2025 Maryland Cycling Classic

The Maryland Cycling Classic will make history on Saturday, Sept. 6, as America's premier professional cycling race debuts both men's and women's competitions together for the first time on an exciting new 17.9-mile (28.8km) circuit course entirely in the City of Baltimore.

The races will feature 15 men's teams and 15 women's teams comprised of world class professional athletes from 30 countries.

The technical circuit course will test every aspect of the world-class field, from bike-handling skills on its 28 turns and 500 meters of centuries-old cobblestones, to two explosive climbs and a flat, fast final 915 meters. The women's race, which starts at 8:30 a.m. (EDT), will be comprised of four laps, covering 71.6 miles (115.2 kilometers).

The men's race, comprised of six laps and covering 107.4 miles (172.8 kilometers), will begin at 12:30 p.m. (EDT). Both races will start at the Harbor Point District's Central Plaza and finish on East Pratt along Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor, less than a mile apart. The Maryland Cycling Classic is sanctioned by the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and USA Cycling.

The Maryland Cycling Classic races will be streamed live to audiences around the world. Both the women's and men's races will be available live on Maryland Public Television (MPT), Outside TV, Roku (FAST Channel), Velo.com, and the Maryland Cycling Classic YouTube Channel (@marylandcyclingclassic).

The race anchors a four-day community celebration promoting a healthy lifestyle. The event, owned and operated by the Sport & Entertainment Corporation of Maryland, features participatory events, a festival with interactive exhibits, and local food and drinks.

2025 WOMEN'S RACE PREVIEW

Maryland Cycling Classic Unveils Preliminary Rosters for Inaugural Women's Race

The inaugural 2025 Maryland Cycling Classic women's race will feature 15 elite, professional teams from five countries. The world-class field will be highlighted by notable cyclists from the European peloton and many of the top North Americans. Current and former national champions and Olympians will be competing in the historic race.

The women's field is highlighted by three-time Canadian National Champion for road race **Alison Jackson** (CAN) of EF Education - Oatly; **Bryony Botha** (NZL) representing Fearless Femme Racing; veteran one-day specialist **Tiffany**

Cromwell (AUS), former Giro d'Italia and Le Route de France stage winner and 5th at the recent Gravel World Championships; recent podium finisher from Tour of Portugal runner-up **Heidi**

Franz (Bainbridge Island, Wash.) of Cynisca Cycling; current Cuban time

trial and road race champion and 2025 Tour of America's Dairyland winner **Marlies Mejias** (CUB) of Virginia's Blue Ridge Twenty28; 2017 Pan American winner **Paulo Munoz** (CHI) of Fearless Femme Racing; current and three-time Polish Individual Time Trial National Champion **Agnieszka Skalniak-Sojka** (POL) of Canyon/SRAM zondacrypto; VSBT Gravel champion **Melisa Rollins** (Provo, Utah) of Aegis Cycling Foundation; Tour de Bloom and U.S. National Championships for road race runner-up **Lauren Stephens** (Mesquite, Texas) of Aegis Cycling Foundation; Colombia's **Karen Lorena Villamizar** (COL) of PatoBike BMC, a top 8 finisher in four major races this year; **Rylee McCullen** (NZL) riding for Virginia's Blue Ridge Twenty28 is the 2024 and 2025 runner-up for the New Zealand National Championships ITT;

and Czech Republic National Champion in road race **Kristýna Burlová** (CZE) of Ceratazit Pro Cycling; The Benin National Team will make an historic appearance as the first African female team to compete in a major North American race and are led by time trial national-champion **Hermionne**

Marie Paul Ahouissou and road national champion **Sèdo Charlotte Metoevi**, both of whom will be competing in the World Championships in Rwanda in late September. Rising young stars **Chloe Patrick** (Carson, Calif.) of Cynisca, the U23 U.S. National ITT champion; **Cassidy Hickey** (Parker, Colo.) of CCB P/B Levine Law Group, the U.S. U23 Criterium national champion, and **Mia Aseltine** (Littleton, Colo.,) representing Team USA, the U.S. U23 national runner-up in the ITT and criterium.

"We're thrilled to unveil a world-class women's field for the inaugural Maryland Cycling Classic women's race," said **Joanne Kiesanowski**, a former elite professional now the women's competition manager. "With riders representing 21 countries and teams spanning the UCI Women's World-Tour, Continental level, domestic elite teams, and national squads, the international quality and di-

versity of this roster is exceptional. The field has athletes from the Americas, Asia, Africa, Europe, and Oceania. It reflects the growth and global momentum of women's cycling, and we're proud to bring that level of competition to the streets of Baltimore!"

There are 21 countries represented on the preliminary rosters, including athletes from: Australia (AUS), Belgium (BEL), Benin (BEN), Canada (CAN), Chile (CHI), Colombia (COL), Cuba (CUB), Czech Republic (CZE), Denmark (DEN), Germany (GER), Ireland (IRL), Jamaica (JAM), Mexico (MEX), Netherlands (NED), New Zealand (NZL), Philippines (PHI), Poland (POL), Switzerland (SUI), Trinidad and Tobago (TTO), Ukraine and United States (USA).

The women's race, which starts at 8:30 am (EDT), will be comprised of four laps, covering 71.6 miles (115.2 kilometers).

The races will start at the Harbor Point District's Central Plaza and finish on East Pratt along Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor, less than a mile apart. The race features 3,868 feet (1,179 meters) of climbing including a steep 900-meter climb on the northern most part of the course, which will contest the Queen of the Mountains point. The course also will feature an unique 550-meter cobblestones sector each lap on Thames Street in Fells Point district of Baltimore.

America's Top Cycling Race is Back: Men's Maryland Cycling Classic Field Is Star-Studded

The men's rosters for the 2025 Maryland Cycling Classic are a star-studded lineup that will bring Olympians, national champions, and Grand Tour stage winners from 20 countries to the third edition of the race.

With 15 elite teams hailing from nine countries, the starting line will be packed with a diverse and powerful field. The men's competition will feature top contenders from the European peloton and many of the top North Americans, with athletes from 20 countries represented.

The men's field is highlighted by 2023 Maryland Cycling Champion **Mattias Skjelmose** (DEN) of Lidl-Trek, who also won the prestigious 2025 Amstel Gold race; American star **Neilson Powless** (Sacramento, Calif.) of EF Education – EasyPost, the winner of '25 Dwars door Vlaanderen and GP Gippingen races and also the runner-up in the 2023 Maryland Cycling Classic; U.S. National Champion for road race **Quinn Simmons** (Durango, Colo.) from Lidl-Trek; Jayco-AlUla's superstar **Micheal Matthews**, the one-time Tour de France sprint points jersey winner and champion of the Eschborn-Frankfurt classic in Germany this year and top 5 finisher in both Amstel Gold and Milan-San Remo Classics; sprint and one-day specialist **Pascal Ackermann** (GER) of Israel-Premier Tech, a three-time Giro d'Italia and two-time Vuelta stage winner; '25 Tour de France stage winner **Jonas Abrahamsen** (NOR) of UNO-X Mobility; 6th place finisher at this year's Tour de France **Tobias Johannessen** (NOR) of UNO-X Mobility; Total Energies **Anthony Turgis** (FRA) is '24 Tour de France stage winner and strong one-day specialist; current Australian road national champion and strongman **Luke Durbridge** of Jayco-AlUla; Swiss star **Mauro Schmid** of Team Jayco-AlUla, a former Giro d'Italia stage winner and Australia's **Cadel Evans** Great Ocean Road Race this year; five-time Serbian road race and time trials national champ **Dusan Rajovic** and Paris 2024 Olympic track silver-medalist **Mark Stewart** (GBR), both of Team Solution Tech

Vivi Frantini; Australian break-away specialist and fan favorite **Simon Clarke** (AUS) of Israel-Premier Tech, who is a former Tour de France and Vuelta a Espana stage winner; and American superstar **Brandon McNulty** (Phoenix, Ariz.), the recent winner of Tour of Poland, top 6 finisher at both Tokyo and Paris Olympics Games, and 9th place finisher at the '25 Giro d'Italia. The two-time Grand Tour stage winner is on loan from his UAE team to ride for Team USA.

"With seven squads that were in this year's Tour de France, coupled with some strong Pro Series and Continental teams. This year's line-up is stacked with the most talent the event has seen to date," said **Bobby Julich**, a former elite professional who is now the men's competition manager. "It's been great to see many of the top World Tour riders from the United States surface on rosters, including Brandon McNulty on loan from his trade team and racing for Team USA. This year's race promises to be highly unpredictable, thanks to the uniquely challenging course design. The combination of cobblestones, technical sections, and punchy climbs will ensure an exciting and thrilling event from start to finish."

The field will also see riders with interesting storylines, including Riley Sheehan (Boulder, Colo.), who finished 9th overall in the 2023 Maryland Cycling Classic which led to a pro contract. He's been on a tear, recently finishing 3rd overall in the Tour of Germany and 4th at the Arctic Race of Norway this month. And, Oscar Sevilla (ESP) of Team Medellin-EPM, an ageless wonder still racing at an elite level at age 48. EF Education-EasyPost's Darren Rafferty (IRL) is the '24 National Champion of Ireland and rising star in one-day races and could be a sleeper. Climber Fillipo Zanna (ITA) of Jayco-AlUla is a climber but a notable rider as a Giro d'Italia and former Italian national champion.

The professional field will consist of athletes representing their professional teams. The 20 countries represented include: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Colombia, Denmark, France, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Serbia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Ukraine, and USA. Four national champions and five runners-up are slated to race.

The men's race is comprised of six laps covering 107.4 miles (172.8 kilometers). The race will start at 12:30 pm. (EDT) at Harbor Point Central Plaza with an estimated finish between 4:20 and 4:40 pm (EDT). on East Pratt Street along Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor. The race features 5,682 feet (1,732 meters) of total climbing including a steep 900-meter climb on the northern most part of the course, which will contest the King of the Mountains point. The course also will feature a unique 550-meter cobblestones sector each lap on Thames Street in Fells Point district of Baltimore.



State of Maryland Race Champion Jersey

The State of Maryland Race Champion Jersey is awarded to the men's and women's overall race winner. In 2025 the prized jersey highlights The State of Maryland flag's prominently colors - red, gold, black, and white.

H&S Bakery Sprint Points Champion Jersey

The H&S Bakery Sprint Points Champion Jersey is awarded to the rider that accumulates the most sprint points, which are given based on intermediate sprint lines underneath the finish banner after Lap 1.



Kelly Benefits King/Queen of the Mountains Jersey

The Kelly Benefits King/Queen of the Mountains Champion Jersey is awarded to the rider that accumulates the most points for top finish up the 900-meter climb up the Northern Parkway portion of the course.

Baltimore Best Young Rider Jersey

Young talent will compete for the distinction of donning the black Baltimore Best Young Rider Jersey. The jersey is award to the cyclist who is under 23 years of age and finishes highest in the overall standings.



RxBenefits Jersey

The colorful RxBenefits Jersey is awarded to the cyclist that most animates the race. A subjective award, race organizers and journalists vote on who set the tone or who took the chance to try to win the race.

Kaiser Permanente In The Community Jersey

The teal and white Kaiser Permanente In The Community Jersey is awarded to a male and female rider who best exemplifies doing good in his/her community.

Maryland Cycling Classic Debuts Historic Course for Men's & Women's Races in 2025

The 2025 Maryland Cycling Classic will make history on Saturday, Sept. 6, as America's premier professional cycling race debuts both men's and women's competitions together for the first time on an exciting new 17.9-mile (28.8km) circuit course entirely in the City of Baltimore.

The technical circuit course will test every aspect of the world class field from bike-handling skills with 28 turns to 550 yards of centuries-old cobblestones to two explosive climbs to a flat, fast final 1000 yards.

The women's race, which starts at 8:30 a.m. (EDT), will be comprised of four laps, covering 71.6 miles (115.2 kilometers). The men's race, comprised of six laps and covering 107.4 miles (172.8 kilometers), will begin at 12:30 p.m. (EDT). Both races will start at the Harbor Point District's Central Plaza and finish on East Pratt along Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor, less than a mile apart.

The men's race will feature 5,682 feet (1,732 meters) of total climbing, while the women's race will feature 3,868 feet (1,179 meters). Points will be awarded for intermediate sprints after the first lap of each race as well as at the finish line. King/Queen of the Mountain points will be awarded up to the top of Northern Parkway on each lap.

The race course will feature various Fan Zones along the course (e.g., best places to watch). Some will include free cowbells and thunder sticks to cheer on athletes, as well as live race coverage on Big Screen TVs. Fan Zones will be located at Harbor Point (at the start), Thames Street cobblestones, Patterson Park, Mt. Vernon, and the finish line stretch on East Pratt Street.

Starting with a Bang

The race will start at Harbor Point's Central Plaza immediately adjacent to the Harbor East district. It's where historic maritime heritage meets modern waterfront development. Riders will face their first test of nerves and skill within the opening mile, when the peloton encounters Fells Point's 18th-century granite cobblestones – a 550-yard

technical gauntlet that has the power to shatter race aspirations and create decisive gaps that could determine the day's outcome.

Racing Through One of America's Oldest Urban Parks:

The course then sweeps through Canton neighborhood's fascinating blend of historic row houses and contemporary architecture before entering Patterson Park at mile 2. One of Baltimore's oldest parks dating to the War of 1812, Patterson Park becomes a crucial tactical battleground with a deceiving uphill on East Baltimore Street where teams will position for the challenges ahead.

Passing by History

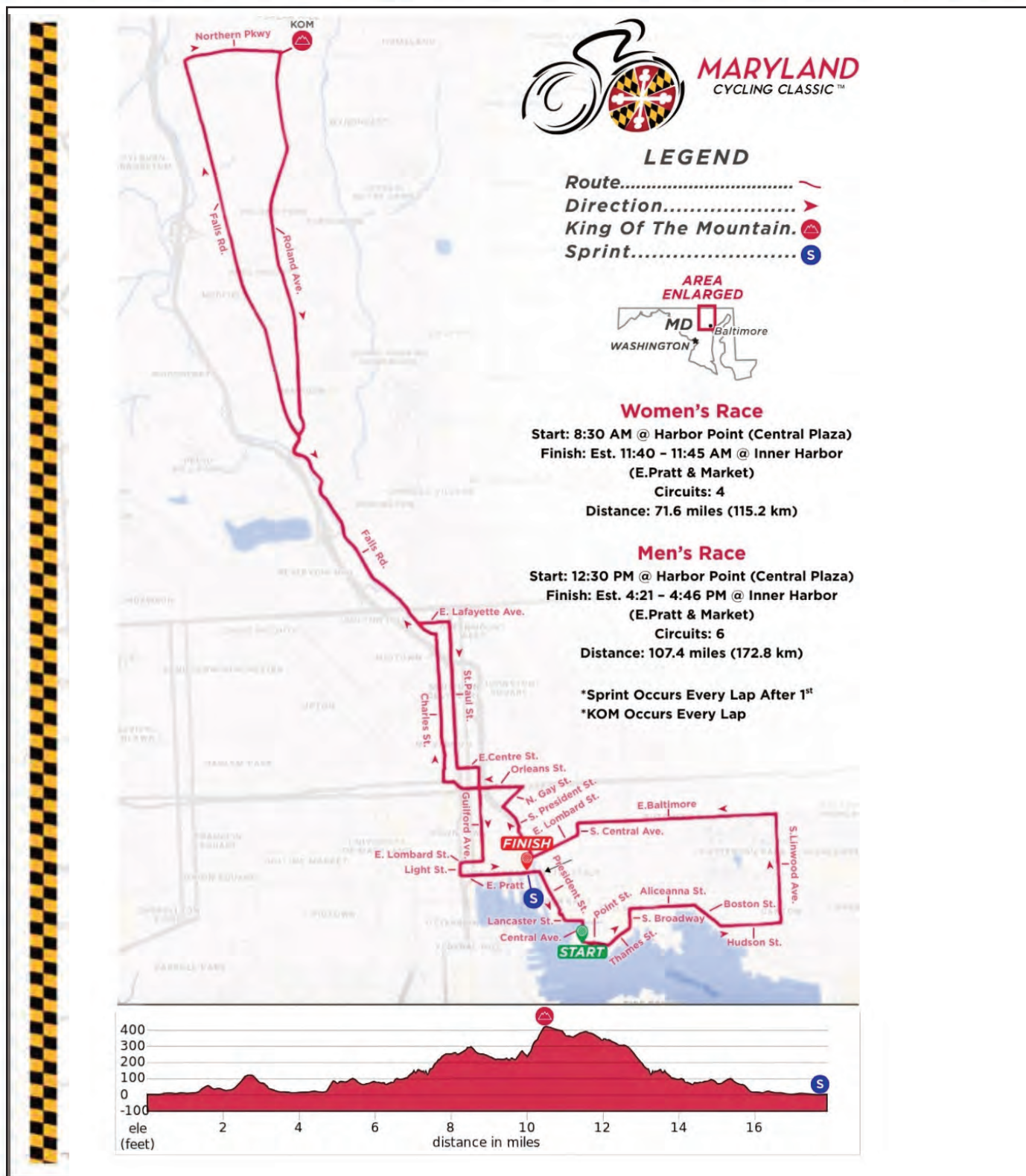
At mile 5, cyclists navigate past the towering Washington Monument (completed in 1829) and through Mount Vernon's tree-lined streets adorned with elegant 19th-century architecture. The route then powers through Hampden at mile 8, an eclectic neighborhood with blue-collar roots dating to 1802 as a millworker settlement, now transformed into one of Baltimore's most vibrant and artsy neighborhoods.

The Decisive Moment

St. Mary's Seminary hosts the King/Queen of the Mountain stage, where America's first Catholic seminary (established 1791) becomes the backdrop for the race's most crucial climb. This challenging 1000 yards (900-meters) ascent will most likely separate the strongest riders from the field, crowning the day's King or Queen of the Mountain. The climb may be a location where the race winner attacks, noting it's the high point before descending back down to the waterfront.

Waterfront Finale

The race will conclude with a long, flat and fast drag down East Pratt Street in Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor, the site of the finish line in 2022 and 2023, which saw crowds grow to around 20,000 for the finale.





Lidl-Trek's Mattias Skjelmose Wins 2023 Maryland Cycling Classic in Solo Victory

Neilson Powless of EF Education-EasyPost Sprints to Second Followed by Hugo Houle of Israel-Premier Tech



After a day characterized by near three digit temperatures, Team Lidl-Trek's **Mattias Skjelmose** of Denmark crossed the finish line solo in downtown Baltimore to take a tough victory at the second edition of the Maryland Cycling Classic.

"I was racing in my home country of Denmark just the other week and it was 23 degrees (celsius, 73 degrees F) and today it was almost 38 degrees, 100 degrees F)," said Skjelmose, who earlier in the year won both the Tour of Switzerland and most recently a stage of the Tour of Denmark. "I think a lot of guys didn't want to sprint. Everyone was expecting a race like last year

where the break at the beginning went home, but it didn't [happen]. A smaller group went, and we caught them back with some big attacks. Toms (Skujins) was really smart. He realized what EF was doing 31 miles (50 km) before they did it. We were in a perfect position when they set a really good tempo. In the end it was full gas."

Mattias credited the win to the combination of the heat and the course. "I think the course is really nice. I think the heat was also a big factor. The combination with the heat and the flat... made for a really nice race. If only one of them was there, it wouldn't have really been a super hard race, but in combination it made for a perfect race.

"It wasn't exactly the plan," Mattias continued, alluding to the fact that they were setting up Latvian **Toms Skujins** for a possible win. "But we wanted to win. We knew we could use the numbers; we're one of the strongest teams here. Both me and Toms were feeling really good. In my opinion, we rode a perfect race. Of course, it's really sad with Toms' puncture, but we rode a really good race."

Skujins buried himself in his effort but following a dramatic reshuffle his teammate Skjelmose took over the lead. Skjelmose had clearly rested enough to take control, although his lead amounted to only a handful of seconds. **Neilson Powless**, who finished third during the inaugural edition of the race in 2022, was showing some fatigue as he desperately hung on to the wheels of the five leaders. With four miles (6.4 km) to go Skjelmose, the Danish road

race champion, built a 1:45 lead up the road and confidently cruised to victory over the final lap of the race. Behind Skjelmose, Powless and **Hugo Houle** sprinted across the line to claim second and third place respectively.

“I knew it was most likely going to be a race for second because everybody knows how good Mattias (Skjelmose) is so I tried to do everything I could to get the best result possible. This year I did the sprint much better. I won the sprint for second place...unfortunately it wasn't for the win, but I think it was the best result I could have expected,” said Powless.



Tale of the Tape

The day kicked off with a quick, rolling start that eventually saw five riders go clear of the 112 strong field. That breakaway included **David Lozano** (TNN), **Oscar Sevilla** (MED), **Carson Miles** (TOR), **Julien Gagne** (TSL) and **Kyle Murphy** (LLA). In between their advantage and the chasing peloton, **Stephen Vogel** (PEC) made a brave attempt to bridge across, but ultimately wound up spending a good portion of the day in no-man's land.

As the race rolled on, the KOMs (King of the Mountains) were on the mind of Lozano who effectively contested the first two categorized climbs, edging out Sevilla for maximum points. Despite their cooperation, the breakaway's run out in front of the event came to an end when the peloton quickly shut down their effort with about 69.5 miles (112v km) left to ride. With about 46.6 miles (75km) to go it looked as if a large group of riders were ready to challenge for the finish, but then the sparks began to fly. A number of attacks meant that the deck would be reshuffled heading into the closing circuits of the race.

As the riders entered downtown Baltimore, the powerful sextet of **Chris Harper** (JAY), Houle, Skjelmose, Powless, Skujins and **Lucas Hamilton** (JAY) found themselves with nearly a minute separating themselves from the rest of the race. With other riders in hot pursuit, the leaders did what they could to cooperate with one another to maintain their lead – taking turns pulling at the front to hold on to the tense 40-second edge they had on the chase. But with 18 miles (29 K M) to go, Skujins decided to play his cards early and go with a solo attack. The Latvian rider was able to keep seven seconds between him and his former fellow escapees.

Powless added, “I could feel the support (of fans) the whole way around the circuit, even out in the countryside, it was just incredible to hear my name screamed from the side of the road. It was awesome to be able to interact with the American fans because I don't get to do that at any other point in the year. I was really proud to have the opportunity here and feel that love the whole way around the course.”

Israel-Premier Tech's Sep Vanmarcke Wins 2022 Maryland Cycling Classic

Nickolas Zukowsky of Human Powered Health Comes in Second Followed by Neilson Powless of EF Education-EasyPost in Exciting Sprint Finish

In a last-minute shoot out involving four heavy-hitter world-class riders, Belgian cyclist **Sep Vanmarcke** of Team Israel-Premier Tech, used his Classics savvy to win the first-ever Maryland Cycling Classic supported by UnitedHealthcare in Baltimore, Md. America's top-ranked professional road cycling race took riders through a tough, hilly 121.7-mile (196 kilometer) course starting at Kelly Benefits in Sparks, Md. and finishing along East Pratt Street and Market Place in Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor District in front of thousands of cheering fans.

"My main strength is Classics, 'short kickers', technical courses and demanding races," said Vanmarcke. "That's exactly what we got today. I'm used to small circuits in Belgium with a lot of corners, so this race suits me perfectly. Maybe next year we can get even more [turns on the circuit]."

It was clear in the final circuit that one of the four riders in the lead group would take the top step of the podium with lots of jockeying for position in the last lap. EF Education-EasyPost rider **Andrea Piccolo** (ITA), managed to bridge to the finish to help **Neilson Powless** (USA), the top American finisher in this year's Tour de France, take the victory, but was outsmarted by Vanmarcke in the last 750-meter straightaway. The Belgian timed his attack perfectly to overtake **Nickolas Zukowsky** (CAN) of Human Powered Health, who came in second, while Powless of EF Education-EasyPost was nudged into third place.

A group of approximately twenty-five riders got away early, making a big break roughly 10 miles into the race. The riders, including Zukowsky, **Quinn Simmons** (USA), Powless, Vanmarcke, and Piccolo dominated the breakaway. Despite several chase attempts, including one solo effort by **Michael Matthews** (AUS) of Team BikeExchange-Jayco, the lead group managed to stay away. The riders took a chance pushing the pace so early, considering the heat, but the break turned out to be the decisive move of the day. The group was eventually whittled to 11, including 10 World Tour riders and Human Powered Health's Zukowsky.

"It was hot today out there and it was really demanding," Vanmarcke added. "After 10

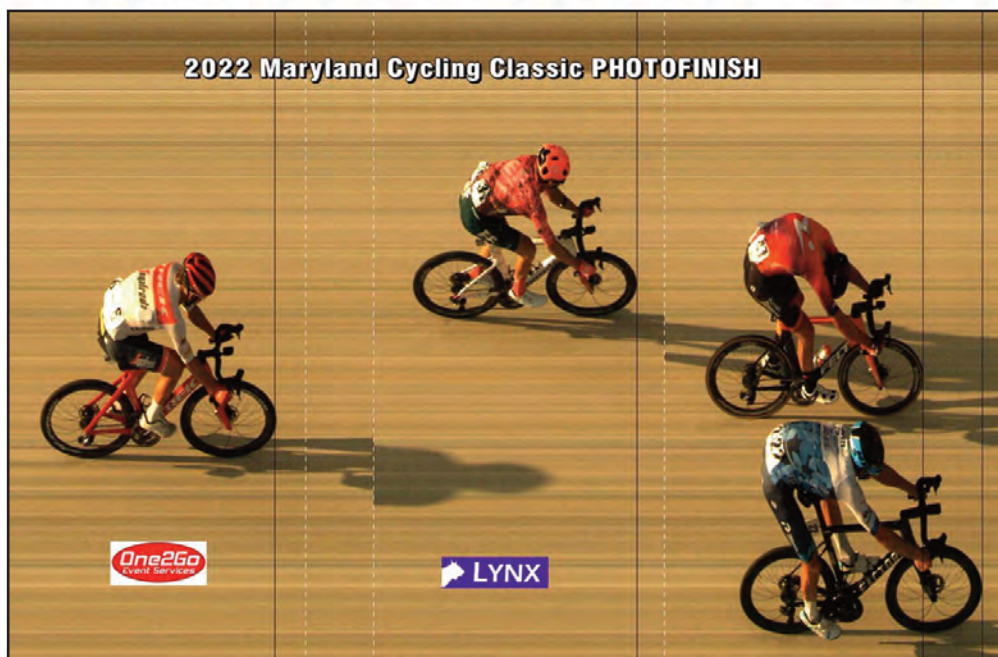

kilometers we got away with 25 riders and this was a really hard race because you couldn't hide. EF speeded it up after 60 or 70k and split it again. We were only left with 12, and one by one everyone was getting tired. I could feel it in the final that I had to be in every break because I knew it was going to split again. I think together with my teammates we played good tactics and I'm super proud to win here in America."

Powless added: "It's been a little over three years since I raced in the States so it's

pretty awesome to be back. It's been really nice to have an American event at this level back in the States providing a platform for inspiration for American fans and upcoming future riders, young kids and also teams that don't necessarily always get an opportunity to race against WorldTour riders. It's also a really nice opportunity for them to show themselves."

110 cyclists from 16 teams traversed the unrelenting rolling terrain with few level gradients to relax on a winding outer circuit that routed close to the Pennsylvania state line and featured the historic Sagamore Farms. The upper course was defined by Prettyboy Reservoir with the course ascending and descending around the 80-square-mile body of water. The inner loop around the reservoir featured lush, tree-covered roads with short punchy climbs but nothing overly long, an ideal mix for attacks and breakaway attempts. American Quinn Simmons won the KOM and fell off on the finishing circuits but was a dominate player in the race after following up on a great performance in July's Tour de France.

"It was my first time racing in an American race at this level," said Simmons, 21, from Durango, Colo. "It was an amazing crowd out there and we really wanted to put on a show. It's great to be racing in the states again and hearing your name."

After 75 miles, the riders raced south on Falls Road, the only straight section of the course, into the heart of central Baltimore for a multi-lap circuit finale. In a complete contrast to the roads of Baltimore County, the 7.5-mile city circuit featured 19 turns and a deceptively tough elevation gain of 234-feet per lap.

Historic and modern Baltimore was showcased to viewers and fans around the world as the four circuit laps routed through the skyscrapers of the Inner Harbor and Harbor East business districts, as well as the neighborhoods of Little Italy, Fells Point, Old Town, Mount Vernon, circling the Greenmount West neighborhood and diverse shops along Broadway. The final 3-kilometers (less than two miles) featured a descent down St. Paul Street onto East Pratt for a flat, fast finish.

Credential Levels

There are three levels of media access:

- Rights Holder (All Access -- NO Athlete or Stage Areas)
- Photographer (Electronic and Still)
- Media (All Other)

Rights holders have paid for the right for privilege and access and in most cases for post event interviews and have first rights. Photographers have various access points, see below. There will be limited road access assigned with bibs (see 'Road Access' below). All other credentialed media access points are outlined herein.

Road Access with Credential

- A credential DOES NOT guarantee complete access to the race course, as some areas are restricted to only those assigned a photographer's vest (see below).
- A prime area behind the barriers will be cordoned off for all credentialed media at the start and finish line.
- Credentialed media will be provided access to the competitor and team vehicle parking area before and after the race.
- You will be required to show your media credential to receive access to these areas, as well as the pre-race and stage finish press conferences.
- Limits apply to the number of photographer vests issued and the number of media able to travel in designated media vehicles in the race caravan. (See "photography" and "caravan travel" below for additional information).

Route Access

- You may wish to view the race from areas other than those provided to media at the start and finish line. If you chose to walk out along the route prior to the race's arrival, please cross the route only at the designated crosswalks, as to ensure your safety and the safety of the riders. The crosswalks will be controlled by designated course marshals or security officials who will notify you when it is safe to cross the route.

Special Notes

- Park your vehicle well off the road if you choose to stop along the race route to watch or photograph the race action.
- Personal vehicles are not permitted in the race caravan. Be sure to have an adequate map to help you get from place to place.
- Race logs are available online and in the media center to help assist with route planning.
- Media are not permitted to use media access for autographs, endorsement messages or commercial requests.

Caravan Travel

- Space is extremely limited in the race caravan for media. All requests for a seat in the media caravan will be considered. Please request access to a vehicle upon application for credentials. IMPORTANT NOTES, SAFETY FIRST

- Please adhere to the instructions given by race officials, marshals and law enforcement agencies. They are here to ensure the route is secure and safe for everyone – riders, media, race staff and spectators alike.
- The Maryland Cycling Classic will be run under “rolling road closures,” meaning the route will close prior to the race's arrival and will reopen once the last race vehicle has passed. Please do not attempt to join or cross the caravan, or more importantly, leave before the last vehicle passes. Road closures along the route will be kept to a minimum, but long enough to ensure the security of fans and riders.
- Please DO NOT hinder rider advancement. Stay back, well off the field of play, so that the cyclists may pass unimpeded.
- DO NOT touch the riders.

Photography and Priority Vests

- There are three types of Vests for access:
 - o RED, Television - limited to 10 (including host broadcaster)
 - o YELLOW, Photo Moto - limited to 5
 - o BLUE, Photo + Video On-Course - limited to 20
- The host organization reserves the right on priority access to the road at start and finish line for photographers.
- Only credentialed broadcast/photo media will have access to certain restricted media zones on or near the race course on race day.
- A form of identification, such as a valid driver's license, will be exchanged for a vest upon pick-up. No exceptions will be made, so please come prepared.
- Any photographer that fails to follow instructions and provisional safety measures will be subject to losing race credentials and be removed from the area.
