTRÉAL – SALON CONCERTO

- 1:30 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Commissaires' meeting.
- 3:00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m. Licence checks, distribution of race numbers and frame numbers.
- 4:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Meeting of directeurs sportifs for the WorldTour competition, held in accordance with Article 1.2.087 of the UCI Regulations, in the presence of the commissaires' panel.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 14 PARC JEANNE-MANCE (VIP TENT)

- **8:30 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. –** Meeting with Montréal police and the organizer's medical services.
- 8:45 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Meeting of all course convoy drivers.

ARTICLE 2 | TEAM INTRODUCTIONS, SIGN-IN AND START OF THE RACE

Official team introductions (riders in race clothing) will take place during sign-in, beginning at 9:05 a.m., near the start/finish line, and will conclude ten (10) minutes before the race start, i.e. at 10:05 a.m. Introductions will follow the order established by the organizer. All riders of each team must sign-in together. Local youth riders will serve as bike minders. Riders will be called to the start line at 10:10 a.m. and the start signal will be given at 10:15 a.m.



ARTICLE 3 | PORTIONS OF THE COURSE AGAINST THE **DIRECTION OF MOTOR-VEHICLE TRAFFIC (2.4 KM)**

- **Start –** Av. du Parc, west side (800 m) > From the U-turn on Av. du Parc 100 m north of Av. des Pins to Ch. de la Côte-Ste-Catherine:
- 0.2 km Ch. de la Côte-Ste-Catherine, south side (200 m) > From Av. du Parc, west side, to Av. du Mont-Royal;
- **0.4 km -** Av. du Mont-Royal (100 m) > From Ch. de la Côte-Ste-Catherine to the access road to Voie Camillien-Houde:
- **0.5 km -** Access road to Voie Camillien-Houde (100 m) > From Ch. de la Côte-Ste-Catherine, south side, to Voie Camillien-Houde;
- **5.3 km –** Av. Maréchal (150 m) > From Av. Gatineau to Av. Decelles:
- 5.75 km Exit ramp from Ch. de la Tour (Polytechnique), north side (60 m) > From Av. Decelles to Ch. de Polytechnique
- 10.8 km Ch. de la Côte Ste-Catherine, north side (200 m) > From Av. Mont-Royal to Av. du Parc
- 11 km Av. du Parc, east side (800 m) > From Ch. de la Côte-Ste-Catherine, north side, to the U-turn on Av. du Parc 100 m north of Av. des Pins

ARTICLE 4 | FEED ZONE

Food and drink may be supplied only within the designated feed zone. The fixed feed zone (riders' compound) is located on Av. du Parc on a slightly uphill section. This is in accordance with Articles 2.3.025, 2.3.026 and 2.3027 of the UCI Regulations and the instructions of the commissaires' panel. Off-course parking for team vehicles is available on Av. du Parc.

To ensure safety in the zone, a dotted line will be painted on the roadway. Team staff may not step beyond this line. Only staff wearing the orange ÉQUIPE armband or blue RAVITO armband (two or three per team depending on the weather) are authorized to be in the roadway and inside the safety zone. Failure to comply will result in penalties. Upon decision of the commissaires' panel's, the feed service for offending teams may be suspended. In case of widespread violations, the entire feed zone may be closed by decision of the commissaires' panel.

Upon the decision of the race director and the commissaires, feeding from the directeurs sportifs' cars may be permitted on the race course:

After Lap 2 and before the last lap: from KM 3.8 (Ch. de la Côte-des-Neiges) to KM 5.6 (Av. Decelles)

After Lap 2 and before the last lap: from KM 7.4 (Boul. Édouard-Montpetit) to KM 9.7 (Av. du Mont-Royal)

ARTICLE 5 | LITTER ZONE

In accordance with Articles 2.2.025 and 2.3.025 of the UCI Regulations, a litter zone is provided at KM 7.4 over a distance of 250 m. Waste may also be discarded just before and just after the fixed feed zone.

ARTICLE 6 | END OF THE RACE

Access to the back of the line is limited to two people per team. These individuals must wear the orange ÉQUIPE armband.
